## ~BLUFF CREEK FIELD DAY~

Bluff Creek is only accessible by 4WD and is east of Albany. Beach access is easy and there is kilometres of good fishing water. The camp site is near a fresh water creek, "great for muddy little urchins" or for washing of the salt) with other camping spots nearby if you wish for some solitude. Fish species range through Silver bream, herring, large trevally, flathead as well as other varieties. This all makes it ideal for children.

One method of getting to Bluff Creek is to go down Albany Hwy to Mount Baker and then east on the Mt Baker/Porongurups road. Then go south on the Chester Pass road approx 20 kilometres and turn onto Kalgan/Napier road. After 6 kilometres you turn onto the South Coast Hwy. Continue on through Many Peaks and approx 30 K further on you turn south onto Warriup road. (DON'T go down Bluff Creek road which is before Warriup.) Go approx 18K? and you will come to a turn of to the right which goes to a quarry, with a farm entrance and a lake on the left. A couple of hundred metres more and you come to a poorly defined track going of to the right. This we hope to mark with a club flag with the first person going down on Friday. Take this track and you will come to a fence line. Drive with the fence line on your right and you will eventually get to the camping area.

AUSTRALIAN ANGLERS ASSOCIATION (WA) INC  
DELEGATES MEETING - 17TH DECEMBER 1991

- (1) "SwanFish" to be run by Melville Angling Club in the Swan River on the weekend of 22nd & 23rd Feb 91 - Clubs encouraged to participate.
- (2) For the proposal to hold the Drycasting 91/92 State Competition at Esperance in June 92 - this venue will not be selected as it interferes with the State Beach & Rock. A local club is still requested to volunteer.
- (3) Clubs to highlight where they would like to see the Safety Anchors placed on dangerous fishing spots on the south coast.
- (4) A request has been made for AAA clubs to donate to an appeal for a Geraldton member who had a serious fishing accident. An insurance proposal has also been received through the Australian Recreation and Sports Fishing Club whereby clubs can obtain insurance not only to cover this type of a problem but also to cover gear/equipment etc while fishing.
- (5) Melville Club obtained a profit on the State Estuary competition whereby proceeds to the AAA was \$190.00.
- (6) The results of the Postal Fishing Competition (Nov 91) are:-

1st	- Melville	- 1580 pts
2nd	- Offshore Boating	- 1531 pts
3rd	- Geraldton Offshore	- 1437 pts
- (7) Notices of Motion;
  - (a) Voted on at the meeting - To alter the General By-law whereby the maximum amount of cash expenditure on trophies for State competitions be raised from \$500 to \$750 .....Carried.
  - (b) To be discussed and taken back to clubs for voting in January 92 - to delete bag limit of 50 and substitute - one days bag limit from Fisheries Dept, and disqualification if more fish are put into bag. Also the minimum size of fish to be per Fisheries Dept regulations or if none, then AAA to use a minimum size of 20cm (i.e. category 4 - Bread & butter fish)
  - (c) West Coast Angling Club put in a notice of motion to change Constitution or By-laws to have fees for Veterans the same as for Juniors for all competitions. AAA to respond to this club and advise them it is the responsibility of the club hosting the event to set the fees.
- (8) The Fisheries Dept want to take a higher profile with the Public - in particular to promote, educate etc. A request will be made for all clubs to submit their field days/weigh-in calendar for the coming year.
- (9) AAA to publish their annual booklet. Anyone wishing to submit any material to forward it directly to John Curtis.
- (10) The new brochures from the Fisheries Dept on 1st December 91 fishing regulations are now available. All members encouraged to obtain same and understand thoroughly.
