**Local sign on** At General meeting or phone Field Day Officer before 8pm on Thursday.

- **Late sign on** Phone the Field Day Organiser. The club will assume you will not be fishing if you haven't signed on at the sign on place or phoned.
- **Please SMS** the Field Day Organiser at 0401 054 110 as he will not answer the phone if he is driving or if earlier, he may be out on a reef fishing.
- **Club sign off** If you have signed on then you must sign off in person at the weigh-in place at the nominated time or by phone (or if not contactable by phone use SMS) no later than ½ hour before the weigh-in time if you have no fish, have an emergency outside of the Field Day, or have personal reasons and will not attend the weigh-in.
- **Club fees** \$10 per person, \$12 per family. If you sign on you must pay the Field day fees. Please bring the correct money because there may not be change. If you don't make payment at sign-on or at the preceding General Meeting or you have signed on by telephone, please make payment to the FDO or Assistant FDO at the weigh-in.
- **FDO** Local FDO to be advised at the General meeting.
- **Fish** Fish caught between the lines in and lines out times are eligible for the Club Field Day competition and weigh-in. Fish caught before or after those times are eligible for the Open fishing competition.

Local boundaries Normally Penguin Island sand spit to north wall of the Two Rocks Marina, including the Swan and Canning Rivers, the North and South Mole, unless different boundaries are listed for that month.

- Local weigh in Location to be set at General meeting, or the Local Field Day officer may set an alternative or additional location or time by arrangement with the members who have signed on. An adult member must witness weights. Field Day money to be left with the scales in an envelope with your name and details written in the carbon copy Field Day book. No money = no points. Results to be phoned to FDO by 8pm the next night.
- **Fish together** Check at the General Meeting prior to each field day for arrangements and discussions about when and where members can meet to fish together locally in the metropolitan area or at the away venue. New members are encouraged to fish with experienced members for guidance and help.

## Field Day Officers Report

#### SCAC Field Day Report: Preston – 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016

#### Synopsis

The July 2016 field day was located at Preston. All away fisho's went north, with the main group only going up to 7km, while three went nearly up to the White Hill entrance. The forecasts were for strong NW winds, high swell (thus with dirty stirred water) and rain for the weekend. Given these extremes, the results for fish caught by individual anglers ranged from zero, to zero. Hence points scored were restricted to attendance points for those that signed on.

#### The Trip.

The sign on was at 11:00 at the Preston Beach Carpark on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> July with lines down at 1:00 pm with fishing through on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July with the usual lines up time of 10:00 am with the weigh-in to be conducted at 11:00 am at the sign-on location.

The Preston advocates headed to a beach area some 7 km north of the carpark, Lee Yongli, Scott Williamson, Gary Parkinson and Peter Osborne. On first look at this stretch of beach it looked fishable. At the 1:00 pm start sinkers and mulies went seaward but immediately got caught up on weed. We preserved for about an hour but this area just came up as unfishable – seaweed so thick and heavy within a minute terminal gear was imbedded with weed, some so large on trying to retrieve, even with 30 lb line, a break-off resulted. Hence gear was retrieved and cars packed up and we went south again looking for better water. A spot was picked a couple of km north of the carpark - it didn't look as bad, but on trying to fish the same problem occurred. Hence Preston considered a write-off and a conscious decision to open up boundaries and include the Dawesville cut south side was made.

When pumping up tyres at Preston both Gary and Peter tried to contact Mark to advise him of the boundary change as he was so far north he was out of range of mobile phones. Dawesville cut was tried for 3 hours (to early evening) but while fishable no fish bites at all. As fishing was so bad Gary and Scott, and Lee decided to drive home early that night Peter tried this area early Sunday for a couple of hours, again no bites so then drove back to the Preston Carpark for the weight-in and enjoyed reading the paper and a good cup of coffee while waiting

Mark Nurse, Martin Wearmouth, (in company of Peter Butland who had not signed on) made an early start and drove north. They checked conditions and found a less weedy area about 1km from the White Hills Road. This area was also plagued by weed as your rig hot the water but they fished hard Saturday afternoon and evening, with nil result. Martin left early evening due to obligations on the home front. Mark and Peter tried again on Sunday morning, again with zero result so they decided to leave mid-morning, via the White Hills road. On getting onto the main road, Marks mobile picked up the slew of SMS messages from Saturday afternoon/evening and some from Peter on Sunday morning about the boundary change. The advised Peter they would not go down to Preston but drive home as they had a nil result.

#### Local

Two Surfcasters signed on for the local venue for this field day.

George Holman went to his local beach at Floreat on Saturday where he had some problems with swell and some weed and did not find any quality fish - another zero result.

While he had signed on for the Field day, Mark Hansen had a busy weekend and with the weather forecast not being favourable, decided not to put a line in the water.

