THE PRESIDENTS REPORT - 1983-1984ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 11th July 1984.

As in the past year I elected to make the formal report at the A.G.M. rather than at the Dinner Dance. At the Dinner Dance I outlined a few highlights only. So here's the full story:-

I would like to thank the committee members for the efforts they gave me as President, and the club as a whole. While we did have some disagreements, we were able to resolve them as a team. I have to make specific reference to the following:-

On the Committee.

The Vice President - Tony Richardson. Thanks very much "Tony". Work commitments have taken me out of town quite a lot over the past few months. At very short notice Tony has stepped in to assist, take the chair or whatever was necessary. Thanks very much Tony.

To the Treasurer - Ron Wintle, thanks for running the numbers again. We had a bit of a struggle to balance the books for the year. Our end result was better than initially expected. Your assistance and guidance enabled the Committee to arrive at satisfactory solutions to some of those unexpected costs. More on this subject later. Good to hear from you our club membership again remained strong for the year.

To our Field Day Officers - Lee Clifton, assisted by Don Bibby. Like past years our field days have been a mixture of good ones and bad ones. Our field day officers undertook a study from past records not only of this club but of other clubs in coming up with the short list for the current year. Thanks to both of you for the effort put into all you have done for us in running and organizing field days. (Rotto is still one of my favourite memories for 1984).

To the Drycasting Officers - Eddie Korin, assisted by Owen Wintle, thank you for maintaining a high standard of running the D.C. events. When we go to another venue we can see how efficient you have organized our dry cast days. With some of the wet/cold week ends over winter, we have experienced to date, it's not so easy to get motivated at six o'clock Sunday morning - thanks fellows.

To the Property Officer - George Holman, thanks to George for looking after our most important asset the Kalberri Holiday House. Keeping tabs on the bookings is a time consuming task. Great to hear that more and more members are using the facility.

Our revenue goes down slightly because of this, as we give members a lower rates than the general public. However revenue forecasted was pretty close to what we expected. To the Librarian - Dick Stevens, thanks Dick, and thanks Owen Wintle for stepping in when business committments had Dick busy in other parts of W.A.

To our Social Organizer - To Nell Clifton and all her willing workers. Thanks very much. The various events held over the year were a lot of fun. In particular our Dinner Dance was successful. While it did not quite fit into our financial calendar, your fund raising over the year has greatly contributed to the club's finances over and above the Committee special thanks to:

Bob Klein for his personnel assistance to our Treasurer. Your patience and eye for detail is reflected in the way our financial books are kept. (There are not too many clubs who have a set of financial records as professionally kept as Surfcasters. This is a reflection of the efforts both in areas of assistance to Ron Wintle, audit of the books and advice to the Committee).

Jim Strong thank you for always coming forward when help is required. Jim has a long history with the club of stepping in to assist, whether it be AAA activities, Drycasting events or assistance at trophy selection.

As president I also made special recognition to a Club member for a contribution, in particular some of your fishing stories at our meetings. To Bernie Payne - thanks.

To the wives of our committee members, thanks. The demands of any club are always such that HE has to go off and get involved just at the wrong time. Thank you for giving HIM the back-up and support.

To all of our Club Members - thanks for getting involved with Club activities, thats what it is all about. I can't thank all of you for all the individual effort put into work parties or whatever but thank you for making my term as President an enjoyable year.

Our Club Activities:

In looking at what the club activities have been all about and what is projected for the coming year I have seen some changes from the way the club originally operated.

Talking with past members and looking at old records, the fishing club appeared at one stage to be biased towards male activities. A much greater proportion of slightly older club members concentrated on competitive fishing and those activities that go with fishing. We now have a larger number of younger club members with young families and with the change in rules a few years back to include women and families we see a much greater participation of a mixture of sexes and ages. The strength of our mini-juniors is currently very strong.

While this style does not fit for all members, most of the time this family style of club activities has worked well.

Not all events are suitable for the younger kids, but I consider that for those that are the participation by these youngsters is a very healthy trend. I'm sure in later years these same kids will be participating with their families in the club fishing scene. Surfcasters Club should still be about to benefit from this. Enough of the long term philosophy.

In the short term; we have seen our dry casting rules change to more closely follow those of the AAA state/national championships; we have seen a different method of selecting field days; all within formats that have been developed within Surfcasters and have stood the test of time.

We saw the introduction of a mid year trophy competition. This was pretty keenly contested, especially the "line ratio" competition. However if this is to be repeated, you the club have to make it happen.

