# Recfishwest report

#### Proposed standardisation and simplification of fishing rules

Further to my previous reports, RFW's comments have been passed to the Department of Fisheries and some significant changes will be made. A further version will be supplied to RFW. Recfishwest will organise public comments on the version proposed by the Department of Fisheries and the Minister. RFW will be free to make public comments as it sees fit and will not necessarily be supporting or recommending acceptance of all the details of those proposals. The challenges include keeping the end result simple, easily understood and supported by fishermen, yet ensuring sustainability which is in every fisherman's long term interests.

#### **Commonwealth North West marine plans and proposals**

The draft Commonwealth North-west Marine Bioregional Plan was released on 23 August 2011. The public comment period closes on Monday 28 November 2011. RFW's draft

#### Commonwealth South West marine plans and proposals

As expected, conservationists have maintained and stepped up their campaigns and are demanding that many more areas be closed to fishing, including the game fishing area at the Rottnest Trench, and are applying considerable political pressure on the Minister.

#### Small grants scheme

A small grants scheme is now available for local recreational fishing projects, with an allocation from recreational fishing licensing revenue. #### Mulloway restocking project

Recfishwest has identified the need to restock mulloway in the metropolitan area as a priority. The West Australian Fish Foundation will hold a Mulloway Pilot Restocking Workshop on 23 September to finalise the details of the project.

#### West Coast Seasonal closures coming up

Pink Snapper spawning season closure Cockburn and Warnbro Sounds from 1 October to 31 January. West Coast seasonal demersal fishing closure from 15 October to 15 December inclusive. This includes prohibiting keeping any demersal fish caught from shore during these periods. West Coast recreational fishing guide has the list of demersal species.

#### RFW Annual General Meeting and election of Board members.

A request has been made for nominations for election to the RFW Board. There are vacancies for 3 public Board members, 3 representatives of associations and 4 regional Board members, all for two year terms. Nominations close on 30 September, and details of the nominees and postal / email voting papers will be issued to RFW members after that. The AGM will be held at 7:30pm on Friday 21 October at Fremantle Sailing Club, Marine Terrace South Fremantle.

#### Fishing clinics instructors required

Recfishwest runs numerous fishing clinics with schools and community groups and this requires instructors to run them. At times clinics have been cancelled or postponed when instructors are not available, so RFW wishes to increase the pool of instructors. Instructors receive payment for running the 2 hour clinics. Please contact Yvette Guy 9246 3366 for more details.

#### **Western Fisheries magazine**

Some of the articles by the Fisheries Research Division in the magazine "Western Fisheries" have been controversial at times, with some strongly criticized by Recfishwest because of the lack of review of the contents. Other articles have been interesting and informative, however the magazine had to be purchased, so access to the articles was limited. The magazine has now ceased publication. The above report was prepared for the September AAAWA Delegates meeting by Recfishwest Board Member for the Australian Anglers Association, Terry Fuller.

#### Mulloway restocking pilot project

As reported in the Recfishwest report, a Mulloway stakeholder workshop discussion was held by the West Australian Fish Foundation on 23 September. Some important background information was supplied as electronic copies or summarised.

- Why mulloway? Dr Andrew Roland, Principal Policy Officer, Recfishwest
- WA restocking background. Greg Jenkins, Director, Australian Centre of Applied Aquaculture Research, (ACCR), Challenger Institute of Technology.

- East Coast mulloway experiences; Dr Matt Taylor, visiting Fellow, School of Biological Earth & Environmental Sciences, University of NSW.
- Presentation of Bryn Farmer's PHD work "Comparisons of the biological and genetic characteristics of Mulloway in different regions of Western Australia." Speaker Dr Alex Hesp, Centre for Fish and Fisheries Research, School of Biological Sciences, Murdoch University.

**Objects:-** to develop a pilot restocking plan that will restock enough fish to provide measurable outcomes in the lower West Coast to enable details for any future restocking program to be determined. The pilot project would use broodstock from the lower West Coast.

The workshop will set out to determine guidelines for this pilot study, which will enable the required information to be obtained from the project, while at the same time identify any key areas of management protocols required to be provided to ensure the success of the project.

Main questions posed to the workshop were:-

- 1. Based upon using broodstock taken from the release area, what level of genetic assessment of broodstock and progeny is appropriate to confirm appropriate hatchery genetic transfer?
- 2. What would be the most effective size, numbers of fish and release strategies to achieve, measurable project outcomes?
- 3. What are the most appropriate monitoring methods? (genetic, population, fishery?)
- 4. What fisheries management issues may arise, and how can they be addressed?
- 5. Quantitative (or qualitative) targets against which to measure success?
- 6. How can community involvement in the project be optimised?
- 7. What educational/training opportunities can the project provide?

