DRY CASTING - 8TH MARCH, 1964

20 members, 4 juniors and 2 prospective members turned up to Floreat Park Oval on a day when the temperature soared to 103° so naturally the keg was well received by all - even one small blow-in who could hardly wait for us to tap it!

Just after our early start - 9 a.m. - a young lad arrived and informed us that the scheduled cricket match was cancelled however I think everyone appreciated getting away early.

Although Norm Clark's reel sounded as if he had half the beach in it, he eventually took top honours in the Level Line Distance event with 288 - 167 - 455 and Doug Talbot with three penalties still took second place with 257 - 180 - 437. Norm and Doug had their handicaps reduced, Norm by 5 and Doug by 8. Bill Bridger only got away two casts but they were the longest for the day 419ft. and 390ft. Bad luck Bill.

The Blue target in the D.H. Accuracy event seemed to upset most casters as only 14 scoring casts out of 40 were recorded by seniors. This target was 78 yards distant. Perhaps it was because we had no time for a practise cast. Bob Lilly was one who scored both casts at this target and took top marks in this event with 57/80. Noel Knight scored a bull at 78 yards but missed his second and was equal second with Bill Bridger, scoring all 4 casts with 51/80 and Bob Tichbon was third with 41/80. Both Bob Lilly and Bill Bridger scored with all four casts.

The record of 31/40 held by Alan Bunnett was broken by Bob Jensen by one 32/40 - nice casting Bob. Alan Bunnett with 27/40 was second and Bob Tucker was third with 26/40.

The first casting competition to be decided was the Single Handed Distance in which Bob Tucker was never headed. Bob's final cast of 222ft. gave him first place with 965 points, Noel Knight with 211ft. was second with 855 points while Bob Lilly 192ft., 852 points was third.

JUNIOR SECTION

Ken, Rick and Don were there again and young Noel Knight had a shot at the Single Hander. Rick won the Level Line Distance event with 243 - 169 - 412 and also the D.H. Accuracy event with 55/80. Don won the S.H. Accuracy with 26/40.

FIELD DAY - GARDEN ISLAND - 14TH & 15TH MARCH, 1964.

Weather conditions :- Westerly winds approximately 15 knots - quite a welcome relief after the run of easterlies over the last fortnight or so - with a good chop on the water. The beaches all appeared in good condition but the Tailor were again in short supply and all captures were well earned. 34 members, 4 juniors, 3 visitors and 2 junior visitors made up a fair attendance of 43.

Quite a number of lads headed off southwards some of whom were Arch Tickle, Hal Neil, Ted Ellis, Ron McQueen, Don Beadon, Mike Lawson, Allan Horton, Ken Jones, Bob Tichbon, Lofty Griffiths and Doug Newton and his lads but without a great deal of success. Bob Klein, Ron Kildahl, Phil Neri and myself headed North to the third bay, where, after an early swim we picked our positions and awaited the arrival of the 2.00 boat. We were joined eventually by Bob and Rick Jensen, Ken Hunt together with Norm Giles who moved a little further north to his favourite spot. This proved a wise move as it turned out as Norm weighed in some good sized Tailor, one of which took off the heaviest scale fish award.

Bob Jensen struck a purple patch for a while when he appeared to be landing a fish with every cast and young Rick and Ken also had a brief run when they landed several Tailor. Closer to our party the fishing was very slow with only an odd Tailor, although Ron Kildahl livened things up when he tied into a Blue Whaler Shark which gave a good fight for about 15 minutes until Bob Klein did the honours with the gaff. Unfortunately it only weighed in at 14lb., which was less than the minimum for that section so Ron's long walk back to the hut was in vain. After a quick cuppa, he headed back to the beach to find that Bob Klein had tangled with another larger shark but after a tussle the shark won and section 4 still remains vacant.