Our social events over the year pretty closely followed those of past years, for those that make the effort the get together by Surfcasters is a fun-time. The Christmas Party and the Annual Dinner Dance are well proven and popular with most. The fund raising in its various forms worked quite well, its hard on all club members to keep digging into pockets each time an event comes up, but thanks to generous support by a lot of members through some of the raffles etc., our Social Organiser is able to contribute to club funds.

The club made a special "donation" to assist in travel/misc. costs for club members going over to Bellina for the state championships. It was your generous support of a raffles etc., that enabled this donation to be made.

Thanks must also go to all those club members and business houses that give to the "Trophy" fund for the annual dinner dance. The high quality of our various trophies contributes to that special club evening. The feedback that I had from club members on the trophy selection was very positive. In particular the new members thought the "Replica Trophies" were very special and something to work at for next year's competition. The Ken Mathews trophy, in particular, is considered one of the most prestigious for a clubman. There is a long history on this trophy and for the first time a woman member holds the trophy - well done Nell. For those of you that will be trying next year good luck. It will be great to look back in years gone by and remember that special fishing event that collected such and such a trophy - the youngsters sure appreciate this.

Competitions:

As you may remember, this time last year we were wishing our Surfcaster representatives in the state teams for the Bellina championships all the best. Well in the words of Jim Strong, they bought home the "bacon".

Both the mens and womens teams had wins for drycasting and the women were also successful in beach fishing. Congrats to you all. I hope to see a few "Surfcasters" represented in the teams for the National titles in Bunbury next year. The best of luck to all those trying out for selections.

Surfcasters once again were very predominate in drycasting again this past year. In both the South West and State Championships individual and team events we came close to clean sweeps in senior, ladies, junior and mini-junior events.

For the fishing the men didn't quite get to any placings but did better than past years. Our ladies, juniors and mini-juniors managed to come good with some wins and placings. Quoting one of our club members - "Surfcasters Rah, Rah, Rah".

While not all of us are into the competition scene, for those that do some good fun and companionship come out of these events. I also find it stimulates club members and in particular our juniors or mini-juniors. When one of our "littlies" comes up with a place no matter how large or small, I personally get a kick out of seeing their pleasure and satisfaction in accomplishing some of the skills handed down from their parents.

Hence good luck to all those interested in getting involved with competitive events whether club, state or national.

FINANCIAL:

As presented by both the Treasurer and the Auditor on the cash flow for the year we had a slight loss. While at first glance this does not look very healthy, analysis showed that it was expected, appropriate actions taken and overall the clubs financial position remains strong. Notwithstanding: the comments by our Auditor still hold in that for the forthcoming year, restraint and care will again have to be exercised by the club and the Committee.

In more detail,

The surplus from the general fund and the Kalberri Property over the past few years show:

Hence as pointed out 1984 did not look good from a business point of view of making a profit. However with criteria of while not becoming financially insolvent, funds generated by the club are to be utilized by the club some decisions were reached as to where money was to be spent.

You will note that 1983 looked particularly healthy but in fact, some of the social activities (raffles etc) were organized in that year to help finance that "donation" for the Bellina Championships. The expenditure actually occurred in the '84 financial year. Also some of the expenditures on the Kalberri House (e.g. curtains and front yard soil compacting) were extraordinary expenditures but in consideration of funds available were actioned in 1984 rather than postponing same.

At the beginning of each year our Auditor Bob Klein, drafts up a "budget" for the Committee to utilize as a source of information of where cash will come from and where it will go. Bob uses past history and known events to formulate the budget, but cannot foretell the all likely events. However this budget is a very powerful tool for the committee to use.

In fact based on information available at the time this budget resulted in a Forecast of a surplus of a loss of (\$1,333).

Hence by careful analysis of expenditures the Committee was able to keep this loss to only (\$16).

The Committee were trying to better this number. A social event being organized to assist in fund raising fell through, but thanks to a couple of club members (thanks Ron and Eric) a raffle was held that generated a surplus of \$400. This \$400 odd will show on the '85 books, not on the '84. Thanks must go to our Social Organizer Nell, for her efforts in getting this extra raffle on the go. It means that the current Committee knows that the next generation of Committee members for '85 have this \$400 in kitty before they plan their effort for the year.

In making this analysis must highlight the contribution made by the Social Organisers. If you look at the nett surplus of previous years those years where we have a good surplus are those years where the Social Organisers are good at fund raising.

Hence participation by you in social events and fund raising gives the club that extra little bit of cash that it can direct towards special events or activities.

Once again, as President, thanks to you the club members, for participating and assisting the club in what could have been a very tight year.

Our liquid funds are healthy, our club membership is status quo or slightly up and our assets in total are some \$39,000. There are a couple of very small loans to club members that will be paid out in July.

