DRY CASTING OFFICER'S REPORT DECEMBER 2007

Sunday, 2 December 2007

When we arrived at the oval at 7am, casting conditions were perfect. By the time casting started, the wind was blowing a strong south south-easterly, changing later in the day to a south-westerly for a while. Despite the strong winds, there was generally good casting by everyone. The Seniors had only two out of bounds on distance and the Vets and Juniors had only one.

Among our 18 casters we had one visitor, Rick Lawrence, who George was instructing. Whilst he didn't cast in single handed accuracy, he did cast in the other events and managed to score in all but three casts, which is a really good first time effort.

The Keet family again joined us, with Greg making steady gains from last month. At her first meeting, Felicity Keet managed 53 points, beating brother Morgan, with 24 points. Holly Walker's casting is improving every month with help from Vix. Vix Alexander won all the ladies' events with quite a few 100m+ casts, whilst Gary Gildersleeves was a clear winner in double handed accuracy with 169 points. Looking at double handed accuracy, it surprised me that there were no bull's eyes, but plenty of 23s & 24s. The three bull's eyes in single handed accuracy were by George Holman, Mal Head and Andrew Pekaar.

Andrew Pekaar had a day to remember, scoring a PB of 257 points, which was the second highest score of the day behind Gary Gildersleeves. He outscored the seniors and re-set three Junior SCAC records. He reset his own 112g to 149.53m, artificial bait to 131.56m and single handed accuracy to 33 points. Well done, Andrew.

While injuries restricted Jimmy Strong to single handed accuracy, he still managed a respectable score of 26 points.

YANCHEP TO SEABIRD FIELD DAY REPORT

This field day was looked forward to with eager anticipation because it was one with many "firsts". Firstly, it was the first for the summer, secondly it was the first time I had fished that particular stretch of coast, thirdly it was my first one as [Acting] FDO and fourthly it was the closest away field day to home.

We had mostly packed on the Friday night and with a final inclusion of last minute gear [tarps for possible showers] and the two hounds, we left home under threatening skies and made the 40-minute journey to the designated sign on area just in front of the picturesque Yanchep Lagoon. 13 people signed on [12 members and 1 visitor], and after some purchases from the café, nine of us followed Morris to the much lauded fishing spot where he had good results the previous week. Because the Pekaars were staying at Guilderton, that's where they fished. With the odd spit of rain, the convoy of six FWDs bumped along the limestone track towards the coast. After passing through an open gate and driving north along sand tracks, we arrived at the spot where we let our tyres down to 18lbs or less. Hadley informed us that this was his first experience at driving on sand. Once we'd driven the 3 or 4km up the beach, with a couple of bogging incidents, the vehicles were arranged along the sand and all the assorted fishing paraphernalia was unleashed. The conditions were overcast with easterly winds and some precipitation; there was very little swell and even less weed, so the physical act of fishing was rather enjoyable. Too bad that the fish didn't seem all that hungry.

As we fished through the afternoon and into the evening, herring and very small whiting seemed to be the only fish enticed into biting on a baited hook. Vix landed the only tailor that day and Melvin hooked up a ray that took about 20 minutes to land. By about 11pm all but Daniel had retired to bed from the lack of fish and abundance of rain. Daniel fished through the night and had a couple of hook ups on something big [possibly mulloway] but was broken off each time. The weather had become biblical with flashes of lightning; great rumbling peels of thunder and the ever persistent rain. By dawn half of us were up and fishing while the sensible half were warm and dry in bed. A few more herring were caught and Mark managed a couple of tailor by bait casting with mulies. By 9.30am, the rain was torrential and we'd stopped fishing and packed our sodden gear up. The drive back along the beach saw one vehicle repeatedly succumb to the soft sand, but Peter, with his trusty Nissan/snatch strap, dragged the stricken vehicle the entire length of the beach. After re-inflating tyres, the group made its way back to the Yanchep Lagoon car park for some hot café food, chit chat and the weigh in. The Guilderton fishing group proved that pickings were slim there too as only herring made it into Peter and Andrew's bags. Malcolm won the best bag with 30 herring at 4.858kg, Mark had the best scale fish of a 0.582kg tailor and Vix was the only one who caught all three species weighed in that weekend [herring, tailor and whiting].

This Field Day venue looks very promising and should prove more successful under normal summer conditions and I look forward to fishing this bit of coast more often.

Our next field day is a local on January 12/13. This is an easy one where you get to sleep in your own bed and one at which there is less chance of getting bogged! I hope to see you there.

