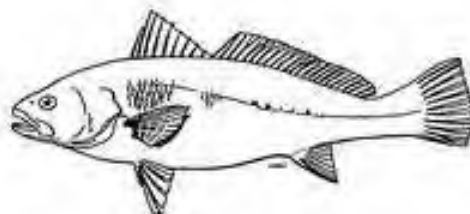

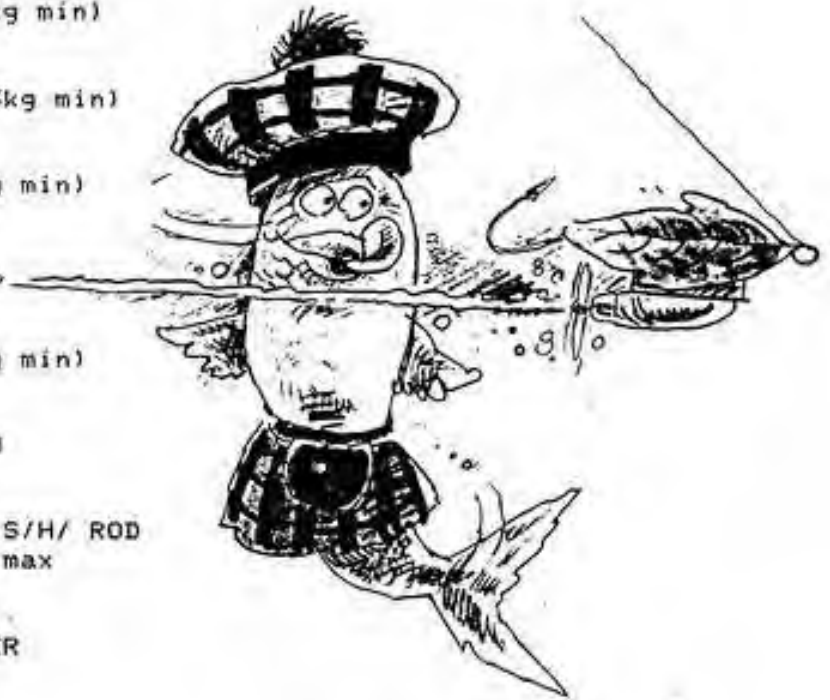

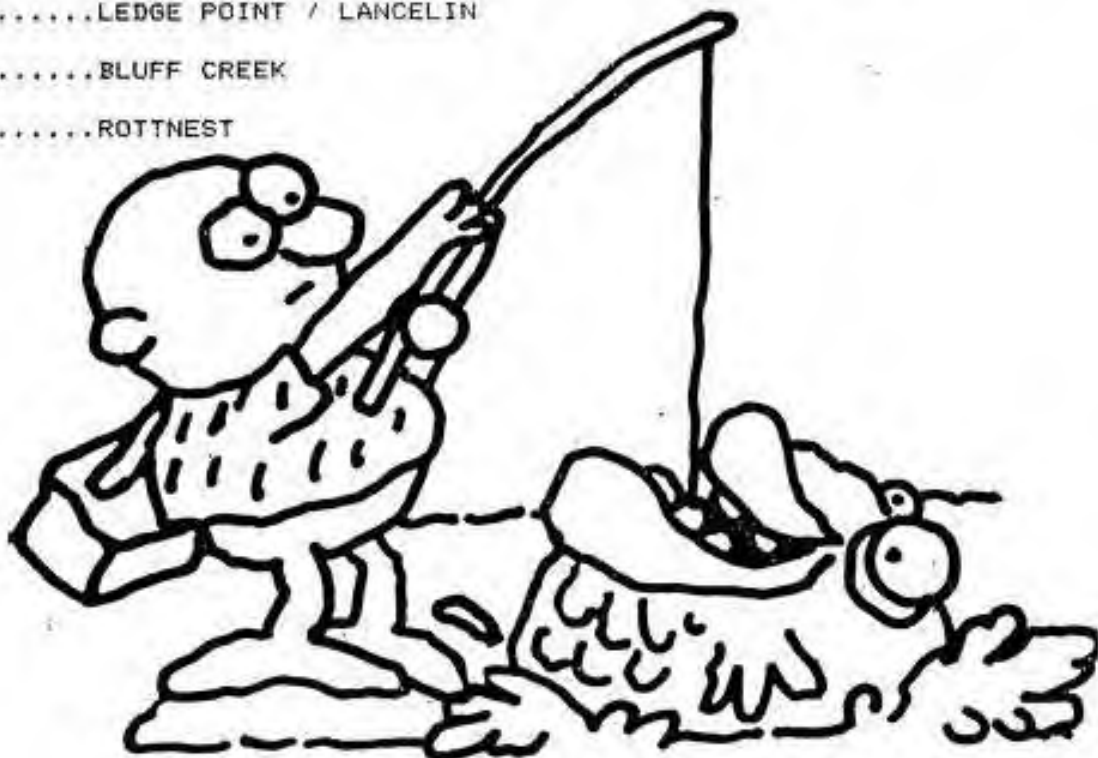

## DISTANCE AND WEATHER

Two common misconceptions about Esperance relate to distance and weather.

