Dear Members,

This week I had another experimental cook up. As a rule I don't use recipes except to refer at times to basic methods as I have not had any training. These cooking experiences under my "Rock of Eye" system are good fun and the following snapper concoction came out well. I found it smoothly fishy sharp and picquant, dont forget to have a dry fruity white handy.

There are no quantities given, Ive forgotten them, so give it a go with your own "Rock of Eye" system.

Bon Apertit

"Stefano"

SNAPPER AU GRATIN (STEFANO)

MARINADE: - (30 mins - 60 mins please yourself)

Snapper fillets - leave skin on, keeps it firm

Lemon Juice

White Wine

Sunflower Oil (cold pressed)

Fish Stock (prepare before hand with fish heads and scraps)

Coriander Seed

Basil (Ground in the hand)

Oregano (ground in the hand)

Parsley Flakes

Salt and Pepper (careful)

.....

SAUCE BASE:

Cornflour

Butter - Milk - Tasty Cheese

Blend to very very stiff.

.....

VEGETABLES:

1" Potato Cubes

1/4" Zuchinni Cubes

Cauli Flowers cut small

Pressure cook lightly in fish stock

.....

Remove fish from marinade, drain and clean and roll in cool melted butter or oil, put aside.

.....

Add marinade to stiff cornflour blend and blend on low heat, add Veg., water, cauli and zuchinni - dont boil. Put potato cubes aside.

Cont'd.

Grill snapper fillets quickly so they brown on top but remain moist. Baste with butter of course.
Bread crumbs (fine) will help sprinkled on top
Shake the Potato cubes in Salt and pepper with butter over a slow flame.

Serve in an oval warmed dish, fillets in the centre, sauce surrounding potatoes on the side in a warmed dish.

You wont have any burners left, so percolate the coffee later.

As a matter of interest, snapper is available in a private house just south of sorrento on the east side of West Coast Highway. \$2.00 Kilo whole they are professionals. (as at 14 July 82)

A.A.A. OF W.A. REPORT:

There were 19 delegates in attendance at the July meeting of the above and a good deal of business was dealt with. George Holman was our delegate in attendance.

A good deal of discussion was had regarding boat ramps and landing facilities after a report from Jack Shaw of the Marmion Club. Jack Shaw and Laurie BIRCHALL are to look further into this matter.

2. Rough Bullseye, Pempheris Klunzingeri, is a common Bullseye, Pempheris multiradiata. The record for the rough bullseye is vacant.
3. Western Wirrah, Acanthistius serratus, is a Leopard Perch, Acanthistius Pardalotus, and replaces the listed Leopard Perch. The record for the Western Wirrah is vacant.
4. Norwest Cod, Epinephelus tauvina, is a Queensland Groper, Promicrops Lanceolatus, and replaces the listed Queensland Groper. The record for the Norwest Cod now reverts to the previous holder and read, 106.140 Kg 1.778 m length and 1.372 girth, caught by Clem Winton at Shark Bay on 16-7-73 using a rod from the shore.
5. Epulette catshark, hemiscyllium ocellatum, should read varied Catshark, parascyllium variolatum.
6. Southern Sawshark, pristiophorus nudipinnis. Should read Green Sawfish, Pristiopsis zijeron.
