# FIELD DAY REPORT...

JUNE L.W.E. - KALBARRI, WAGOE

For a winter field day, our venue 500km North of Perth is the right idea. Much better than 500km South. While not the balmy days of April, Kalbarri in June gave us some pretty good weather. It did deteriorate on the Monday and as most of us drove home that day, on getting close to Perth - boy did it "rain."

A few of the fellows arrived a bit early, despite some minor vehicle problems, and did a bit of a yard clean-up around the club house. One of our potential new members, Beau, had arrived a couple of days early, he was not able to get into the house but on the Thursday night, spent wetting his line at Chinamans and came up with a beaut mulloway. That gave us a feeling of confidence when this story came out at the sign on Saturday morning. The usual team had arrived and with last year's success and one good mulloway in the freezer everyone was rearin' to go by 1 pm. - HIGH EXPECTATIONS!

Quite a few of us headed down to Wagoe with the idea of bigger and better fish than around Kalbarri. Various stretches of beach/reef were tried on Saturday afternoon but with little success. The swell was a lot bigger than hoped for so this limited the areas that could be fished. On doing a tour along the beach late afternoon the Osbornes (Peter and Sharon) found that it was quiet all the way along. The Reeleys and Heads, Heather and Glen etc were fishing hard at a favourite spot - with a result of zero.

The Osbornes went further south and joined the D'Alonzos. Saturday evening saw the former Surfcasters head back to Kalbarri with the Osbornes and D'Alonzos fishing the Lagoon beach. An odd tailor and good bream but no real fish.

The following morning, bright and clear, fished the beach and then moved onto the reef. Peter and Tony donning wet suits and using techniques of dodging swells by casting/running etc. Caught a few smaller fish, then bust-ups. We think a school of big trevally moved in. Even going up to 30lb line, could not turn them and work them up over the reef. Just hard work and no result but you know your fishing.

The rest of the group were back at Kalbarri trying for tailor etc. and while large schools were not found some better quality tailor up to 1.5 kilos and skippy over 1 kilo started to show up.

Sunday afternoon and Monday morning gave a similar repeat story, however Beau managed to repeat his effort with another smaller mulloway at Chinamans. The rest in Kalbarri finding more quality tailor and skippy.

Even Glen managing to show Heather how to fish for tailor at the Blue Hole by tying into a small tailor run of good fish.

The D'Alonzos finding a couple of small mulloway with Peter and Sharon following their daughters effort of Saturday night ie both hooking a shark that pointed to South Africa and had no intention of stopping. The weigh in on Monday morning gave all people with some fish, and a number of section changes.

Tony D'Alonzo did his usual bit with the biggest bag and now feeling a bit of pressure from Mal Kelly with a good bag of tailor. The Heads found some good skippy giving the results of the day looking like the following. Not a great catch but not a wipe out by any means. Just shows that if the weather and swell hold out, Kalbarri can produce in the middle of winter.

  3. Host clubs are required for the following AAA events -

    - . State Drycasting Championships
  4. A Black Bream Competition is to be held on the 8th and 9th of June. No registration or rules of the day.