REEF BEACH Heavy Duty Fishing

Reef Beach is well known to older members for its promise of something exciting. We have had fish of record size caught at RB. These include Salmon, Skippy, Shark etc. A member caught a Skippy of over 3 kg and I have had gilled and gutted salmon of over 5kg. The bay is made up of a number of small crescent beaches. These have an offshore reef chain about 100 metres out from the beach. The water is very deep right up to the beach with channels running out through the reef. The area has you thinking large fish country. The inside of the reefs is still fishable in quite strong winds. The beach is only about 5-8 km long, so we all fish in a relatively small area.

The camp site is just in from the beach front and is not well protected, so bring a strong tent and plenty of tent pegs and guys. Access is by 4WD and you can get a trailer or off road camper in fairly easily. I personally really enjoy fishing at RB as much as the Bluff Creek venue.

Reef Beach is located about 50 km east of Bluff Creek. To get there, you continue past Bluff Creek and turn onto the Bremer Bay Road. Go approximately 28 km and turn onto a track which takes you to the beach. Foster Beach and Dillon Bay are around the next headland to the east.

To get to these locations, go back to the Bremer Bay Road. Proceed approx another 20 km and turn down Dillon Bay Road. This road splits and goes to both Dillon Bay and Fosters Beach. Both these locations have good fishing and are very scenic. As a past FDO, I recommend this venue.

SHARK BAY SAFARI 2008

The committee has decided to make the trip to Shark Bay an official Club Safari. The dates are *Monday, 28 April 2008* to *Saturday, 10 May 2008*. School goes back on 29 April.

The trip is for beginners as well as for the more experienced gung ho fisher persons. There is fishing suitable for children near the camping site. The fishing will be from the cliffs, beach and boats. The species you can expect to catch are Mackerel, large Tailor, Tusk Fish, Yellow Fin Whiting, Yellow Fin Bream, Baldchin Groper, Emperor, Shark, Flathead, Pink Snapper and other species. **Tino** fished from the beach in front of our camp on the last trip and caught, Yellow Fin Whiting, Yellow Fin Bream, Flathead and lost some larger fish.

There are areas were you can snorkel and look at coral, sponges, cowry shells and tropical species fish. The water is always warm for swimming, with the camp site on a beautiful beach with shallow water. The camp looks to the east and west so you get great sunsets and sunrises.

The weather at this time of year is still fairly warm. The afternoon sea breezes of the summer period are still there, but lighter. We expect some lengthy periods of easterly winds in the mornings and low swells, which is good for ballooning.

It takes about 12 hours travelling time to get to Shelter Bay. You need to leave at 03:00 hrs to get there with sufficient time to set up camp. Last July, we split the trip up stopping overnight at the Billabong Motel. The trip in the next day got us there about midday with ample time to set up camp. This was a relaxing trip up and we were fresh to start fishing the next morning. Currently, there are approx 16 people going, including five women.

The camp sites only have long drop toilets with no other facilities. Water is available @ \$5 per 20 L. This means that you must be self-sufficient. The nearest service station is the Overlander 200km away. CDMA phone service is to be discontinued in January 2008, so your new phones will possibly not operate. There is a public phone near the ranger's house. At times, insects can be an issue, so remember fly/mosquito nets.

The round trip will be about 2000 km, including trips to locations like False Entrance, Thunder Bay and Shelter Bay. The heaviest rainfall in the area is May through July so take good strong tents and wet weather gear. YES, it does rain in the Shark Bay area – just ask the boys who went in July. Some dome tents can be demolished by the winds at Shark Bay, just ask Melvin Wee. It rains on an average of 10 days of the month. The temperatures range from an average of 26 degrees maximum and an average of 16.5 minimum. Humidity is 73%.

Morris Kolman has purchased cylinders of party gas with balloons from Spotlight. This may be a cheaper way of acquiring the balloon gas. These cylinders are also easy to transport and move round when walking/climbing down to fishing locations.


The overall cost would be in the order of \$500 - \$800. The shared costs must be paid by the beginning of April 2008. An up front non-refundable deposit of \$50 per head is required by the JANUARY GENERAL MEETING to get your name on the list. The organisers will sort out camp site bookings, bait, generator and boat fuel. This cost is split evenly between the participants. Smaller groups can then organise their own transport, tenting and cooking arrangements. We will be looking for participants to help with supplying vehicles, HD trailers, boats and equipment like generators, freezers, "engels" etc. There will be an instruction period at the February General Meeting as well as other information supplied over the last couple of months before we go. I have a very comprehensive trip list in electronic form if anyone wishes to get a copy.