These questions lead to many important points which need investigation and resolution. Suffice to say it is not as simple as breeding some mulloway (currently well within the capabilities of ACCR in Fremantle and others), and putting them into the water somewhere.

The fishing was a hard slog, fighting wind, seaweed and a strong side wash. Sarah was the first one to break the ice with a little Sand Whiting. She soon afterwards got stuck into the Tailor, first losing one at her feet and then landed a beauty.

Shane not wanting to be outdone by his ever improving daughter then got his act together and landed a Herring, Flathead and a beautiful Greenback Tailor of 1.4 kg.

Sabby also kept on fighting admirably and was rewarded with 3 good Tailor.

Martin on the other hand was the only one who had consistent catches throughout the day. He landed a Tailor every hour exactly on the hour. We then put a "curse" on him and that was the last of his good run. Sandra also kept on fighting and managed a Flounder and Flathead for her efforts. She said how much she enjoyed her new rod and tried so hard for a Tailor, but no cigar. I on the other hand did not even have a bite till the twilight hour. Finally I landed 3 Tailor in quick succession and then the conditions just got too hard and we called it an early night.

During the night conditions really got bad and the wind became very nasty. Luckily we all secured most of our gear before we went to bed, but by day break it was clear that some items were gone. During a little break in the rain I went for a quick walk down the beach to recover a lost table and chairs. During this time I did notice two figures a little bit further south who tried to put a line in the water. I could see that they are not going to have any luck, as they were blown back over the dunes quicker than they have arrived.

The best scale fish section was won by Shane Wignell with a Tailor of 1.4 kg.

Best bag of scale fish was caught by George Holman with a bag of 4.42 kg. Best shark prize also goes to George Holman with a 5.48 kg Bronze Whaler Shark. George also won the best bag including shark section with a bag of 9.9 kg. Well done to all section winners.

Our next Field day is over the long week end in October, starting on Friday the 28th and ending on Sunday the 30th. The boundaries are between Kalbarri and Horrocks. Indications are that most people plan on fishing Lucky Bay and Wagoe with a few opting for Kalbarri. The weigh in will be at the Wagoe Chalets on Sunday 10 am. Wagoe have chalets and camping spots with easy and convenient access to Wagoe Beach and Lucky Bay. Our Chalet has a few spare bunks available and you are most welcome to share, first come first served. Remember it is a long week end, so book early to avoid disappointment.

#### Peter Osborne's notes on September Field Day

Arriving at Hill River late Friday afternoon, met up with John Crompton, Ray Walker, Melvin Wee and applicant Christopher Stickells.

They confirmed with me my earlier observation: lots of weed. They were at a clearing about half a kilometre south of the Hill River mouth. I went up and looked at my favourite spot right at the mouth, didn't look good - weed and the mouth itself was narrow and looked close to having the river break through.

So decided to go back and joint the crowd as the water they assessed had less weed and looked fishable. Ray had set up his Taj Mahal camper trailer, a good base, out of the wind. Looking at the water there confirmed their observations: wind waves as about 15 – 18 knots winds and no swell, some weed but looked fishable.

A little before 5 pm Friday we all trooped down over the dune and set up for fishing. Wind had increased slightly in strength but with 112/150 gram sinkers this gave a reasonable cast into the NW wind and sand holding power. With rod held high it took a while for line to catch weed and require a wind in and clear a clump of weed.

A few tailor and a couple of herring came in but we only fished to about 7 pm then back to the Taj Mahal for a drink and cook up. Weather held off except wind continued for a few more hours, but getting up at 5:30am the following morning and having breakfast etc, found the wind was only a slight NE wind, so gave comfortable conditions, hence had a line in the water about 6 am.

Still some weed about but manageable and a few tailor started to come slowly but consistently. One of our visitors, Christopher Stickells was under horse powered with his fishing gear for the conditions encountered so he had trouble casting out over the shoreline weed and getting to the fish. So I set up one of my rods and got Chris on the right track. Longer rod with heavier line of 10 kg, so when pulling in a bunch of weed, the line did not break.

With a slight wind to our backs, while still some weed, it was reasonably comfortable fishing. Christopher put in some effort and it wasn't long before he had his first ever tailor, followed by some herring. Hope to see Chris get lots more. With the right venue and weather, some practise at distance casting, he should be able to get a bag of tailor.

