DRY CASTING - 7TH JULY, 1963

An excellent roll up of 31 members and 3 juniors made the morning an outstanding success. Firstly the attendance was the most we have had at a casting day since January, 1961, and then to top it all off we had six records either equalled or broken including the longest cast ever recorded by a member and that was Bill Bridger's 434ft. in the Open. This was a mighty effort, but judging by Alan Bunnett's 422ft. there won't be any let up in this event in future Open competition.

In the Distance Event Alan and Bill were again outstanding both equalling the record of 408ft. held by Noel Knight. Bill was a little unlucky as his sinker hit the fence. John Bellman is starting to regain his old form with a nice cast of 378ft. Bill Bridger top scored for the event with 403 - 111 - 514 with Ken Wiggins next with 294 - 180 - 474 and Hugh Gregory 290 -180 - 470.

Bob Tichbon with an excellent score of 60/80 just managed to pip Bob Jensen 59/80 in the Double Handed Accuracy and they were followed closely by Alan Bunnett 56/80. Bob Tichbon finished his score with a nice Bull and John Bellman not to be outdone did likewise. Eleven members scored with all four casts which also is an improvement by competitors in our Accuracy Competition.

The Single Handed Accuracy was a runaway win to Bob Tucker with an excellent score of 27/40, which was just one short of the record. Bob Tichbon was the only one within striking distance with 22/40, followed by Ron Kildahl with 18/40. No Bulls were scored and only five members managed to score with all four casts. Bob Tichbon, Bob Tucker and Hugh Gregory scored with all eight casts in the accuracy events.

TREASURERS REPORT FOR TWELVE MONTHS ENDED 30TH JUNE 1963. The following brief analysis highlights some aspects of Glub Finances. REEL TALK In relation to subscribing members at 30TH June, Reel Talk is now costing 17/7 per annum for each paid subscription including Junior members. This will need the consideration of your Committee this year. TROHHES The expenditure on trophies for the twelve months under review was £22-12-11 greater than for the previous twelve months. This comparise is not completely correct as all the cost of bait boxes has been borne this year whereas seven bait boxes were completed and used as trophies for the 1961/62 Competitions. Expenditure on trophies for 1963/64 is expected to be much lower.

SCCIAL ACTIVITIES Expenditure exceeded income by £59-6-3. The majority this deficiency was accounted for by the Annual Social, the total cost of which was £158-15-3 against paid subscriptions of £116-11-0.

BADGES A fresh supply of Club Badges was procured during the year at a cost of £21-11-3. This expenditure should not be necessary again for several years.

BUILDING FUND This was inaugrated early in the 1962/63 year and has grown to £78-7-2 at the 30TH June 1963. Perhaps not an impressive figure at this stage but at least a good foundation on which to build.

MEMBERSHIP During 1962/63,29 new members were accepted. There were 6 resignations and 6 members failed to renew their subsriptions despite reminders in "Reel Talk" and a circular letter. This gave us a net gain of 17 in membership for the year. At the 30TH June membership totalled 133, consisting of 6 Life Members, 108 Senior Members and 19 Junoir Members. There are several more applications for membership in hand yet to be accepted.

Finances generally will need the close attention of your new Committee to ensure a healthy state of affairs for the future progress of the Club.
