# PRESIDENT'S REPORT APRIL 1989

The attendance at the March General Meeting started off quietly but improved to a respectable level as the evening progressed. Healthy discussion was had on a number of topics including field days, drycasting, social functions and attendances across the spectrum. Some useful suggestions were put forward and some of these I will mention. The instructional period was the sixth in a series of videos on fishing and was enjoyed by all present. Special thanks once again to Eric Bombardieri for supplying the video and the television.

The most notable achievements for the month was that of Sharon and Peter Osborne. Sharon won the Australian Women's Drycasting Championship and Peter won the Open Drycasting Championship at the recent A.A.A. Australian Carnival at Warrambool in Victoria. In a postcard that Sharon sent to me she summed up the conditions as "real shades of Ballina":- rain, rain and more rain and this makes their achievements even more meritorious. CONGRATULATIONS TO THEM BOTH. I noted how Sharon signed her card:- Sharon (& Peter!!! Apparently our new rods had a lot to do with the results.

The telephone book deliveries have been finalized and the problem of dates etc resolve. Out of the General Meeting has come a suggestion from our Drycasting Officer that we should do away with percentages and go for straight totals for each event retaining the 20 metre bonus cast for the ladies. This is to make the job easier for the organizers and we would be more likely to retain our workers.

On the attendance side it is felt that to encourage members to attend our meetings so that they can contribute to the club's activities a bonus points system be introduced. If a members attends the May General Meeting and the field day he would get a bonus of 10 points. The same would apply if he attended the drycasting for that month. If he does not attend the General Meeting he would be ineligible for those points. If he attends the meeting but no events....no points. The points can be only awarded to the month he attends the meeting. There will be no accumulation of points per month. Another suggestion was that long venue (ie Esperance, Rottnest or Bluff Creek ) be nominated and the other months be left open and decided upon by members at that months meeting. This will also have the effect of better attendances at the meeting because all in attendance will have a say as to where we are going and recent intelligence can be used (in regards to where the fish are). Members who don't attend will need to ring the F.D.O. or a committee member to find out where that particular field day is to be held.


Remember the 6th May is a fun night at Cliftons. Details are elsewhere in this magazine.