Late morning we went to the sign on and met the rest of the participants, some 18 persons, and discussions was about where to fish given the weed problem so members spread out from Black Point to Jurien. I returned to the Taj Mahal campsite and by a little after mid day the team there were all fishing.

The weather conditions changed with the wind shifting around to the NW and more weed moving along the shoreline, but despite hard fishing and only a couple of flathead and herring coming in nothing happened all afternoon.

Except: The story of Ray versus ray (i.e. Ray the human kind and ray the sea animal.) Mid afternoon, we looked up the beach and saw Ray with his rod bent nearly double. It didn't take long to work out he was not pulling in a lump of weed. Ray was well set up with a 10 wrap rod, an Alvey reel fully loaded with 30+ line so he thought he could manage this fish. After numerous runs further out to sea, then stopping and sucking on the bottom by the whatever, Ray started to realize he was fighting a very large ray and a positive outcome was not so likely.

After nearly an hour, continually twanging the line when the ray played at being a suction cap, Ray decided he was not going to win. He tried a tug of war by walking up the beach to the top of the dune, to break the line and even this didn't work. So much line out and being monofilament, it just stretched. The only way Ray could part company with ray was to cut the line. Game over and ray won and Ray lost. Ray's arms were 2 inches longer and he needed to relax a while before getting back to fishing.

A few tailor caught just before/after sunset, but very sparse and fishing got harder with NW winds, at least 20 knots, and some clumps of weed getting very large. Some of us fished for a few hours after dark, but nothing happened. Between us we reckon our team pulled in at least 20 tons of weed.

Then up to camp again, good hot meal etc with anticipation of getting up early and enjoying conditions with fish on the bite, as we had on Saturday morning. What a misconception, I was snug as a bug in a rug and slept through till morning, but by 1 am the wind had increased to at least 30 knots and the Taj Mahal had started to disassemble.

Fellows had to get up and rework pegs etc. I woke up at 5:20 am, had breakfast, recognized the wind was now extremely strong, walked over the dune to where I had left my fishing gear etc, and disaster. The sea was foam from wind waves. The wind must have been at least 40 knots, probably gusting to 50 knots, and of course the weed was still there. My gear was blown over, with sand through everything. A table I had was 50 metres away up near the top of a sand dune. Tried a couple of casts and confirmed what I thought, "unfishable".

Went back to the Taj Mahal to see them fighting to hold things together and to fold and packup camp. Of course by this time it was raining cats and dogs. Discussion on return to weighin or go straight home, however Peet Wessels and others came down the track and confirmed to meet us at the car park and abandon the fishing on Sunday. On meeting there, about 8 am while we were blowing up tires, discussion was that it was so windy, the scales could not take a reading, hence the decision was to hold separate weigh-ins at George Holman's residence for north siders and Peet Wessels' for those with inland residences.

Considering the conditions, I think I can say with a span of nearly 30 years of fishing with Surfcasters it was one of the worst weather conditions encountered on a field day. Despite this most people had some fish.

#### **Report on AAA National Convention**

Once the aftermath of the previous National Convention and Angling Championships at Wallaroo in South Australia was sorted out, positive planning was put in place to organize a representative group to attend the South West Rocks Convention in New South Wales conducted from 26 July to the 11 August 2011.

Expressions of interest were called for in late 2010 and as a result 10 people put their names forward. They were;

Men's Peter Pekaar, Keith Heaney, Jeff Hewton and Rhys Jones.

Ladies Marcia Pekaar.

Veterans Bob Henderson, Alan Jones, Mal Head, Gary Gildersleeves and George Holman.

This was great to see. There is a considerable cost in time and money to attend these Conventions and Angling Championships and travel 5000 kilometres and to represent the WA Division and Western Australia.

Our AAAWA President, John Curtis also travelled over for the Convention to attend the Annual General Meeting, Federal Executive Meeting, Special General Meeting and a Special Meeting and to forward plan for the future of the National Division and Conventions. These meetings were time consuming and detailed and he had the support of Senior Vice President George Holman and Junior Vice President Peter Pekaar and his wife Marcia Pekaar were also present at these meetings as observers.

John made a brief presentation to the AGM on Strategic Planning and this is to be followed up at the Mid Term meeting in Caloundra next year. He also presented a very detailed President's Report for the final Convention Meeting which was positively received by all attending. He made with a commitment from the Western Australian Division to possibly conduct a National Carnival and Angling Championship in Western Australia in four or six years time. The next Convention and Angling Championship is to be held in Caloundra Queensland in 2013

There were several planning meetings held for the group going away to plan their accommodation, airfares and rod transport.

