

Recfishwest report

I arranged for two topics to be placed on the agenda for discussion at the April 2011 Recfishwest Board meeting. Considerable time was spent on both topics.

<u>Recfishwest Website.</u> Seven months have passed since the website went "live" with many issues still unresolved despite many requests. The website is a critical component of communicating with recreational fishers, the general public and other stakeholders. The website is not fulfilling, and in some ways is incapable of fulfilling this critical communications role.

The Board discussed many aspects of the RFW website, and resolved that major changes must be made as soon as possible, plus the website must be made suitable for future needs even if that requires a complete rebuild to proper specifications.

Work should be started early on specifications and requirements for the website; with proper informed consideration, and without pressure and urgency because the priority is to get it right this time.

RFW communications with members, recreational fishers and public.

Recfishwest's Communications Strategy was developed and adopted around April 2010 to recognise RFW's role as the government recognised peak body for recreational fishing. Discussions at the April 2011 Board meeting included:-

- The RFW website has issues and limitations, both function and particularly limited content, which prevent it from delivering the outcomes required by the Communications Strategy.
- Despite significant improvements in country and regional publicity, there have been many missed opportunities by RFW to inform recreational fishers and promote a better understanding of RFW's activities and roles in some very important matters affecting recreational fishing.
- There has been a lack of responses to some valid questions and comments on some web fishing forums. Some replies posted have been confused or confusing, leading to negative perceptions of and comments about RFW.
- RFW members are questioning the lack of actions by RFW to communicate effectively with recreational fishers and the non fishing public on some topics.
- Only the staff of RFW know all the details of RFW activities, and only the staff can
 prepare any summaries. Board members are not informed of some of these activities
 in a timely manner.

Staff need to prepare and publish and publicise an adequate up to date summary of RFW activities, planned, in progress, ongoing and completed, and keep this updated.

Effectively publicising this via the website requires action to fix the website's problems.

The Communications Committee will make recommendations on all actions required to implement the Communications Strategy, and the timetables for such actions.

Notice of Motion to amend State Dry Casting Rules

The following amendment is proposed to the State Dry Casting Rules as adopted at the September 2010 Delegates Council Meeting. The amendment is to paragraph 3.5.3 - Line and Terminal Knots. It is proposed that Rule 3.5.3 be amended by adding "There shall be no knots, splices or joins in the first 85 metres of the main line" to read

"Rule 3.5.3 Line and Terminal Knots. The breaking strain of the main line used is at the discretion of the caster. The gauge of the line shall be of a consistent diameter throughout. There shall be no knots, splices or joins in the first 85 metres of the main line. Any leader used shall comply with Rule 3.5.4. The style or type of knot used to attach any weight, dowel or swivel shall be at the discretion of the caster. Terminal knots used shall not exceed 100 mm in length. The knot length shall be measured from the edge adjacent to any weight, dowel or swivel affixed to the line."

This notice of motion will be debated at the May AAA Delegates meeting and voted at the June meeting.

This change will affect State Dry Casting run each year, on 25 September this year.

It will not affect Club dry casting which is run under the Club' rules, but it will affect any application for a State Dry Casting record which may be cast during a Club event, since WA State records must comply with AAAWA rules.

Club's code of ethics

The maximum speed on beach or tracks shall not exceed 50 km per hour. Members must always drive with caution when there are other people sighted in any location. All vehicles entering or leaving the beach should preserve vegetation at all times and keep to made tracks where ever possible.

Do not litter the beach or campsites. Use rubbish bins when available, or take your rubbish with you to prevent pollution and to protect wildlife

Our Fishery

Take no more than your immediate needs.

Understand and observe all fishing regulations.

Support and encourage activities that restore and enhance fisheries and fish habitats.

Observe the rules of common courtesy on the beach. Try not to overcrowd and leave room for fellow anglers.

Quickly and correctly return unwanted or illegal catch to the water.

Use only legal tackle, attend your gear and value your catch.

Respect the rights of others and treat fish humanely.

Inform and encourage other people to adopt a code of ethics.

The philosophy of "Catch and Release" should be encouraged at all times.

Albany Salmon Holes Easter safety project

Following the recent tragic drowning accident at the Albany Salmon Holes, Andrew Jarvis and friends from the Southern Fish south coast fishing forum based in Albany http://southernfish.9.forumer.com/ with help from the Nathan Drew Foundation organized a roster of local people to have Personal Flotation Devices (PFD) available in the car park at the Salmon Holes for free rental over the Easter weekend.

The Nathan Drew Foundation supplied lists of dos and don'ts for fishing the rocks. One thing which seemed to be missing was the critical topic of the right footwear to use.

