Suddenly there was an urgency about breakfast and getting to the water early and it wasn't long before we were rigging up on Camp Rock.

As the first light of day fell over the cliffs, lures and baits were being flung with gay (Barrie) abandon and a couple of small reef fish were soon on the rocks. We were anxiously awaiting the arrival of the sun in anticipation of a run of good fish, however, it didn't happen, we saw fish that seemed to be coming in with the sun but they disappeared before getting to the rocks. The sun rose and nothing happened, until, about 8.30 there was a boil in the water within casting distance and seven lures must have concussed whatever it was. Seven retrieves without a touch. Later there was another boil, and another and the water was alive. Cries of "I'm on", "so am I", were soon yelled feverishly as the Mitchell's were screaming everywhere (except mine, I had been voted first up gaffman and the way things looked I might not get a cast in).

It would be futile to try and remember the order of capture but before long several anglers had their first "Game Fish" and we had a sizeable pile of shark mackerel piled up behind us.

The action lulled for awhile and we spread out a bit and, about 11 a.m. Wilf came over and asked what you had to do to get a Trevally to take a lure. He had been casting at a huge Trevally for over an hour with a follow every cast without a hookup. Despite some very good advice (use a mulie) that Trevally is still swimming.

We returned to Quobba with about a dozen mackerel and a couple of schnapper where we met Kim Jury carrying a sizeable Trevally had full of tales about huge schools of these fish up at Red Bluff. After a bit of discussion we decided to have a look at the Bluff in the morning.

FIELD DAY REPORT: CAPE CUVIER '79 CONT'D:

The weather was kind indeed as we arrived at the Bluff and set about the business at hand (everyone except Paul who was indisposed emptying his mouth of unwanted nourishment from the night before). Well the Trevally were there alright but catching them was something else. It seemed there was so much baitfish in the area they didn't need to eat metal and plastic. It didn't matter what we threw at them they wouldn't eat it. We were trying to match size and colour of the baitfish (the correct procedure?) when Wally picked up a half kilo Bony Herring off the rocks, impaled it on a mulie rig and promptly dragged out a 1516 Trevally (his first of three for the morning). This ploy seemed to give the Trevally the right idea as three or four of the boys picked up a fish or two whilst a couple of us dipped out still.

With ten o'clock and the end of the field day we all sat down and had a beer and contemplated the week still to come and boy, what a week it was to be.

Mr. President, Members:

I submit, for your approval, the attached financial statements for the year ended April 30, 1979.

I am glad to report that, financially, the year just ended has been a successful one for our Club. Our overall surplus of Income over Expenditure was \$1310, and this was made up from the following:

This surplus compares most favourably with the amount of \$1196 achieved last year.

The year's surplus of \$1310 does not take into account the repayment of \$1200 for the Kalbarri Property housing loan, \$834 capital expenditure on furniture, house additions and land clearing on the Kalbarri house, and \$17 on various small capital items. It is to be noted that Members of the Club had also donated labour and materials, valued at \$800, to put up certain additions to the Kalbarri house. The amount increased the value of the property, and has been taken up in the books of the Club, although the amount is not reflected in the above surplus of \$1310.

GENERAL FUND

A surplus of \$1070 was achieved, as against the previous year's total of \$1050. The surplus was generated mainly through income from General Activities. This showed an income of \$783, as against an income of \$271 in 1977/78. This performance was offset by a reduction in income, from the Kalbarri Property, of \$779 in 1977/78 to \$287 in 1978/79. A summary of these transactions is as follows:

SUBSCRIPTION

Membership subscription, for Senior Members, was \$17. Retired Senior Members subscription was half this amount. Family Membership subscription, introduced 1976/77, remained at \$30, and Juniors at \$1.

The total subscriptions of \$1662 compares favourably with \$1487 for the

SOCIAL

Social activities for the year were again conducted profitably. The year's surplus was \$156, as against \$287 in 1977/78 and \$404 in 1976/77.

Full details of social activities are outlined under Note 3, page 2, of the attached accounts.

REEL TALK

Costs to produce the monthly Reel Talk totalled \$379, plus \$156 for postage. There was an advertising income of \$130, which reduced the total net cost of Reel Talk to \$405. In 1977/78, the cost to produce Reel Talk was \$500, plus \$127 for postage.

It should be noted however, that in 1978/79, no cost was incurred in the purchase of covers and wrappers.

DRY CASTING

Costs of Dry Casting decreased from \$112 to \$53. This was mainly due to the changing of venue from Floreat Oval to Yokine Reserve.

CLUB BADGES

It was necessary to purchase 100 Club Game Fish Badges, to replenish stock that ran out during the year. The expense of \$184 should see us through for a few seasons.

TROPHIES

Trophy donors once again continued their support. Our special thanks must go to our President, Mr. Brian Leicester, for approaching the various fishing tackle shops and distributors for donations, and to those Members who generously donated money or trophies to the Club.

The total net expenditure of \$44 for trophies, by the Club, was a splendid result, considering the number and the quality of the trophies presented at the Annual Dinner.

SALE OF 'T' SHIRTS

The Club made a net profit of \$77 from the sale of Club 'T' shirts to Members. This was achieved solely through the efforts of the ever hard working Ken Jones. Thank you very much Ken.

BUILDING FUND

The Building Fund total income was \$240, as compared to last year's total of \$146. The bank balance of the Building Fund Account, as at April 30, 1979, was \$702. This should be sufficient to cover the day to day capital improvement of the Kalbarri Property and its furniture.

BANK LOAN

The Club's bank loan with the National Bank, as at April 30, 1979, was \$2700. The Club has two years and three months to finalise payment of this loan. At the time of writing this report, the bank had further approved a \$2000 loan for the Club to put a new roof on the Kalbarri House.

BANK LOAN CONT'D

The terms of monthly repayment, of the two loans, will be at \$100 per month. The repayment period of the loans, as at June 30, 1979, was extended to three years and nine months.

However, in view of the Club's loan repayment commitment and the continuing escalation in costs for stationery, postage and other general administrative costs, it would be foolish if the Club did not take some action in fund raising in 1979/80. The Club's recent decision, to increase the sign-on fees for both the Field Days and Dry Castings, is a positive step to cover for some of the likely contingencies.

Lastly, I would like to especially thank our Auditor, Mr. Bob Klein, for all his help and guidance, and to all the Committee Members, whom I have found to be a great bunch of people to work with.

- 2.1 Accounts have been prepared using Historical Cost method of accounting.
- 2.2 Purchase of covers and wrappers for "Reel Talk", club badges, insurance, rates and other annual expenses are written off in total in the year of payment and are not apportioned.
- 2.3 The Kalbarri Property is recorded at cost and no provision for depreciation of the building has been brought to account in arriving at the financial result for the year. The Management Committee considers the property would have been, at the 30th April, 1979, and would now be, capable of realising more than Balance Sheet value.
- 2.4 All Current Assets are expected to realise Balance Sheet value in the normal course of Club operations and no provision for Doubtful Debts is considered necessary.
- 2.5 Depreciation of Plant and Equipment is calculated on the Prime Cost method (i.e. on original cost or valuation) at 10% per annum.