Bob Henderson was elected to the position of State Captain as he and his wife Leone travelled over early and planned their itinerary to be present for the full period of the Convention. Bob did a good job being present at the Official Opening and Flag Raising ceremony, also attending the Civic Reception on behalf of the WA Division. He also attended all of the team meetings and had a deal of input in the organizing of the Dry Casting events. Our thanks go to Bob for the work that he did.

We also had a social night with the New Zealand contingent at the South West Rocks Country Club which was very enjoyable. Something we look forward to each Convention.

As Port Macquarie was where Keith Heaney was raised, he also stayed for the duration of the Convention and he and Bob Henderson competed in all or most of the offshore, beach and estuary events as well as the casting. Peter Pekaar and George Holman also fished an estuary event as well.

**Dry Casting.** The main focus of the group who travelled was the Dry Casting events, which were held on Monday 8 and Tuesday 9 of August and were held on the ovals alongside of the Port Macquarie Airport. Our accommodation for the main group was within walking distance of the casting grounds and was first class.

It was pleasing to see that the WA contingent 'roll up their sleeves' and help the organizing group from New South Wales to run the casting event by going out and helping to mark the casts. This was later acknowledged by the NSW hosts.

There were 166 casters competing. Conditions were a little damp, although the weather on the whole was good. The wind was not a large factor but there was some very healthy distances achieved.

**Results.** Peter Pekaar achieved the longest cast in the Individual Artificial Bait event with a distance of 148.70 metres and ran third in Team Artificial Bait overall and also Individual 112 gram Distance (longest 162.67 metres).

Marcia Pekaar ran 4th overall in the Ladies events and had the 100% in the 56 gram Distance. She cast very well overall.

Rhys Jones finished 5th overall in the Men's Division in a field of 62 and scored 100% in the Double Handed accuracy with 146 out of 200. A break-off in the 112 gram distance event cost him first place overall.

Gary Gildersleeves finished third in the Individual Artificial Bait distance and achieved 100% in the Double Handed Accuracy event in the Veterans Division. Out of the possible score of 25 points per cast he had 4 x 23, and 3 x 24 and on his last cast scored a 7 for a total of 171. He only needed 13 or better to beat his own National Record of 176 out of 200. Gary finished third out of a field of 51 casters overall in the Veterans and Bob Henderson was fourth.

In the Veterans Division, George Holman finished 2nd in the Teams 56 gram event, third in the Teams Artificial Bait and second in the 112 gram Individual distance (longest cast 159.90 metres).

The Veterans Men's Team ran a creditable 2nd overall.

All Western Australia's casters finished in the top group in each section and were first class representatives of our State, worked well together and enjoyed the camaraderie and the experience and are looking forward to Caloundra in Queensland in two years time.

**Presentations.** Nine people from Western Australia stayed for the Presentation Night at the conclusion of the Carnival at which George Holman was awarded a Certificate of Honour. This award is the highest award an individual can receive from the National Body and was the reward for many years of service to recreational angling at a Club, State and National level.

The location of the Championships and the efficient running of this Carnival was a credit to the New South Wales Division and everyone present was full of praise for the organizers of the event.

The Western Australian Division appreciates the support of the Department of Sport and Recreation and Recfishwest.

All participants who attended this event are looking forward to attending the next National Convention and Angling Championships to be held at Caloundra in Queensland in 2013.

#### My account of the AAA Nationals

On 28 July 2011, the day before we were due to fly to New South Wales to compete in the 32nd Angling Convention at Port Macquarie, we ordered a taxi for 6.30am, to get us to the airport for 7am. We invited George Holman to spend the night at our place as we live a lot closer to the airport than he does. When he phoned the taxi company, Pete carefully explained to the operator that we needed a maxi taxi or similar vehicle as there were three adults travelling and we had rod tubes amongst our general luggage.

We slept well that night believing all would run smoothly the next day. Wrong. The taxi was late so Pete called the taxi company to see where it was. He was told that taxis were heavily booked today and we would just have to wait. Finally, the taxi arrived but it was a station wagon and it had a cage which could not be removed to allow the rods to fit. Goodbye taxi. The driver offered to phone his home base and order us a suitable taxi but he was not confident of them being able to fulfill our request.

Once on board, the flight was speedy and we arrived at 2.15pm local time. We quickly found food for the fellas and boarded the plane to Port Macquarie. We had to get a bus across the tarmac to our plane – a jet link.