Back at the hut, having enjoyed a brew of tea and a natter, it was early to bed ready for the mornings fishing. First away was Bob Jensen's party, closely followed by Norm Clark, George Greenham, Hal Neil and myself. After selecting our positions we returned to the fray but the Tailor were not co-operating although George Greenham and Norm Clark caught a couple and Bob Jensen one.

Meanwhile Phil Neri was chasing the Herring down south and eventually bagged a dozen or so. Several anglers were observed using small rigs from the beach with mullet strip with some degree of success and a variation of bait could prove more fruitful.

And so came time for the weigh in and time for the truck to arrive back from the north end. The variety of fish caught in this area amazed everyone - good sized Skippy, Herring, Flathead, Flounder and Pike as well as the usual Mulloway and Tailor. Visitor W. Schaaf caught some excellent Flathead, two of which weighed 4lb. and 3lb. and Hugh Gregory, Bob Tucker, Gerry Windus, Ian McLennan, Ron McQueen, Jack Harvey and Don Bridger all had a share of fish to weigh in.

On the truck trip back, Ken Jones lost his black and gold beanie so if anyone is making the trip to the north end and picks it up Ken would be very appreciative. Whilst on the lost and found department I am in possession of Ken Hunt's cardigan and he can obtain same from 380 Lennard Street.

Special mention must be made of the trolley built by Lofty Griffiths and Doug Newton, complete with rubber tyres and ball bearings, it runs very smoothly and handles all their gear comfortably.

After several months at local venues, it was an enjoyable outing to the Island and my congratulations go to the award winners. Many thanks for the assistance given, especially by George Greenham with the camera and Don Beadon with the huge broom - cleaning up after us makes it easier to return in the future. As we return to this venue next month, here's hoping for a good roll up.

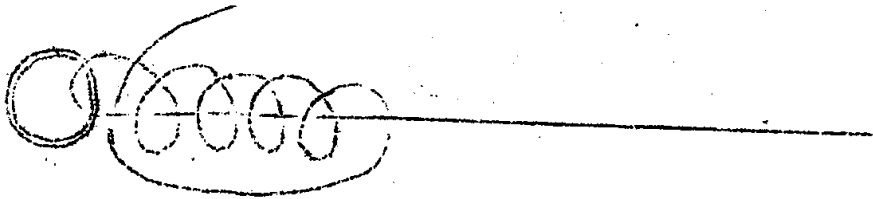

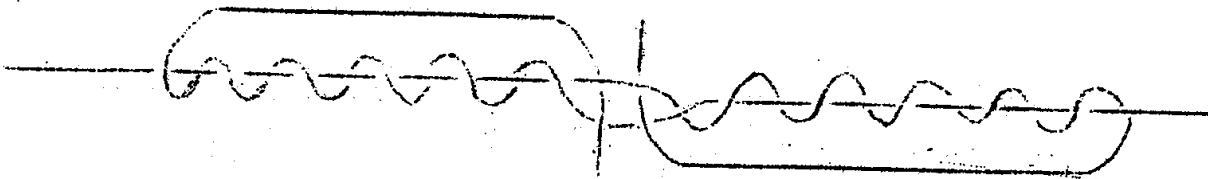
KNOTS FOR NYLON

Since the inception of nylon fishing lines, many of the anglers problems have been overcome, but as with most things there arises a snag. When a nylon line is stretched and wet it becomes smaller in diameter and slippery, hence many knots will not hold in these conditions. Following are several common knots which it is hoped may help anglers with their more common rigs.

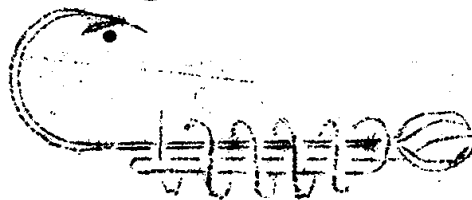
The four-turn half blood knot to tie on a ring or swivel:-



The blood knot for joining two lines:-



One method of tieing on a hook:-



All these knots can be pulled tight and the end cut off fairly close.