With an asset backing like that, and virtually nil liability there are very few clubs of our size that are so financially sound. This is one of our strengths for having a long history and being one of the most viable "fishing clubs" in W.A.

Property:

As mentioned above our books now reflect the market/asset value of the Kalbarri Holiday House. Club use of the facility is up and we trust more and more use will be made by club members.

As with owing any assets there are demands made on us because of this (working bees etc) but I feel sure that you like me consider this a small price to pay.

The Committee will have to address the problem of the permanent sewer connection to this House. Obviously in our best interest to do this as soon as possible but the first quote was a lot higher than expected. Careful planning will be required to ascertain how and when to do this. Our other assets in cash, accounts, drycasting gear etc., have remained relatively stable.

Future of the Club:

While there is always room for improvement, the club has offered a good mixture of fishing, drycasting, social, and competitive events. Hope you have made the most of them. At times attendance can be patchy. It is often hard to pin point all the reasons for this, but success of same rests solely on you the club members.

The Committee is always looking for new ideas, if you have any let them know, or better still get involved, join the Committee.

Looking at the above discourse (you are not the only one that says I get too wordy at times) what a terrific base the Surfcasters Club enjoys. Financial depth, asset of a house, stable membership, variety of fishing/drycasting/social/competition events all contribute to many more years of the S.C. & A.C. and many generations more of "Surfcasters".

Thank you for making my term in office so enjoyable. I wish success to the next Committee as I will now be standing down. I can remember several years back after coming to Perth when I was looking around for a club to join, coming home and

PREPARING FOR YOUR FISHING TRIP

Success of your fishing holiday depends on how you prepare your trip before you leave home. If you are well prepared only the lack of fish can dampen your holiday.

Individual responsibilities such as if you are taking your vehical it must be serviced and a full range of spares carried not only for the car but trailers, generators, etc.

Fishing tackle should be serviced and spares carried for both rods and reels.

Before each trip North with my mates we have a meeting to sort out who's taking what as doubling up takes extra room and adds weight. Each person takes five gallons of water for every week.

We also have a First Aid kit containing everything from Panadol to a Scalpel, if you are miles from nowhere its important to have a good kit.

Every member must take a precooked meal. To cover all members of the group we enjoy meals like Lemon Chicken, Stews, Beef Satays etc. When you return to camp late at night its easy to reheat and we enjoy a good home cooked meal. One party member is given the task of purchasing enough breakfast packs of bacon, sausages etc., for the trip. For lunch we usually have cheese and salami with bread or biscuits.

All camping gear, tents, stoves and the rest of the gear is shared amongst us.

One very important thing to carry is insect repellent and fly spray for tents. Rid brand repellent I have found is the most effective, flys and mosquitos can cause havoc on a holiday.

The night before departure we meet to pack and everything from spares to rubbish bags are checked off the master list to eliminate mistakes of forgotton gear. The only things left to pack before departure is food and bait. Every member is responsible for his own refreshments. Before leaving a Treasurer is appointed we all contribute money to the kitty and all on road expenses are paid out of it. Upon returning we divide the catch equally and everyone submits a bill for out of pocket purchases and we settle up and down a Stubbie to end what always is a successful fishing trip.

AUGUST 1984 - DRYCASTING REPORT

Never before have so few cast so well

The weather was pretty grim as Steve and I set out the lanes, with a fresh north to north westerly wind sending showers across the reserve.

The miserable weather was matched by an equally miserable attendance - a dozen casters in all, and not enough to split into two groups.

Despite the conditions, Brian Leicester racked up his best ever D/H accuracy score of 147 points, only to be eclipsed by a State record of 148 from George Holman. Congratulations to you both on an excellent effort.

The S/H accuracy was dominated by a convalescent Tony D'Alonzo, scoring 27, which apart from Henry's 34, left the rest of us for dead.

Notable among the distance casters were the juniors with some very consistent casting. Check out the scores and you'll see what I mean. Heath in particular is showing signs of being a force to contend with before very long.

Half-way through the distance section, the skies cleared, and the wind switched dramatically to the west. Once again, Brian set the pace with a great artificial bait cast of 145 metres, but Ric Parker, assisted by a combination of tail-winds and a new shimano casting pole, set a new State record of 149.3 metres.

Then came the 112g open, with the westerlies gusting stronger than ever. The jester had the honour of becoming the first West Aussie to crack the 180 barrier, with 181.8. George quickly beat that with 182.5, but Henry finished them all off with 183.3 metres. Good on you Henry.

Record applications will also be submitted for Heather, who cast 135M, and Heath, with 115M.
