The April Meeting of the Club will be held on Wednesday, 9th April 1958 at the National Fitness Council, 50 James St. Perth commencing at 8 p.m. sharp.

FIELD DAY: Nineteen enthusiasts made the journey to Garden Island on the weekend 15/16th March. Conditions were excellent except for a light nor-wester which came in during the late afternoon, bringing with it some low, dark, dirty looking clouds, the appearance of which became more ominous as the evening were on, and culminated during the spooky hours with a short brisk shower.

The optomists were spread over a long stretch of coastline, extending from the pool south of the track to "Eackhouse Blockhouse"

at the northern end. It was possibly one of the bleakest excursions ever undertaken to the Island.