Dept of Fisheries supplied info to give out to people fishing there over the weekend so everybody would know how many Salmon they are allowed to keep so no excuses for over fishing. Despite this, some people got caught with too many fish.

On the Friday, there was no one fishing from the rocks and a bit of swell running. There was no need to fish from the rocks anyway, it was a salmon a cast from the beach, with the salmon swimming in the waves 5 meters from the sand at both ends of the beach.

However, later in the weekend when there were no salmon being caught from the beach, some people moved around and fished off the rocks to the left without wearing PFDs, despite the stall offering free use of PFDs and a fair swell pumping through.

It seems when there aren't any fish around it makes people try those dangerous rocks, but it's hard to understand why they wouldn't take a free PFD. It's probably all about not recognising the very real risks, feeling that "it can't (won't) happen to me", but so many people have been wrong and paid the ultimate price.

It must be hard on the people who were involved in the harrowing recovery of previous drowning victims who fell or were washed in off those very same rocks to see people taking unnecessary risks again and again despite all the publicity and attempts to show them the risks and the ways of avoiding many of them.

Challenge the threats to recreational fishing

A new report calls for national campaign to challenge the threats to recreational fishing.

After years of seeing all manner of threats to recreational fishing from fish kills on major rivers, habitat degradation and urban pollution through to unjustified Marine Park lock-outs, the major organisations representing Australia's most popular pastimes have come together by commissioning a report on how anglers across the world have united to save their fisheries and their sport.

Mr Salter, who served as Parliamentary Spokesman for Angling under both the governments of Tony Blair and Gordon Brown has spent three months working on a report for the Boating and Fishing Council of Australia (BFCA) which was formally launched on 14 April.

Key recommendations include:

- That the Commonwealth government be pressed to fund a five yearly comprehensive survey of participation rates in aquatic based wildlife activities, including recreational fishing, and also to determine economic, social and other benefits together with a reliable estimate of employment generated.
- Further research should also be carried out to determine the economic value of specific recreational fisheries to assist the case for some further recreational only designations.
- That an appropriate vehicle be identified to enable the commercial, voluntary, national, regional and specialist parts of the recreational fishing sector to come together to develop a vision for the sport and an Australian Charter for Recreational Fishing.
- That the recreational fishing sector enter into partnerships with like-minded organisations, groups and prominent individuals to prepare a coordinated policy position on Marine Parks and their contribution to sustainable and effective fisheries management. This work to use the emerging UN guidelines and experience from elsewhere and with the intention of re-building community support for scientifically justified marine protection measures and working with government to overhaul their current operation, management and structure.
- That a code of conduct be established in respect of recreational fishing in remaining sanctuary zones or highly protected marine areas which would provide useful data and information, limit fishing methods, and, where appropriate, require total catch and release.
- That restrictions on trolling for pelagic species be lifted in Marine Park areas open to other boating activities.
- As part of the Charter process the recreational fishing sector should adopt a clear statement of environmental objectives, begin promoting habitat restoration projects, seek tougher controls on pollution and poor land management practices and seek to build partnerships with conservation and environmental groups on matters of common concern.
- That discussions begin with all relevant bodies in the recreational fishing sector in Australia to draw up proposals on new representative and funding models to be put to government and that as a matter of priority AFTA and the BFCA begin work to establish a new Australia wide campaigning organisation "Keep Australia Fishing".

Reef Beach Revisited

Some 20 years ago I had the pleasure of an enjoyable and successful field day with Surfcasters at Reef Beach. Hence when this venue was discussed at our general meeting and our FDO, Peet Wessels, advised he wanted to fish Bremer Bay, even though only a small number had nominated to go into this venue I jumped at the chance be responsible for a separate weigh-in and to fish at Reef beach. i.e. Reef Beach revisited.

Went down Thursday and stopped overnight at a Motel. Our daughter Heather has been posted north and had a special remote assignment over the Easter break, so she sent her kids down to Perth. Hence as Sharon wanted to get involved with the kids, I was doing this trip by myself. For such a trip I use my vehicle not only for transport but to live out of for this period. I take lots of gear but no tent.

I thought that I might have a problem finding my way in to Reef Beach (based on memory of 20 years ago) however as advised on the road to Bremer Bay, Reef Beach Road is well signed. The first part of the road was gravel and wide, however this turned into a narrow track which was initially firm sand. On this premise I stopped and let down my tires. Wrong, didn't go far when the track turned to very narrow and lots of rough limestone where the distance was a lot further than I remembered. I had to drive very slowly to ensure no tire damage.