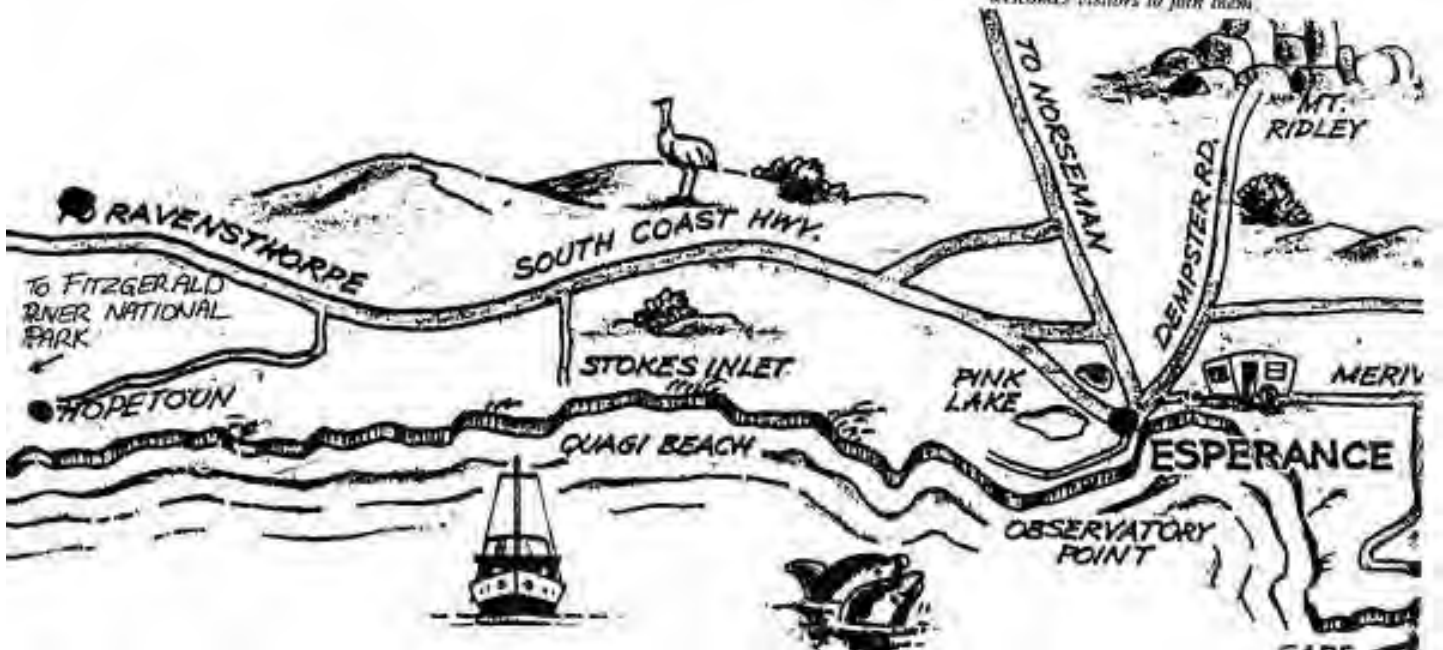
First, Esperance is only 725 kilometres by road from Perth or an easy 8 hour drive. That's much closer than some of the popular destinations in the north! Fly with Skywest Airlines and be there in just 1½ hours any day. Deluxe Coachlines and Westrail operate express services to Perth several times a week at modest prices. Deluxe offers through connections to Adelaide and the eastern states.

Esperance is on the southeast coast, but the climate is mild. This area rarely experiences extreme summer heat. The summer mean average is just below 30 and in winter rarely falls below 20.

Most rain falls between May to October and by the old scale, about 20 inches annual rainfall, is relatively light.

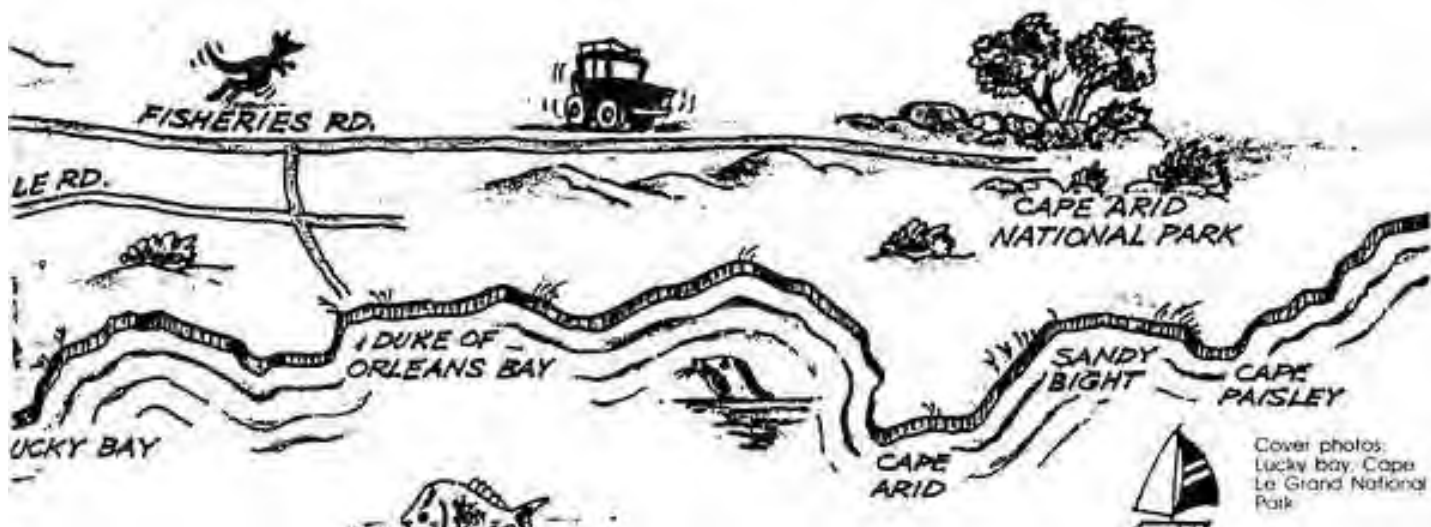
