



Briefing/Start times: 11 am - 12 noon Saturday 5 March.

There is a compulsory briefing: 12 noon, with lines down at 1 pm.

Weigh-in: 4 pm sharp on Sunday 6 March 2011

Both the Compulsory briefing and the weigh-in will be held at the Cheynes Beach Caravan Park. People not staying at the park are asked to park outside and walk in. People wanting to stay at the park on Sunday night are asked to book ASAP as it is a long weekend.

Pre-registrations must be sent for all clubs with competition numbers by 25 February 2011.

South Coast Fishing Rules, as outlined in the Recreational Fishing Guide (South Coast Region) published by the Department of Fisheries, imposes the following mixed daily bag limit restrictions:

Category 1 (Highest Risk) maximum 7 fish per angler Category 2 (Medium Risk) maximum 16 fish per angler Category 3 (Low Risk) maximum 40 fish per angler

The category for each species is shown in the Eligible Species list. AAAWA rules also specify:-

#### 3.5 Catch Limits. (These are AAAWA's limits for the competition)

A maximum of eight fish of any one species and a maximum total of fifty fish are permitted to be presented to the weigh in. No bag shall exceed the one day bag limit as set by The Department of Fisheries (WA) (FWA) Penalty: disqualification.

#### Notes for Club people camping with the Club at Bluff Creek.

Sometimes it is possible to drive along the beach from the Bluff Creek camping area to Cheynes Beach as an alternative to going all the way out to the main road, but you need to get past some rocks on the beach at the southern end.

It all depends on the width and slope of the beach and the tides. Those of you who have been to Bluff Creek over the last few years will have seen how much the beach can change due to erosion and sand shifting and replacement, and this can happen over just a few days of heavy weather. There is a track through the bush around those rocks.

#### **Recfishwest Report**

**Wilderness Conservation Areas.** Recfishwest has adopted a policy about Wilderness Conservation Areas as a development of its earlier Wilderness Fishing policy. These protect wilderness values while allowing low impact recreational fishing. Fish can be caught and consumed within the area but not taken away.

Recfishwest views Wilderness Conservation Areas as an important management tool in the suite of marine conservation measures. Wilderness Conservation Areas are Marine Protected Areas that offer an extensive level of protection whilst still retaining all recreational amenity values. These are not seen as a replacement for IUCN Strict Nature Reserve Category 1a (sanctuary zones). Rather they are a complementary zoning tool that aims to meet conservation objectives while maintaining recreational fishing values in a given area.

IUCN Category 1b is the second highest level of protection listed by the IUCN. Such areas would be promoted as alternatives to complete no take Sanctuary Zones in Marine Parks but only in some suitable places.

Wilderness Conservation Areas would be characterised by two principal features:

- 1. That the populations of fish species would be very close to their natural state before human exploitation, i.e. they would be only lightly exploited. This accords with the International Union for the Conservation of Nature description of "slightly modified" and meets IUCN Category 1b. In order to maintain fish populations at near natural levels, mortality due to fishing must be minimal. Regulations should prevent the accumulation of fish and their removal from the area. Retained catch must only be for personal consumption while in the Wilderness Conservation Area. Any catch over and above this must be carefully released.
- 2. That Wilderness Conservation Areas should be virtually free of evidence of human development and there should be very few people in the area. In this way very low levels of exploitation will occur. Recfishwest prefers not to be prescriptive with respect to restrictions on numbers of people and methods of access. However the principles should fit the IUCN definition that the area is "without significant and permanent habitation" and should be "managed so as to preserve its natural condition". It must be clear that the aim is that the area will look natural, it cannot be allowed to become overcrowded, and the minimal take of fish will have a negligible impact on fish populations. **Young Future Leaders.** Recfishwest is seeking submissions of interest for the Recfishwest "Young Future Leaders in Recreational Fishing" project to be held in March 2011. It is designed to give younger Western Australians a voice and opportunity to be involved in maintaining the quality of our State's recreational fishing future.

15 successful candidates from Western Australia and the Northern Territory, aged under 35, will get training at the Abrolhos Islands in the future management of recreational fishing.

Participants would learn how to best apply their skills through community groups, advisory committees, recreational fishing advocacy groups or government agencies.

