DRYCASTING - 7TH MARCH, 1965

Only 17 seniors and one junior turned out to participate in our casting at Floreat Park Oval. Norm Giles and Jack Harvey also came along to add their moral support, even though the day was warm we couldn't knock the ginger beer over so next month members would be well advised to bring their own drink if needed.

In the Level Line Distance event although Bill Bridger put down three casts over 400 ft. - the longest 410ft. - he didn't catch his handicap. This event was won by Norm Clark casting well with 322 - 126 - 448, "Snow" Tate one point behind with 304 - 143 - 447 was second and I took third place one point behind "Snow" 300 - 146 - 446 (serves me right for putting one outside). An interesting note - only three points separated six members, R. Tucker, A. Bunnett and W. Bridger each scoring 34 points in this event.

Nine members scored all four casts in the D.H. Accuracy event and A. Bunnett, N. Clark and R. Tucker each recorded a bull. Norm also recorded a near miss as did Bill Utting. Allan Bunnett with 60/80 won this event and Bob Tucker 58/80 a close second. It was nice to see Ken Hunt third with 55/80.

Bob Tucker, Bill Utting and myself scored with all four casts in the S.H. Accuracy while Bill Bridger and Mick Dawson scored a bull. This event was won by R. Tucker 28/40, Mick Dawson was second with 24/40 and I took third place with 21/40.

Don Bridger was the only junior present and his scores were 62/80 in the D.H. and 17/40 in the S.H. Accuracy.

FIELD DAY - ROTTNES - 13TH & 14TH MARCH, 1965

This venue was an outstanding success even though the weather was extremely hot and humid. The weigh in of scale fish exceeded 500lb., and compared favourably with our best haul of the year at the Jurien Bay venue.

27 senior members, 4 juniors and two visitors made up a total of 31 attending the venue. Weather conditions were easterly winds, calm seas and temperature over the 100 on the island. The wise members took ice boxes as quite a few fish went off - though now we know a little more of the facilities available we will take measures to avoid this happening in future.

After a pleasant trip across to the island I was met on the jetty by the foreman who provided two vehicles - one for gear and one for members. Having loaded up we sped off for the West End, depositing one party including myself with Club scales, first aid box etc. at Strickland Bay while the balance of members carried on to the West End to fish the reefs around Radar. I was pleased to see our good friend Vic Davis and young Victor along on the venue also Mike Dawson and new member Ron Mansfield.

Vic. showed us some likely looking bays and our party were soon on the beach picking out suitable camping sites and promising channels to fish. A. Ticklie, A. Horton, W. Bridger and young Don, G. Hampton and Steven and Allan Bunnett walked further around the bay while Ron Kildahl and myself remained close to the track with P. McQueen and Mike Dawson. Vic's large ice box was a great help for some of the lads to store their fish in the hot conditions. Ron and I did a tour of the south bays while Vic and his son must have covered about four miles each side using their flick rods, spinning as they went along and quite successfully too.

During the afternoon quite a few of the lads caught skippies and several rays were caught in the bays - Bill Bridger catching his share. Ron and I caught a couple of Skips. but then they just disappeared. As the evening approached we all prepared to do battle, hoping for a sea breeze which did not eventuate. The Tailor were very slow although Allan Bunnett landed a 27½lb. Bronze Whaler, damaging the spool of his reel in the process. Bill Bridger landed

a 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Shark and Arch. Ticklie was unlucky to lose a good sized shark right at his feet.

Most of the lads fished till around 10 p.m. before retiring. Several Tailor and Skips. were caught during the evening and Ron McQueen landed an 8lb. Salmon which apparently was just a straggler. Came the dawn and once again we were faced with calm seas and low tides with fishing very quiet - apparently a sea breeze is necessary to stir the fish along in this area. Several King George Whiting were caught including a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  pounder by A. Horton and my 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  pounder. Among some other nice fish was a 2lb. plus Skipper by Ron Kildahl.

Around 1 p.m. we carried out the weigh in, Vic's bag of 31lb. cleaned including an 8lb. Salmon being the best. Most of our party enjoyed a swim to cool off while waiting for the truck from the West End. Shortly after two o'clock we carried the gear up to the main road and decided to hold the weigh in on the truck. We were staggered at the sight of the captures that were produced, and with Ron checking the weights and myself on the figures we were soon on the job. All varieties of our beach fish were caught from the West End, the lack of sea breeze enabling the lads to venture out on the many reefs in the area. Some excellent captures were recorded by Bob Tucker, Eric Sullivan, Don Talbot and Bill Utting, while Don Webb's 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Salmon was a beauty. Bob Lilly's effort catching a 30lb. Bronze Whaler while ballooning off the reef was outstanding. Bill Utting weighed in two Salmon 9 and 8lb., while "Snow" Tate and Don Talbot each captured a 5lb. Tailor. All fish were of good size many of the Tailor being 2 to 4lb. and over, and Eric Sullivan included 3 Salmon in his capture of 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. to take off the heaviest bag. The pity of the venue was the number of fish spoilt by being kept uncleared too long in the hot weather and it is obvious that two sets of scales will be required on this venue in future. Ice boxes are a necessity although the cooler weather would help in this regard later in the year. All members who attended the West End were delighted with the general conditions although in winter conditions the area would be unfishable and other areas such as Ricey Beach could show promise.

Having completed the weigh in and repacked the truck we headed for the settlement for a little shade and a cool drink and how we needed it! After loading our gear on the Islander we could finally



relax and discuss the venue. The vessel appeared to be heavily loaded and we were thankful for calm seas for the journey home.

So closed a busy, very hot and successful Field Day and my congratulations to the award winners. Many thanks to all members who assisted on the venue especially Ron Kildahl who acted as my right hand man in Norm Clark's absence.

A couple of points for the next Field Day at Garden Island on 24th and 25th April - note a week later than usual because of Easter. Boat departs Palm Beach at 11.45 a.m. and 2 p.m. Saturday returning 10 a.m. Sunday, fares are 8/- seniors and 4/- juniors. Club fees are 1/- register, 2/- sweep. The minimum fee for the hut is now £3. 3. 0. so I will require sufficient members to cover costs and all names must be with me at next General Meeting. Weigh in at 8 a.m. ~~and~~ 9 a.m. and please everyone have their name clearly marked on their gear.