**Saturday, 30 July 2011.** We had a delightful breakfast at the Barracks Motel. We then drove to see our accommodation at the Village Resort, just 200m from the casting grounds. Next it was off to Jeuel Mortel's place (Keith Heaney's mother) to see our rods. Jeuel and her husband, Fred, had offered to take possession of the rods when they were transported over and attended to repairing the damaged rod tube. There was not too much damage to the rods, but what damage had been done was claimable on the insurance we took out.

Keith, Marlin and Leanne greeted us at Jeuel's and we stayed and chatted a while. It rained a little about halfway through the day's event but those of us who had wet weather gear didn't suffer much. Everyone else was able to shelter under marquees and/or in cars. Peter and I volunteered to help with scoring in between my group's casting as the men finished before us. The theodolite being used was very useful as it consisted of just a small rod to hold as a marker rather than the large board we use at club casting. Using the radios and loud speaker/microphone was also beneficial for all concerned. The atmosphere at today's event was very jovial.

Wednesday, 10 August 2011. We drove to SW Rocks via Kempsey where we had a coffee and sandwich before a quick walk around town before making our way north, enjoying the scenery and marveling at the cows grazing so close to a main road, the Pacific Highway. We booked into the Costa Rica motel again. That night George, Gary and Jeff chose to eat at the Country Club whilst Pete and I dined at the motel restaurant. Pete did the right thing and

## Help speed up dry casting

In September we had 26 casters, which was a great attendance, but the price of having such numbers and the mix of people was that casting took a long time to finish. Why? What can be done?

Well, there were 3 Mini Juniors, I young Junior and 3 visitors. All these needed a lot of help with their casting and also are not able to help organise or run the casting. Some people had health problems and weren't able to do as much as they might normally do. But that still

leaves lots of people, some of whom worked very hard but without as much help as should be provided.

Dry casting is advertised as the place to learn how to cast and a great social morning. However, the teaching isn't always shared as well as it might be, and teaching new comers can take a lot of time which cannot be spared if it starts too late and interferes with the competition casting which is the main reason for the morning.

And yes, socialising is one of the great benefits of the dry casting days but getting through the casts must take precedence. You can still socialise but please help run the casting as well.

Looking at what happens and doesn't happen and maybe should happen at these dry casting mornings, here are some suggestions which will help the morning run more smoothly and quickly. Mainly these are aimed at casters being ready to cast as soon as possible after the previous caster, and markers/scorers being ready as soon as the next caster has stepped up.

**Times.** Everyone get there earlier. A late start means a late finish.

Everyone help with set up of the casting courts and flags before practice, and with clearing the courts and flags afterwards.

Able bodied adults will be required to do some marking and scoring to share that load.

**Preparation.** Check all your gear well before the day and have ready everything you need.

If necessary, go to a park, set up your gear and have some practice casts. Casting day is not the day to be puzzling out what to do or what gear to use.

If you are not sure about something, first check the Competition Rules, then ask someone.

Learn to tie the knots you need - practice, practice, practice. The Uni-knot CAN be tied in the dark or with eyes closed, so you can do it in under a minute with your eyes open. See the article "How to tie a Uniknot" with photos on page 14 of the January 2010 Reel Talk. It's on the Club website.

Have spare pre-tied rigs with you at the casting area, or ready in your vehicle.

**Be ready to cast.** Take note of the casting order and be ready to have your cast without being called. If called, please move quickly.

If you need some time to set up your rod and reel and the drop etc before you cast, do as much of that as possible while waiting for the previous caster – that is BEFORE moving to the casting position.

Don't wander away from the casting area, unless it is urgent and then preferably when there is some time before your next cast and you can and will be back in time. Otherwise tell someone so that the casting order can be changed.

Watch the markers, don't cast when they are not watching, but then cast as soon as they are off the court and watching.

**Finding the weight in distance casts.** Help keep the markers informed and where they should look to find your weight.

Watch where your cast goes and get someone to tell the markers where to look – left, center or right, near the ropes, short or long, out of bounds left or right, break off, or whatever.

Watch other people's casts and tell them where their cast went or where the weight landed if you can.

**Scoring.** Help with measuring and writing down the distance scores, or whatever else you are capable of. The laser measurer is really easy to use.

Once your cast is finished, move well to the right or left of the casting position, and backwards away from the casting line, and get ready to wind in as soon as the markers have marked your cast and freed your weight.

Please don't walk or stand in between the laser measurer and the markers.

Above all, please don't leave it all to that Mr "Someone Else".

#### Markers.

Move quickly off the court or away from the target.

Watch the casters and be ready for the next cast.

Use the radios and be guided where to look for the weight.




