It is the Field Day Officer's duty to inform the committee of any anglers who fail to attend the weigh-in. It is the committee's duty to decide what action is to be taken.

Disputes may be taken to the committee.

Entries for Game Fish Badge, Club Records and Open Fishing Competitions must be lodged with the recorder within 30 days of capture.

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT APRIL 1989

The attendance at the March General Meeting started off quietly but improved to a respectable level as the evening progressed. Healthy discussion was had on a number of topics including field days, drycasting, social functions and attendances across the spectrum. Some useful suggestions were put forward and some of these I will mention. The instructional period was the sixth in a series of videos on fishing and was enjoyed by all present. Special thanks once again to Eric Bombardieri for supplying the video and the television.

The most notable achievements for the month was that of Sharon and Peter Osborne. Sharon won the Australian Women's Drycasting Championship and Peter won the Open Drycasting Championship at the recent A.A.A. Australian Carnival at Warrambool in Victoria. In a postcard that Sharon sent to me she summed up the conditions as "real shades of Ballina":- rain, rain and more rain and this makes their achievements even more meritorious.

I noted how Sharon signed her card:- Sharon (& Peter)!!!

Apparently our new rods had a lot to do with the results.

The telephone book deliveries have been finalized and the problem of dates etc resolve. Thanks in particular to Ian Cook, Lee and Nella Clifton and Eric Parker for their work and to all the other helpers but if we are to continue to reap the benefits of this activity (we all share in the rewards) it means that we all have to share the work load. Give it some thought!

No response this month (not a name) as to how many and what size T-shirts members would like to order. Again give it some thought.

Out of the General Meeting has come a suggestion from our Drycasting Officer that we should do away with percentages and go for straight totals for each event retaining the 20 metre bonus cast for the ladies. This is to make the job easier for the organizers and we would be more likely to retain our workers.

On the Attendance side it is felt that to encourage members to attend our meetings so that they can contribute to the club's activities a bonus points system be introduced. If a members attends the May General Meeting and the field day he would get a bonus of 10 points. The same would apply if he attended the drycasting for that month. If he does not attend the General Meeting he would be ineligible for those points. If he attends the meeting but no events...no points. The points can be only awarded to the month he attends the meeting. There will be no accumulation of points per month.

With field days the indication was that all long weekends be used, even if one or two of them be open venues with either open boundaries or limited boundaries. Another suggestion was that long venue (ie Esperance, Rottnest or Bluff Creek ) be nominated and the other months be left open and decided upon by members at that months meeting. This will also have the effect of better attendances at the meeting because all in attendance will have a say as to where we are going and recent intelligence can be used (in regards to where the fish are). Members who don't attend will need to ring the F.D.O. or a committee member to find out where that particular field day is to be held.

Remember the 6th May is a fun night at Cliftons. Details are elsewhere in this magazine.

Start getting your crews together for the Annual Dinner Dance to be held at Le Mirage on Saturday, June 4th 1989.

Jim Strong has donated a perpetual trophy for the clubman of the year. Thanks Jim.

Our treasurer gave a report at our last meeting and the main point being that our general fund does not cover the clubs operating expenses. This imbalance needs to be rectified and this can be done by either raising our subscriptions (which haven't increased in a number of years) or an influx of new members.

## FIELD DAY REPORT

VENUE: DENMARK  
DATE: MARCH 4TH-6TH 1989

The sign-on was at the Ocean Beach Caravan Park as Mal Kelly and his wife Debbie had booked a cottage for a week.

Tony D'Alonzo arrived on Saturday morning. With only four anglers we decided to head out to Bornholm and the "HILL". On arrival Tony said he wouldn't drive down and proceeded to walk. After a local assuring us it was no problem getting up again we drove (slid) down!

There were some nice gutters and rips at the base of the track so we fished these. I lost a salmon on the beach soon after arrival and Mal caught one late in the afternoon. We managed a few herring as well. Tony, who was fishing the reef at the western end of the beach, had good results with four salmon and some bream and herring. During the afternoon we witnessed a 4WD tractor failing to tow a Landrover which had broken an axle, but still had 2WD, up the track. We were surprised at how little trouble we had getting up again. I managed to lose a pair of glasses which slid off the dashboard and out under the wheels. We took Tony's fish up for him while he exercised himself on the 200 m crawl up to his vehicle.

On Sunday Tony fished Parrys Beach with a good mixed bag of fish: pike, bream, herring. Mal and Debbie fished the rocks locally and I again tried Bornholm, managing my herring quota.

Monday saw all the men fishing the back beach at Denmark with only Tony having any luck with the fish.

