The club is looking at purchasing a banner for club events.


The Field Days for next year? There is a form in this Reel Talk, fill it is and bring it along to the next General Meeting and the committee can put a list together for next year's events.

Sunday produced similar results again.


Both the m/juniors and juniors did well catching good bags of herring and skippy. Tony D'Alonzo clinched the field day by landing a 4.380 kg Salmon.

## ROTTNEST

Surfcasters have notified the Rottnest officials of their wish to use Rottnest as a field day venue. We understand that there are particular conditions which must be adhered to, the chief one being that we cannot camp at West End, but must camp in an official campsite.

Under the new system we have two main costs:(1)a charge of \$30.00 per head which will cover our island accommodation and all island travel (truck and bus) costs, plus (2)our own ferry costs. This would make a total cost of somewhere between \$40.00 to \$60.00 per person, depending on ferry charges.

For our island costs we get:

- truck and bus to our camp

- camp at Tentland, in 6 berth cabins

- anglers and fishing gear taken out to fishing sites on the Saturday
- anglers picked up at requested time on the Sat (eg 9 pm)

- fishing gear to be locked in the hut overnight

- anglers taken back to camp

- anglers picked up Sunday morning at requested time for transport to fishing site(s)
- transport back to camp following fishing

- transport to ferry

This is available between April and October, but not during school holidays.

There is now a regular bus run every hour around the island if some anglers wich to go back before the general crowd (daylight hours only).

There is another possible camp site - Kingston Barracks, which Fremantle is going to try.

We must book ahead for any camps. There is a minimum of 10 people (\$300.00). We can have less people than booked, (but pay for booked number ), but we cannot turn up with more than what we booked for. So we have to be very sure of our bookings, and will have to enfore a money before booking situation.

Gear must be separated and labelled in two piles: Tentland (bus), and Fishing site (truck). Gear will be loaded into either the bus or the truck according to label as soon as we get off the ferry.

We will have some time between ferry arrival and going fishing (about an hour). This is to allow officials to get the general public sorted out before driving us to our chosen fishing site(s).

The Fremantle boys are going to Rotto the second weekend in May. This really leaves us with no option but to take our field day on the third weekend, or perhaps even try Rotto in June (weather?).



# PROPOSED FIELD DAYS POINTS SYSTEM

March, 1990

SCAC committee wishes to propose a new method of calculating field day points that depends upon both the total weight of fish caught and the number of species of fish caught (within a set number of species and species limits).

This has come about through our acknowledgment that stricter bag limits will be legalized within the next few months, and that we as club members must play an active part in conservation of fish species and of our sport.

We aim therefore to encourage club members to still enjoy catching their bag limits (some state limits, some club limits), and to diversify into species type fishing. It is evident to all of us that we cannot adopt a purely species type approach as are many off-shore clubs, as it is a much harder proposition for the rock and beach fisherman to find a variety of species than it is for the boat angler.

With this in mind, committee wishes club members to consider the following system of allocating field day points.

Field day points may be earned in the following ways:

- 10 points per kilo of total fish weight caught
- 2. 5 points for each species caught (see species list)
- 3. 10 points for the heaviest scale fish of the day
- 4. 10 points the heaviest shark of the day
- 5. 10 points for attendance
- 6. 10 points for attending the previous general meeting

# PIELD DAY TROPHIES:

- 1. Heaviest scale fish
- 2. Heaviest shark
- 3. Best bag of the day ( weight, species and heaviest scale fish and/or shark points combined)
- Heaviest junior bag.
   Heaviest mini-junior bag (if appropriate)

# SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR POINTS:

- 1. Heaviest scale fish, 1st & 2nd.
- 2. Heaviest shark, 1st & 2nd.
- Best bag of the day, 1st & 2nd.

# SPECIES LISTINGS:

SCAC members are restricted to the following bag limits per field day/weekend/long weekend:-

50 each : herring, pilch, mullet.

30 each : skippy, slimy mackerel, silver bream, cobbler, tarwhine, whiting, garfish.

20 each :flathead, tailor, dart/trevally.

10 each : blackfish, snook, pike, sweep, flounder, bonito, yellowtail kingfish, mackerel (Spanish, Shark, etc), sampson, snapper, sweetlip, tuna.

5 each : barracouda, jewfish, cods, shark, salmon, mulloway.

OTHERS -up to a total of 5 only of the following:wrasse, wirrah, rockcod, trumpeter, parrotfish, goatfish, rockfish.

NOTE: club bag limits must adhere to state bag limits. Club limits will change to meet state rules if and when new state limits are set.