**Artificial Reefs.** Recfishwest took part in the recent study tour looking at world leading artificial reef and marine fish stocking technology in Korea and China.

North Asian countries such as Korea, China and Japan have been at the forefront of research into artificial reef construction, deployment and research. The purpose of the Department of Fisheries delegation to South Korea and China in October/November 2010 was for key decision makers in Western Australia to learn more about the effectiveness of artificial reefs and investigate current research and construction expertise for the possible use of artificial reefs in Western Australia.

Recfishwest says it's time Western Australia seriously considered the benefits of artificial reefs to improve fish stocks for the future and sustainability of the marine environment.

Artificial reefs have been used extensively around the world to create additional fish habitat, regenerate damaged ecosystems and enhance catches.

Korea and China, along with a number of other northern hemisphere countries have a long history of developing a variety of purposely designed artificial reef materials that are cost effective, biologically sustainable and environmentally beneficial.

Western Australian Recreational Boat Fishing Survey 2011. The Department of Fisheries will undertake a Statewide Recreational Boat Fishing Survey starting in January 2011.

The most comprehensive study of its kind in Australia, the survey is a joint research project involving the Department of Fisheries, Recfishwest, Edith Cowan University and Murdoch University.

This is the first time boat fishers from all over Western Australia will be surveyed. Previously, surveys have been focused on specific regional areas.

The Department will conduct up to 23,000 interviews of fishers during the survey. The survey will consist of the following major elements:

3,000 boat fishers will record their catches until February 2012 via a logbook and share their results with the Department each month. (2000 fishers will be randomly selected from the wider metropolitan area and 1000 from regional areas).

5,000 - 10,000 fishers will be surveyed at boat ramps around the State at the end of their fishing trip.

Information gathered from 5,000 - 10,000 fishers who come into contact with Fisheries and Marine Officers during 2011.

The Department will also record video images of major boat ramps in each region to assist in validating fishing effort over 24-hour periods.

It has all the right ingredients for a great weekend. The camp site is protected from a lot of the wind and is near a fresh water creek, great for washing. You do need to take fresh water for drinking, tea making, etc.

The weather can vary from drizzle to perfect to very hot, but most days there's a strong breeze and that's usually from the left along the beach.

There are kilometers of open beach for fishing. Some reef fishing spots are within easy distance of the camping area. There have been some great catches by people who have walked from the camp site to the nearest part of the beach.

A long rod is essential as the trevally sometimes congregate around the offshore reefs. This is where your dry casting practice comes into good use for distance and placing the bait accurately.

The beaches and water are in pristine condition so it is really a very pleasant spot to just relax and enjoy the outdoors and the fishing.

Bluff Creek is only accessible by 4WD and is east of Albany. Once there, access to the camp site can be along the beach or through the dunes above the beach, which is usually reasonably easy, although getting off the beach to the camping area with a loaded trailer can need a good run up.

We recommend this Field Day to all new members as the fishing is easy and there will be plenty of experienced members on hand to help.

Usually a group of members go down in convoy to Bluff Creek on the Friday morning so anyone wishing to join in please raise this at the General Meeting.

The Instruction period at the 9 February General Meeting will be about the Bluff Creek area, fishing, camping, road and track details for getting there, and more. Put that date in your diary so you don't miss it.

#### State Government gets tough on dumping

Yes, I know, this topic is not actually anything to do with fishing. But Club members are out and about and often see the results of illegal dumping, or may see some people doing it, so this is to let you know about the changes. A major objective of the new law Environmental Protection Amendment Bill 2010 is to prevent the dumping of trailer loads of waste in nature reserves, State forests and other publicly accessible areas on the outskirts of cities and towns.

Anyone who illegally dumps waste will face hefty fines of up to \$62,500 for individuals and \$125,000 for corporations, providing a very significant deterrent against dumping.

Fines for dumping were previously limited to a maximum of \$1,000 under the Litter Act, for minor littering and bill posting. The penalties under the Litter Act will still apply to actions that involve the depositing of very small quantities of non-harmful material, such as dropping food wrapping or papers.

However serious acts of illegal dumping, including small quantities of materials that pose an environmental hazard or large quantities of innocuous materials, will be penalised accordingly. The new rules will come into effect early in 2011.