During the weekend we had light SE to SW winds with an almost continuous light drizzle and mist. The temperature was quite warm so the fishing conditions were good.

During the following week Mal's father-in-law took them back to Bornholm but again they had to walk both down and up again. It was a good day's fishing with silver bream, herring and large skippy.

The potential for this area is really good and I feel we were a little unlucky with the salmon and skippy. It was a good weekend and the scenery down on the south coast is really beautiful. I came back via Manjimup which adds about two hours longer to the trip but is well worth while.

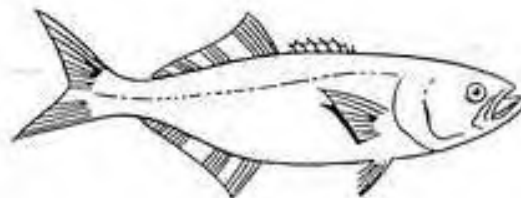

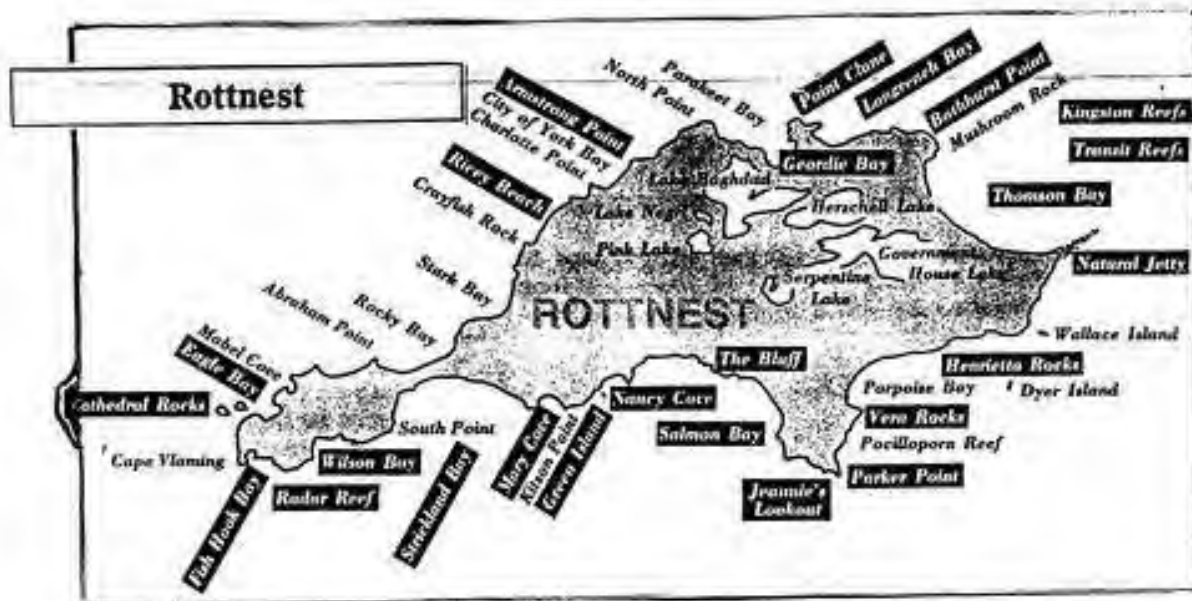

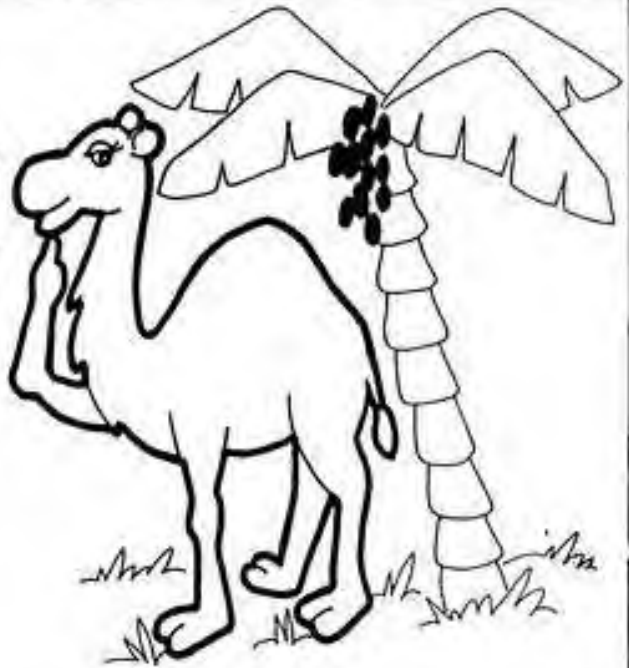