The vehicle needed low pressure in the tires on the last major dune going down to the camp area and beach. I did not meet anyone coming in the opposite direction going in, but on the drive out had two lots of vehicles coming in. Fortunate that just a few metres behind me there was room on the side to pull off the track and let the vehicles through. In summary, long trip in, initially firm sand, then patches of very rough limestone, then softer sand on a hill down when you arrive. Allow at least an hour to get in after leaving the Bremer Bay bitumen road.

Friday. On arrival early morning could not find any Surfcasters. Mark and Wendy had told me they were going down Thursday and would be there when I arrived. Similarly Cookie said he would be there on Friday when I arrived. I decided to do a bit of a look see. Drove a few km down the Beach (east) and came upon a very good looking gutter, outside flanked by a reef 200 metres out. No question, had to try this spot. Set up gear and had two rods in the water.

Very slow at first, most of mid morning to mid afternoon, think I had one hit in this period, then, mid afternoon some action. Did catch and release on some six salmon, all good size. Yep. Reef Beach revisited. Mark had found me in the afternoon and gave me directions to their camp. He and other friends had set up their Taj Mahal area with sleeping tents around. Joined them for the evening meal, then emptied my vehicle and had a good night's sleep.

Saturday. Saturday morning went to the same spot, joined by a few other anglers that had heard I had caught salmon there. Didn't get a touch, although beside me one fish dropped and one fish caught, for a total of between 6 to 8 anglers working this spot. At 11:00 am, back to camp area for sign-on.

Based on what happened on Friday evening, returned to same gutter to start the formal field day competition. Quiet during afternoon, but later afternoon, early evening had three good salmon in the bag and a reasonable skippy. I tried heavy gear for a couple of hours after dark but no takers. So slept in the vehicle overnight while parked on the beach.

Sunday. Sunday morning, again a beautiful sunny day, warm and blue skies. A front had been forecast to come through late afternoon, which subsequently proved correct. It was a great morning on the beach, but no action. Mark had stopped by and advised that he, lan, and some of his fellow fishermen were going to fish the east end of the beach adjacent to a rocky headland.

Hence late morning, decided to go and join them. Of course, travelling by myself, misjudging on a tight slope close to water, I managed to slide off the track and bog myself. However as in most cases, a stranger fishing further up the beach noticed my predicament and gave me a pull out. With the tide on the make, that tends to be a worrying moment until back on firm ground.

This east section of the beach is sheltered by the headland and has an outer reef with inner rocks, weeds banks etc, and is relatively shallow. The fellows were correct, there were salmon. A few salmon would come into the lagoon like area, two or three rods would go off, then they would leave. I had a mixture of large salmon, and a try for small fish resulted in a small success. Initial dropping in a paternoster rig with prawn and blue sardine bait resulted in a 36 cm King George Whiting.

Ongoing, between salmon catch and release or keeping of a couple of big ones I caught a couple more small fish - a Western Rock Blackfish and another small skippy, but not prolific. One of the salmon was my largest weighing in at 5.0kg, gutted and gilled, however estimate would have been close to 7.0 kg as when caught besides being full of roe, it had a whole solid fish of nearly 30 cm in its stomach. It must have been very greedy to take my mulie on a full stomach.

It was great to see all the various anglers tying into quality salmon. My estimate was that most of the salmon that came out of this stretch were 6 kg fish. Ian had chalked up some fish; Mark and Wendy had flogged the water to foam with lures, but no luck.

Late afternoon most anglers returned to camp. I stayed on the beach to do some night fishing and sleep overnight to be on the spot first thing in the morning. Just before dark, the storm came through, rain, heavy but short lived with some lightning and thunder. I tried some night fishing, but no luck.

Monday. Monday morning came through with weather good, cloudy but still warm; shades of summer in the Albany area in April - not expected but great for fishing comfort. I managed another large salmon before the crowds of anglers came down; then a repeat of the previous afternoon. Quiet then all of a sudden two or three rods would go off within seconds of each other; again mostly the larger size salmon.

Mark tried again with lures, still no luck; he then switched to light gear for herring, but no show for these. I also tried with prawn bait, but only undersize salmon trout. During this period lan was finalizing his bag limit of salmon. Later in our fishing period, Mark switched back to using lures for a salmon and got it right. Within a short period he had two good salmon. Wendy kept plugging away, but no such luck.

Meanwhile I had switched from catch and release of salmon to trying for Western Rock Blackfish. Used a weighted bait casting rig to get out over the reef area, but the water was so shallow that immediately snagged up and after losing a couple of rigs switched to using a float with a metre of leader to mulie on a gang of hooks with a trailing no 2 hook. These fish have small mouths and this set-up generally works. Although eventually snagging up with this set-up, did manage to get a few blackfish.

Mid morning came our weigh-in. Some great salmon put across the scales. All commenting we should come back to this venue; a long way to go but very worthwhile.
