#### THE HISTORY OF THE CLUB

# **Brief Overview:**

During 1952 a group of fisherman consisting of Dudley Brown, Noel Knight, Vic Davies and Lloyd Dunn formed the Surfcasting & Angling Association of WA. The first meeting was held at Aussie Cycles in Wellington St, Perth and during the fifties there was an amalgamation of clubs, suburban and country resulting in a name change to the Drycasting and Angling Association of Western Australia. March 1957 resulted in a further name change as we know it today being the Surfcasting & Angling Club of WA (Inc). Membership peaked in 1971 with some 164 members with field trips consisting of 50 or more attendees. Kalbarri House was purchased in 1976 with the loan being repaid through social fund raising within nine years of purchases date. As at December 1993, including the new members to whom we welcome to the club, our club membership is 63 with possibly an additional 8 to 12 further members to whom we are awaiting return of membership nomination forms and subscriptions.

The late nineties saw an update of the clubs Constitution, Bylaws, Procedures pertaining to the procedure of the fund raising events such as the Mandurah 500. Management folders for committee members containing all relevant requirements to fulfil the duties of a committee officer and requirements of the club. This now places the Surcasting & Angling Club (Inc) in a strong position to carry on the tradition and continue the fun, fellowship, companionship and sports of fishing & drycasting whilst supporting conservation and the continuing of the enjoyment of fishing in the future for both ourselves, our children and grandchildren.

The weather has now turned itself up a couple of notches, and it feels like its summer, and the tailor are now running at Watticarra Ck - bag limits morning and night with up to 30 people a time fishing. 5.30 seems to be the more productive time, so at the present Andy and I go only once a week. Mulloway are turning up also late at night, and the main reason for this is that the dredge has arrived and is dredging the sand bars in the channel - but alas they are pumping it to the valley on the way to Frustration and the run-off is flowing to the sea and the way the sea is running, all the murky water is finishing up at Frustration - Frustrating is it not!! Speaking of Mulloway; for those who are interested the pro's are receiving under \$2 a kilo for the flesh and the fish factories can't get rid of it, and its not worth the cost of sending it to Qld, so at the present a kilo of mulies are worth more than a kilo of Mulloway, so those Mulloway eaters out there check out your local fish outlets for cheap fish, if you can't catch them.

We often wondered up here why there were so many rabbits, and why they were not kept under check. We found out last month, there were a lot of rabbit shoots going on from Horricks to Binnu and Kalbarri, all in aid of bait for the cray pots, so if you see a bunny now your lucky - and its in an awful hurry; so we have been a bit slow catching dinner.

The locals have their pots in and are averaging 15 - 19 crays out of their two pots. They expect it only to last 12 days as it is the whites that they are after, not bad when you add it up.

The boat fishing for the amateurs is not so hot as the drift fishing has gone off; and at anchor is the same, surface boat fishing for BIG tailor, shark, sampson, garfish - the latter bail for the tailor.

Well I've just about covered it all for now. Hope we might see a few of you over the holidays, if you are coming up. Watch the park road for hoppers, goats, pigs etc, late night and early mornings, and don't be afraid to bring a fan or cooler - you'll need it.

#### STATE DRYCASTING CHAMPIONSHIPS 1993

The 1993 State Drycasting Championships were held at Yokine Reserve on Sunday, 28th November. The weather was fine and warm commencing with a slight head wind for the accuracy events and later moving to a side to moderate tail wind.

The decision to run these championships later in the year was the correct one as fine conditions prevail and there are more day light hours for preparation and casting, and the tournament can be comfortably completed in one day. Casting commenced at 8:30 am and presentations and packing up was completed around 5:45 pm.

An attendance of seventy casters participated (Open 31, Ladies 7, Veterans 14, Juniors 7, Mini-Juniors 1). There were also approximately 12 - 14 workers present.

The two casting meetings to prepare for the championships proved beneficial as work was allocated to various people and I compliment them on the manner in which this was carried out. I will thank those later.

The teams events were conducted first (accuracy 56 gram distance, and teams artificial bait) and this enabled those who weren't going to cast in the individual events and who wanted to go home early to do so, however the majority stayed and competed. Longest cast in the 56 gram event went to George Holman (146.3 m) also the 112 gram distance (161 m). Janet Hughes scored 124 in the ladies accuracy and Ray Thorpe 134 in the Veterans. Heather Osborne cast 131.8 metres in the 112 gram distance, M Horstman 113.8 in the Juniors and Tony D'Alonzo 138.3 in the Veterans.

To all the winners and plougetters in both individual and team events I extend my congratulations and my thanks to all who participated. We could always do with larger attendance as good competition and learning is what it is all about as well as enjoying the day.

One of our markers was hit by a sinker during the day and emphasises the wearing of safety gear and more care taken by both casters and markers.
