AUDIT OF CLUB FINANCIAL RECORDS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL 1972

The audit of the financial records of our Club for the year ended 30th April 1972 has been completed in the usual way and following procedures established in previous years. All entries for the year appear to be in order, and I consider our Treasurer has done quite a good job in his first year of appointment.

The financial statements prepared by him and submitted to this Annual General Meeting of Members for your adoption, do, in my opinion, correctly summarise the financial activities of the Club for the year under review.

You will notice we have omitted the Statement of Receipts and Payments for the General Fund, which has been prepared in previous years. This is because all information is shown in the Statement of Income and Expenditure and a Statement of Receipts and Payments would only be a duplication.

We have changed the arrangement of the Statement of Income and Expenditure this year, so as to make it more informative. Certain items of Income and Expenditure have been grouped to reveal the net result. Items concerned, cover drycasting, social activities and trophy costs.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL, 1972

Mr. President, Gentlemen,

I submit for your approval the attached Financial Statements and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th April, 1972.

GENERAL FUND:

The Club experienced a surplus of \$31 after allowing for \$47 depreciation. This result is satisfactory and it is worth mentioning that if subscriptions had not been increased by \$2 we would have suffered a deficiency of approximately \$200.

Main items which need commenting on are listed below.

SOCIAL:

Our Social events for the year were run for an overall loss of \$156. This compares favourably with the previous year's overall loss of \$300.

The Presentation night was run for a net loss of \$64 compared with the previous year's loss of approximately \$190 and during this year two profitable social events were enjoyed, namely the picnic and the Pool night which accounted for profits totalling \$75.

REEL TALK:

A reduction of \$87 compared with the previous year occurred, which is mainly attributed from stocks of paper and stencils, etc., carried forward from that year.

FIELD DAYS:

Both income and expenses were less this year due to the absence of Rettnest Field Days.

TROPHIES:

The net cost of trophies fell from \$103 to \$65.

Our thanks must again go to Arch Tickle for time and effort he contributes in making sinkers for resale to Club Members. This year he profited the Club by \$36 which goes towards payment of trophies.

MEMBERSHIP:

As at 30th April, 1972 Club membership totalled 143, made up of 6 life members, 16 juniors and 121 seniors. This is an overall reduction of 21 members from 1971.

During the year 6 juniors and 12 seniors were admitted to the Club, however, a total of 39 persons either resigned for did not renew their subscriptions.

In conclusion I wish to thank all members for your assistance during my first year in office.

JULY CAST:

UTTING thrived on the conditions to bring up an excellent 64. Well done Bill! TINY PARKER couldn't wait to B.O. in the Level-Line, so he did his thing in grand style in this event! W. UTTING was followed by R. KILDAHL 56, D. LATTO 52 and J. DEVITT 40. Many of the other scores became casualties of the wind.

The Single-Handed Accuracy also proved difficult for most as only G. BASKERVILLE, P. ISBESTER and E. PARKER could manage to get all four casts in. S. RENSCHAW won the event however with a very fine 25 from 3 casts. He was closely followed by G. GILDERSLEEVE 23, RUDY LERCH 22 and D. LATTO and G. BASKERVILLE both with 20.

Due to the rather trying conditions the Double-Handed Open was postponed until October. Most members agreed with this decision.

The final computation of the results shuffled the Top Twenty around so that only D. LATTO who was on top, was the only caster to remain in the same position. The day itself was won by J. DEVITT with 110 points, moving him up to second place; R. KILDAHL and W. UTTING shared second place with 108 points, while S. RENSCHAW was fourth on 107 and D. LATTO 104, fifth. A quick examination of the Top Twenty reveals a most even and interesting tussle developing with only 16 points separating 1st and 5th and a long way to go.

This ends my term as D.C.O. and I must thank my able assistant, G. BASKERVILLE particularly, all those markers and assistants, last year's D.C.O. L. REID for his advice and help and last, but not least, a special thanks to TINY for providing us all with such marvellous entertainment.
