<u>Surf Casting and Angling Club of Western Australia</u> <u>Bluff Creek Field Trip - March 2001</u>

The Bluff Creek Field Trip as usual, saw a good turn out with 18 members putting in an appearance at Bluff Creek with Pete Stoeckel and his boys opting to fish locally. It was also good to see Don Bachelor fishing as a visitor. His shoulder seemed to be on the mend and with a bit of luck we'll be seeing him back in the club next year.

The weather on the Saturday was very overcast, the wind was light and unlike Perth it wasn't too hot. Unfortunately the beach wasn't really producing and Pete & fished the beach until about 21:00 Saturday night with only one small salmon to show for it. The only thing that there were plenty of was herring. Some of which were as big as I've seen. Those who fished the rocks at the east end of the beach had more success with several good catches of skippy made and the odd salmon putting in an appearance. The only people who persevered with the beach on the Saturday night were John Jardine and Damien D'Mello. This paid off for John as he managed to catch an 8.1 Kilo bronze whaler. The heaviest shark caught on a field day so far this year.

Sunday morning I was up at 06:00 and headed off with Pete to try for some skippy at the rocks, as we'd missed out the day before. We arrived there at about 06:30 and had the rocks to ourselves. We had just started to fish for skippy when Pete spotted a small school of salmon, the first we had seen, heading our way. We quickly wound in and re-rigged with large raiders and cast at the school. Pete was first in and after a great battle, eventually pulled in his first ever salmon. A 5-Kg salmon on lure's not a bad way to start is it? The salmon school then went out of casting range, before going around in a big circle and coming past again. They continued to do this for about an hour, giving us plenty of opportunity to catch our bag limit of salmon and then more, which were released. We had just cleaned our fish and were carting 17 odd Kilo's of salmon each to the car, when John and Damien turned up. Cookie, Terry Fuller and Tony D'Alonzo closely followed them. Unfortunately by this time the best of the fishing was over, but John and Damien did manage a couple of nice Salmon each and Cookie eventually nailed one of just under 5 kilo's that he had to winch some distance up the rocks.

The wind picked up at around ten o'clock on the Sunday, making fishing the beach very hard work and never really went down again for the rest of the field day. The swell was large and at times I couldn't hold bottom even with a 170 gram gripped sinker.

George Holman, Dave Maxted and Derry Barber were still fishing the beach when we hit the sack, but didn't manage to produce anything big. Derry didn't even manage to find the whiting that he normally does so well with.

John Jardine and Damien were the only one's who got up early on the Monday morning and headed for the rocks where they were rewarded with several more good salmon each on lure.

The weigh in turned up some great fish with plenty of noteworthy captures.

Eight Masters fish were caught. A salmon each for Pete, Brightman, John Jardine, Damien D'Mello, Ian Cook and myself; a shark for John Jardine and a skippy each for Tony D'Alonzo and Darren Bachelor.

Pete Brightman, John Jardine, Damien D'Mello and myself each caught a Grand Masters Salmon.

John Jardine's combined bag of 26.98 Kg was the heaviest so far this year also wins him the "Hans Wytenburg Memorial Trophy" for the heaviest bag caught on the March long weekend field day.

My bag proved to be the heaviest bag of scale fish so far this year at 21.55 Kg.

We also saw the heaviest Salmon so far the year at 5.95 Kilo's and Darren Bachelor weighed in the heaviest Skippy so far for the year at 0.75 Kilo's. So catch wise this proved to be the most prolific field day so far this year.

The final Field Day for this year will be Cape to Cape on the 21st and 22nd of April. This will be your last chance to climb up the scoreboard and to win any Field Day sections for this year.

Hello! Our congratulations go to the Stoeckel Family on the arrival of their baby daughter. We wish them all the best for a happy future!



Catching Swan River Black Bream (with Damian D'Mello)

Lovely to eat, great fun to catch, Black Bream (Acanthopagrus butcherii) are often looked at as a rather mysterious, mythical fish to some anglers. Come on, they aren't that hard to catch! Success will be yours with persistence, and by following a few ground rules. Here are a few hints to get you started.

WHEN

I do most of my fishing for Bream in summer. At this time of year, the fish are generally migrating up-river to spawn. After doing their 'thing', they are usually ravenous for a feed. I start fishing for them around mid-December, all the way through to late March. Fortunately, I've found the gentlemanly hours to be most productive. I have not found early morning or late afternoon particularly conducive to better Breaming. Contrary to popular believe, high tide is not necessarily the best tide to fish. I favor low to mid tide.

WHERE

I fish upriver from about Ascot racecourse, through to upper bassendean. Good drycasting skill is NOT needed for this fishing as the good ol Bream is a bit of a homeboy, preferring to sit under his snags. This means that this is where you should be casting, right into, and around sunken logs, fallen trees and the like. One good rule here, if your not getting snagged every now and then, your not casting into the proper places. Not a sport for the soft! Another important rule is not to be afraid to cast close in (2–3m from shore), as long as there is structure, you WILL find bream, regardless of the depth.

TACKLE

A small rod and reel that can take some punishment loaded with 8 - 12lb line is the go.

My rig is simple; it consists of a sinker (size 00), running all the way to a size 1 hook baited with a whole prawn. Another tip, prawns don't swim in a 'u' shape like some old geezer with a buggered back, so spent some time and get the bait natural looking (that is, straight along the hook).

These techniques may seem a bit simple, but believe me, they work. Using the above tactics, I've landed Bream to 2.45kg, way up the back of Guildford from about half a metre of water. So give the river a go, but please, if you hook up, grit your teeth and hold on to your rod with BOTH hands.
