CLUB ETIQUETTE

MEETINGS: The monthly general meeting is usually held on the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 8.00pm. All members should endeavor to attend the meeting so as to keep up with club matters.

DRYCASTING: Dry casting competitions are usually conducted on the first Sunday of each month. Instruction is given to all new and existing members who want to learn and maintain the standard of the members casting.

FIELD DAYS: These normally follow each General meeting on the ensuing weekend. It is compulsory for anglers to attend both the sign on and the weigh in. Anglers who cannot attend the sign on for work or other unavoidable reasons may make prior arrangements for a late sign on. However, only under very exceptional circumstances will failure to attend weigh-ins not be penalised with the loss of points acquired during that field day. It is the Field day officer's duty to inform the Committee of any anglers who fail to attend the weigh in. It is then the Committee's duty to decide what action shall be taken. Disputes may be taken to the Committee. Entries for Game fish badges, Club records, and Open fishing competitions must be lodged with the club Recorder within 30 days of capture, and using the approved club forms.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS: Please notify the Treasurer and the Reel Talk Editor of any change or incorrect listing of address or phone numbers.

GENERAL ETIQUETTE: If any member intends to resign from the club a letter of resignation should be forwarded to the Secretary. Membership fees must be paid to the treasurer, and become due on 1st May each year, and must be paid in full by the 31st July. All voting/Nomination rights at the A.G.M. will be withdrawn if not financial.

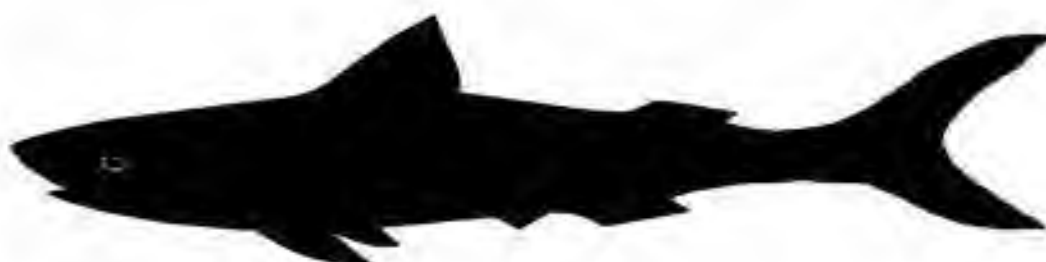

A.A.A. of W.A. Report

A small attendance of delegates were present (17) and a lot of apologies were tabled. Wayne Morris was stuck on Dirk Hartog because of weather problems and was unable to be present so George Holman was our only delegate.

A group of fish (bream and bonito come to mind) have had their bag limits altered without any consultation. This is a worry and clubs are asked to voice their concern that this is happening. Please write to the Minister and draw this to his attention and say that we would like to be involved.

Notice of a special meeting of the West Coast Working Group to be held at Underwater World on Monday, 26th July at 7:00pm to look at the West Coast management of our coastal fishery.

Mention was made of the forthcoming special meeting of Recfishwest to be held on 8th September to vote on their constitutional amendments. It's a straight out vote for or against with no debate. Voting may be by proxy and needs a three-fourths majority.

Concern was made about the import of uncooked Canadian Salmon and the implications on the Tasmanian Salmon Fishery as there are a lot of viruses encountered elsewhere.

Town of Cambridge by-laws prohibits the use of barley whilst fishing and fishers are not allowed to fish near swimmers or surfers!! Confiscation of gear will result.

All State events must have receipts for all expenses, etc along with an approximate budget for the purposes of auditing in future.

The boating committee is holding a group meeting at the Sportsman Association on Tuesday, 27th July.

George Holman gave a report on the recent drycasting group meeting. This appears elsewhere in the "Reel Talk".

A lengthy discussion was held on the proposed Gascoyne Draft and a summary will be sent out with the minutes to asset clubs if they want to avail themselves of the content.

The Proposed Gascoyne Draft

As requested I have had a look at the above proposal and have made a summary comment which appears below. I have filled in a "comments on proposals" form and will make it available for anyone to look at at the AGM or before if you wish. I will endeavour to have a few photocopies of my submission at casting and the meeting and if you wish to bring your forms along and use this as a yardstick for your comments, please feel free to do so.

I will be sending the following summary along with the form:

SUMMARY

The basic principle of the proposal of the document to "manage" recreational fish stocks for future generations to enjoy, I agree with. However, there needs to be more input from the average recreational fisher in the final decision making.

The document on "A quality future for recreational fishing in the Gascoyne" is too heavy and detailed for the average recreational fisher and is confusing. It should have an "appraisee" or a "simple version" in parallel so that it may be thoroughly understood so that people may make firm and sound comment.

"Management" should be the goal, not "control" and the threat of licenses and fees for different zones or regions is a worry. Who "manages" the money and what are the fines if anyone transgresses? The latter is not mentioned in the paper but the increase of policing is sought, and the method mentioned.

The proposed possession/trip limits should be simple and clearly defined if implemented. There is confusion in the complexity of this proposal, such as are the Key Angling Fish or the Table Fish separate, or are they combined?

The biggest concern is that the "Working Group" has drafted this document and that all submissions will be "confidentially" reviewed by them and then their recommendation will go to the Minister of Fisheries for his approval and then form the basis for a new management package for recreational fishing. Before the result of the submissions go to the Minister, the public should be informed of the result of the submissions so that we are aware of what is proposed and final comment may be made before it is proceeded with. The ramifications are too far reaching if this proposal is just rubber-stamped by a "working group" and the Minister.
