During the March meeting of the above Association a good deal of correspondence was dealt with in a very efficient manner by the new Secretary, Mr. Peter Beesen, who will be an asset to the Association with all the forthcoming event.

Murray Pope, the F.D.O. for the Preston Tournament, gave his report and for those interested, here are a few figures:-891 competitors, consisting of 609 open; 70 women; 212 juniors; 321 weighed in for a total of 489.8 kilograms and a total of 2501 fish.

Roy Lundy gave a comprehensive drycasting report on the forthcoming State Championships, the first of which will be held at Wordsworth Oval, Corner of Wordsworth Ave. and Alexander Drive, behind the hockey grounds (west end). The official starting time will be 9.00a.m. but casters are asked to be present early as the teams draw will be at 8.30a.m. and all entries must be lodged and payed at this time. Fee is \$1.50 for open mens; \$1.50 for women; 50c for juniors. A junior shall be under 17 as at 30th November, 1974. The teams events will be concluded first and then the open events will follow. Should members and time necessitate, a lunch break will be taken from 12.00 - 1.00p.m. and members are therefore asked to bring their lunch with them.

We hope to see as many Surfcasters there as possible and hope some will offer their services as officials and markers during the day (contact Roy Lundy). See you all there.

The first fish-off for State selection in beach and estuary teams will be held at Easter at Walpols. Beach fishing commences at 3.00p.m. on Good Friday and finishes at 10.00a.m. on Saturday; Estuary commences at 2.00p.m. on Sunday and finishes at 8.00p.m. that day. Entries will be taken at the club rooms down a short street to the left behind the hotel.
