Treasurer's Report for year ended 30th April, 1974

Mr President, Gentlemen,

I submit for your approval the following financial statements and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th April, 1974.

General Fund

At first glance the deficit of \$375 appears alarming, but I remind you that for the previous year we achieved our budgeted surplus of \$192, which was to be applied against this current year's social expense, resulting in an actual deficit of \$183 for this year. The result is far from satisfactory and it is obvious that our Club is also feeling the effect of inflation. It is essential that we operate our organisation as near as practicable to a nil balance tending to lean towards a small surplus. Steps have already been made by your Committee to counteract the 1973/74 deficit and to prevent a reoccurrence in the coming year.

Main items which need commenting on are listed below:-

Social

Net social expenses for the year totalled \$350 compared with last year's \$28. After allowing for the surplus carry-over of \$192 as mentioned above, the actual cost of social events this current year was \$158.

Individual social cost items are as follows:-

It can be seen from this that the achieved loss of \$158 is quite reasonable.

Income from sundry sources totalled \$140.

Reel Talk

The cost of producing our monthly 'Reel Talk' increased this year from \$213 to \$325. The increase can be attributed to paper costs and the purchase of covers. This area of expense will vary from year to year due to bulk buying of stock in order to obtain the best price and the carry-over of that stock into the

Treasurer's Report - continued

following year - e.g. in 1972/73 we purchased nil covers but this year we had to buy a supply costing \$92. Some of this stock will, of course, carry over to next year and thus result in a lower cost.

Dry Casting

The increase from last year to this year of \$29 is due to the Club having to hire the oval for \$7 per meeting for a full year.

N.B. The Council commenced their charges in November 1972.

Badges & Transfers

During the year it was necessary to purchase 100 Club Badges and 100 Ratio Badges which cost \$322. We also purchased 40 Pocket Badges for resale at a cost of \$120.

To cater for the badges we conducted a '200 Club' Raffle which was very successful and financed these purchases to the extent of \$351. We now have sufficient badges to last several years.

Rent

We felt the impact of a 58% increase in rent this year and the total rent paid was \$169 against the previous year's \$114.

Trophies

Thanks to the very generous trophy donors and the efforts of the late Arch Ticklie this expense fell this year from \$135 to \$106. This is a splendid result considering the quality of the trophies presented.

Insurances

During the year your Committee reappraised the Club's Insurance Policies and although the cost of insurance has increased by \$40 we feel it was justified in bringing all members added protection.

All policies have now been taken out with the one Insurance Company to gain the best insurance rates.

Membership

Membership remained consistent and members for the year ended 30th April, 1974 can be seen as follows:-

Building Fund

The increase in the Building Fund for 1973/74 without the transfer of \$500 from the General Fund was \$461 which compares against the 1972/73 increase, without taking into account the raffle profit of \$201, of \$359.

This increase is mainly due to higher interest rates.

Conclusion

It can be seen from this report that we have not faired as well as expected even with the conducting of raffles and endeavours to minimise Club spending. It can also be assumed that costs will not level out in the short term let alone reduce.

Therefore, it is strongly recommended that subscriptions for seniors be increased to \$10, and juniors to \$3.
