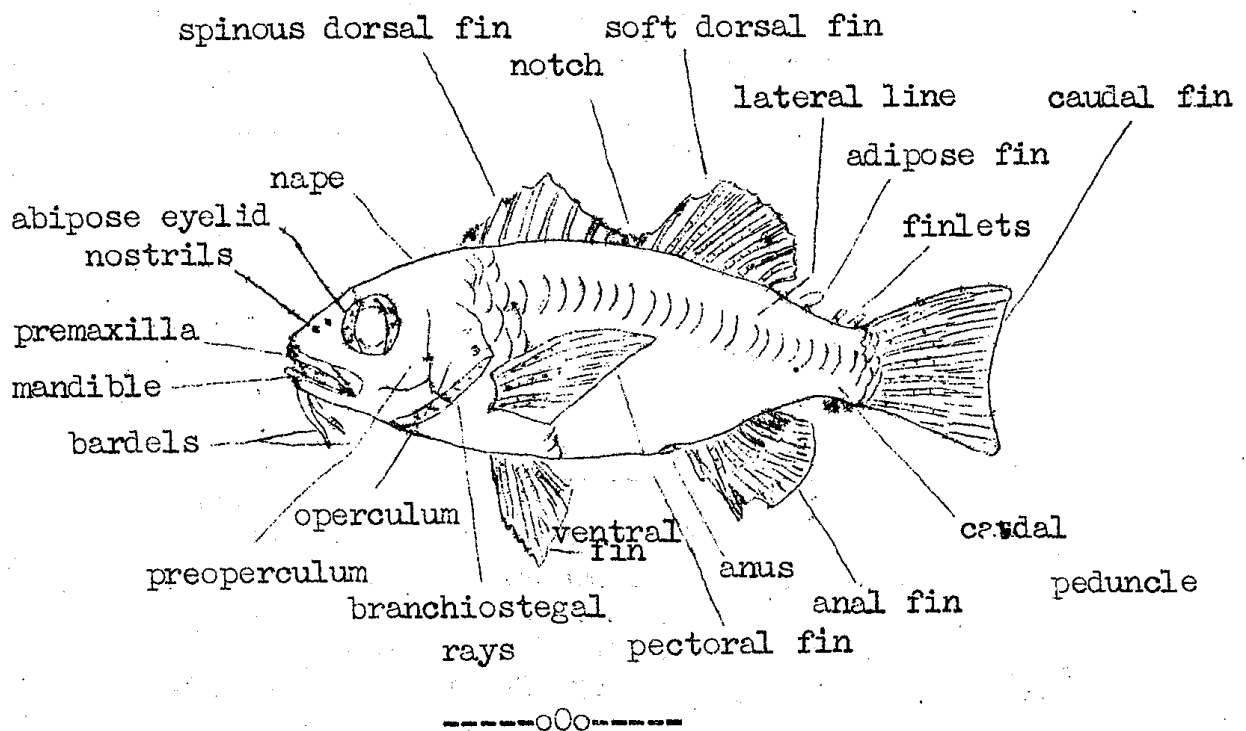
DRYCASTING RULE

RULE 3. Practise casting shall cease when the competition commences. Any member infringing this rule, except with the direct permission of the Casting Day Organiser, who may give this permission, if requested, to clear line after an overrun etc., shall forfeit his next cast.

A copy of the Drycasting Ryles will be included in the "Reel Talk" as soon as possible - this will ensure that everyone is conversant with them.

All members are reminded that casting instruction is available to any member at Casting Days. A quiet word to the Casting Day organiser and he will tee up a suitable instructor for any type of casting that a member desires to brush up on.

NOMENCLATURE OF A FISH



The use of wire when fishing for small tailor or other sharp toothed fish can often be avoided to a great extent if about four or five inches of small diameter plastic tubing is run up the line before the hook is tied on.

After tying the hook, ease the plastic over the eye of the hook and it will not only ensure more bites but will save the line chafing through while playing the fish.

The plastic tubing will also help to avoid the troublesome curl in a wire trace by covering the same as above.

PREPARING FISH FOR THE PAN

To Skin a Fish.

1. With a sharp knife, cut closely along both sides of the dorsal fin, from the back of the head to tail fin.
2. Remove the pectoral fins and, keeping close behind the gills, open the skin on each side from the belly line to the previous cut.
3. Now open the skin along the belly line from the gills to the tail fin. Then dip the fingers in plenty of salt and lift the skin at a corner below the gills to start peeling it back.
4. The secret of easy skinning is to keep the hands dry and to have plenty of salt on the fingers and skin. Fresh fish skin more readily than those that have been on ice.
5. Lift the skin with the fingers and refrain from using a knife. If flesh lifts with the skin, work it down with salt and a thumb nail.
6. Finally the skin may be pulled away right down to the tail. Fish may then be sliced or filleted for the pan.

To Fillet a Fish.

1. Start by cutting across through the skin and flesh of the back, just behind the head, going right down to the backbone.
2. Continue down each side of the fish, keeping close to the gills, as deep as the rib bones which lies beneath.
3. Turn the fish back up and, beginning from the cross cut, run the knife down close alongside the dorsal fin, opening the slit right down to the backbone.
4. When this cut extends down to the butt of the tail, turn the fish on its side and, keeping the blade close against the backbone, force it on down until it cuts out through the skin.
5. Taking the top of the fillet with the left hand, run the knife close along against the ribs to separate the flesh from the bones. The secret is to make shallow cuts and closely follow the curvature of the ribs.

To Fillet a Fish - continued -

6. Fillet may then be separated by cutting through the skin along the belly line, or the operation may be repeated on the other side and two fillets separated later. Carcass still containing the intestines, can then be discarded.

NEXT FIELD DAY

The venue for the August Field Day is to be Lancelin. Members are to report to Jim Strong or Norm Clark, between 2.00 and 4.00 p. Saturday, at the base camp where the club sign will be erected. This is the same as last year at the rear of the reserve, and members can travel from here by car for a radius of five miles on the local roads, to reach their chosen fishing spots.

Fees are 2/- sweep and 1/- registration for Seniors and sweep 1/- for Juniors, and cards containing numbers are to be issued which are to be retained until the weigh in. Fishing is to cease at 8.30 a.m. Sunday morning with the weigh in being held between 8.30 and 9.30 a.m.

Although the area to the south past the crayfish dump was the most productive last year, weather conditions will play an important part in the state of the beaches, and the north area, which was quite shallow, could be considerably scoured out.

An effective gaff is almost as essential to fishermen as his bait and one that is of poor design and badly sharpened is nearly as bad as leaving it home altogether.

A good gaff should be as sharp as a needle and flat with cutting edges at its sides. A Mustad Sea King hook, size 16/0, with set straightened and barb belted down, sharpened correctly makes an efficient substitute if the commercial article is not available. Don't forget to have the point completely covered when travelling.
