Recfishwest AGM and **Election of Board Members** will be held on Friday 24 October 2008 in the Ward Room, at the Fremantle Sailing Club at 7.30pm.

The calling of the State Election five months early has left many things not finished and unable to be finished until a new government is in place.

Examples are three Marine Parks including the Capes, some commercial fishing changes and the West Coast Demersal fishing rule changes.

Recfishwest's "Election Policy on behalf of the recreational fishing community of Western Australia" has been very well received by all political parties and recognized as a very valuable and realistic list of issues.

Effectively, we have no real commitments by any party in response to that list, only one commitment to review the West Coast Rules.

The Liberal Party has only committed to: quote "immediately establish an expert recreational fishing panel to view the Labor Government's ban and evaluate the environmental, social and economic impact of the restrictions, with a view to relaxing the bans" end quote.

Neither Labor nor the National Party has put out any policy or commitment on recreational fishing.

With a new government, there will be many high priority issues to sort out and recreational fishing is not likely to be one of these.

So it will be important to have a strong, professional and active voice for recreational fishing to make sure that it does not get forgotten.

AAA Notices of Motion

As Outlined at September 2008 Delegates Meeting

Motions moved by George Holman, seconded by Terry Fuller as recommended by the State Dry Casting Group of AAAWA. The purpose of these motions to AAAWA delegates is to get approval from AAAWA to present these motions to the National AAA at the Wallaroo Convention in 2009.

Motion 1

Amend AAA National General Competition Rules (March 2008 version) Casting section, rule C.9 (c) from

"(c) Breaking strain of leaders is optional and leaders will be permitted in:-

Event 1. Accuracy

Event 3. Artificial Bait Distance - Teams

Event 5. Artificial Bait Distance – Individuals"

to read

"(c) Breaking strain of ALL leaders must not exceed 40kg, must be of monofilament line, with only one clip, one loop, and/or one swivel to be used. Leaders will be permitted in:-

Event 1. Accuracy

Event 3. Artificial Bait Distance - Teams

Event 5. Artificial Bait Distance – Individuals"

Reason for the proposed amendment: There are far too many variations in rigs being used which have caused arguments over an equal competition. These specifications will ensure equality.

Motion 2

Refer AAA National General Competition Rules (March 2008 version) Casting section, rule C.6

Add the words "Casting order shall be to distance 3, 1, 4 and 2."

so that the rule C.6 will read:-

"C.6 Each competitor shall have two (2) casts for each Event nominated, except Event one (1). In Event one (1), two (2) casts will be allowed at each target. Casting order shall be to distance 3, 1, 4 and 2."

<u>Reason for the proposed addition</u>: This casting order is the standard order used but is not specified in the current rules. The addition is required to overcome any confusion about the casting order.

Motion 3

Refer AAA National By-Laws (Subsidiary Rules of the Australian Anglers Association) Section 13. Records Authority subsection (I) (this is the lower case letter L, not a 1 (one))

Amend / add to the first sentence of Section 13. (1)

"(1) The Committee shall receive and process applications for Drycasting Records cast at National Championships or State Championships. "

to read

"(1) The Committee shall receive and process applications for Drycasting Records cast at National Championships or State Championships or interclub or club event. To achieve a National Casting Record, the casting venue must be registered with the State AAA three (3) months prior to the event. A minimum of ten (10) casters must compete. All measurements must be by steel rule or laser device for accuracy."

<u>Reason for the proposed addition</u>: To make it possible for records cast at properly run and properly managed events other than State or National Championships to be recognised as National casting records.

State Dry Casting Competition:

The upcoming State Dry Casting Competition was discussed and members informed that the oval was booked. There will be a Captains' meeting at 7.45am and a request that all Perpetual Trophies be returned as soon as possible.

G Holman urged all members to complete nomination forms as soon as possible.

P Pekaar informed members that an extra few persons will be attending to assist with the scoring on the day. A sausage sizzle and raffle will be run on the day by SCAC members G Walker and A Thorgersen.

Magic Nissan has again agreed to sponsor the individual trophies, and the medallions have been organised.

Batteries for the two-way radios have been purchased. The SCAC to supply extra radios for the day.
