ROTTNEST FIELD DAY - 15TH-16TH MAY

Weather: - Fine, warm, light NE-NW winds, and a very low swell. Perfect weather.

The Salmon would strike lures, mulies, or whitebait. We all had great fun with the Salmon on the light gear. As we had our bag limits (4) we let a number of fish go, very easy with 4kg line.

Ian Taggart and the boys had meanwhile gone to Wilsons and Ian caught some Skippy and a Tailor. Tony and Peter fished a number of spots with good results. At dusk a number of people fished Radar but the Salmon didn't allow other fish a chance at the bait. We had a large Wobbiegong on the reef for a few minutes following after old discarded baits.

The boys at Fairbridge caught some small fish but the Salmon were finicky and only one was caught.

So it was back to camp for a good feed and bed. 16kg of Salmon is heavy work to lug back to the hut with the rest of the fishing gear so we were all fairly tired.

We had a 6am start on Sunday and the same group went to Fairbridge. The rest tried Wilsons early in the morning with some nice sized Skippy being landed. After this, people split up and tried various spots. Mark landed a couple of nice Bream at Cathedral. All I could hook was Salmon and Buff Bream. The Herring were biting on just bare hooks with a piece of spaghetti on the line at the tennis courts.

Well it was time to go back to camp, weigh in, have lunch and pack

On boarding the ferry we were informed that they had lost a couple of blades off the port propeller and would have a 1.5 hour trip back on the starboard engine only. Luckily it was calm so the trip back was slow but comfortable.

A terrific weekend was had by all who went. The conditions were absolutely ideal. What a contrast to last August field day at Rottnest. Well done to the two Taggart boys on their Salmon catches.

Page 10, Clause 17 - Meetings

To reword second paragraph as follows:

"Minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting shall be read in part or full at the next following Annual General Meeting."

To remove the following:

"Such notice shall show the meeting agenda and shall be posted to the members at their last known address"

Constitution to now read:

"Notice of every Annual General, General, or Special Meeting, shall be given in writing to every member not less than seven days before the date of such meeting."

Page 11a, Annual General Meeting Agenda

Revised agenda as follows:

- a) Annual General Meeting Agenda:
 In the case of an Annual General Meeting the following business shall normally be conducted:
 - Existing chairperson to open meeting.
 - 2. Existing chairperson to follow the General Meeting agenda up to but not including the general business section.
 - 3. Standing orders to be called by the existing chairperson who advises that all of the committee officers will now stand down and that the immediate past secretary will read the minutes, in part or full, of the last Annual General Meeting and call for a minimum of two persons, who shall conduct the next immediate procedure for the election of officers, hereinafter called the election officers.
 - 4. The immediate past secretary reads the minutes in part or full of the last Annual General Meeting.
 - 5. Guide as to the procedure for the election officers is as follows:-
 - * A white board is prepared showing the committee positions with provision to enter names and, if required, numbers.
 - * Voting slips are issued to each eligible financial member present showing the individual committee position concerned and lines for the insertion of numbers or names as advised by the election officers.
 - * The first election is that of the President and the election officers conducting this procedure shall request nominations for the position of President and such nominations are required to be in writing, seconded and handed to the election officer who will request that eligible financial members present and voting shall vote by completing said voting slip folding over same and issuing to the election officers for counting.
 - 6. The election officers will then advise the meeting of the name of the new President after counting the confidential votes and pass over to the new President the responsibility to conclude the election of the incoming committee officers.

- The newly appointed secretary or the prior committee secretary shall record the balance of the meeting by continuing on with the partially completed minutes of the prior committee secretary.
- Upon the conclusion of the election of new incoming 8. committee officers standing orders shall then be revoked and general business called followed by the standard conclusion for a General Meeting.
- Chairperson to thank past committee for services rendered and close meeting suggesting that members join together to create a social atmosphere and welcome in the new committee.