#### Recommendation

For future Field days with venues on open beaches such as Preston, the Field Day date to be delayed by one week, if by the preceding General Meeting weather forecast gives the following:

- NW winds in excess of 25 km
- Swell in excess of 2 meters (giving dirty water)
- Rain/storms

## **Recipes – Sweet 'N Sour Fish**

#### Thanks to John Curtis

Ingredients: 1 green capsicum cut in half, seeded, and thinly sliced. 2 stalks of celery cut into 25mm lengths. 1 cup of carrot straws. 3 shallots cut into 25mm lengths OR 1 medium white onion cut into eighths 1 piece of preserved ginger sliced very thinly 1 large tin pineapple pieces 3 cups large diced fish pieces 1 tablespoon cider vinegar 1 tablespoon raw sugar 1 dessertspoon soy sauce cornflour for thickening

#### Method:

Place the vegetables, ginger, juice from pineapple pieces, vinegar, raw sugar into a saucepan and simmer for about 15 minutes. Add the fish and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the pineapple pieces and soy sauce. When the mixture comes to the boil, thicken with a little cornflour blended in a cup of water.

Serve with rice or noodles.



## <u>Ray on Barra</u>

HOME VALLEY STATION - GIBB RIVER ROAD. Home Station is situated right on the Gibb River Road and has three rivers on the property. It is an up market Resort but the camping is cheap, \$15pp. There are a lot of attractions on the Station but unfortunately you have to go on paid tours to access them. I decided to go on the fishing tour for four hours (1.00pm to 5.00pm) and was not disappointed. There were just the guide (Callum) and myself as it is early in the season (just opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> May). We set up on the bank of a landlocked section of the Pentecost River, it is only connected occasionally at exceptionally high tides in the wet season and the fish are trapped in it for most of the year. After setting up on the bank of the 'Bait Hole' we spent some time net casting for live bait. It took a while but we ended up with some small mullet and a few prawns.

Baiting up we sat down and prepared to wait as the prime time is later in the day 3.30pm onwards (the water temperature was at its peak). Tides do not make any difference to this isolated section of the river. We experienced a thunderstorm while we were waiting and were drenched, it was so warm that the rain was refreshing and we soon dried out, cooled the temperature a bit and settled the dust but that was about it.

The Kimberly had its driest wet season in eleven years, last year was dry as well so the Kimberley is not as green and wet as is should be, hope the water falls do not dry out before I get to them. I was busy chatting when I missed the first bite and was very disappointed. Now knowing what a Barra bite felt like I paid full attention to the fishing.

I did not miss the second bite and was rewarded by a Barra launching itself into the air, very spectacular. I was very relieved to beach the fish and it measured 67cm, I was ecstatic after so many hours fishing over the last 12 months, finally a decent result. It went into the esky for dinner that night. The follow up was a little later. I was holding one rod and the second was set up resting on a branch of a small tree. Callum grabbed the rod and set the hooks then handed the rod to me. It was a good sized fish, 83cm but as Callum had grabbed the rod I did not class it as a catch for me, but it was a beautiful healthy and solid fish and it was returned to the water. Now the heart was really pumping! Not long after I had another strike and was again rewarded with another Barra the same size as the last. When it flew out of the water it looked like a meter long fish but measured only 84cm, still a big fish. This was also returned to the water and that was the final hook up of the day. A day I will remember with pleasure for a long time as I am sure the size of the fish will grow with every story!! Staying here for a few more days then heading for Drysdale Station and the Mitchel Plateau, then Kalumburu and hopefully some more fishing.







## President's Annual Report for 2015/16

The Surfcasting and Angling Club of W.A. is one of the original fishing clubs formed in W.A. having just completed its 64<sup>th</sup> year. Like all longstanding organisations it has experienced its share of ups and downs. Where we differ from many others that have folded is our ability to weather these storms and move on. It would be fair to say that the last couple of years have been difficult ones but I am pleased to say that presently there is much to be optimistic about. As I will detail later in this report many of the key indicators of membership contentment are showing considerable improvement and give us cause to look forward to continued success as a recreational club.

I would like to acknowledge in this report 2 significant events that occurred during the year just completed. Club stalwart and my predecessor as president, George Holman, completed 50 continuous years as a surfcaster. His contributions across many facets of the club were acknowledged many years ago with the award of life membership. George's contributions and achievements are too numerous to mention here however I know all surfcasters past, present and future have and will continue to benefit from all he has contributed. On a sadder note, this last year saw the passing of our longest serving member Jim Strong. Like George, Jim was awarded life membership many years ago and also has a list of contributions too long to list. I had the good fortune to sit at Jim's table at the first presentation night I attended and thoroughly enjoyed his stories about days gone by. I was also able to witness close hand his expression when he won most improved caster (after about 50 something years membership) for that season! The longevity and success of our club is in no small way due to the contributions of members like Jim and George.

As history will show I was elected as interim President in March 2016 following the resignation of George Holman. At the time I thanked the members for their support of my nomination and looked forward to their support. I am particularly pleased to report the membership have delivered here in spades and I am especially grateful for this. Whilst club success is owned by all the membership and the result of everyone's contributions it is fitting that I say a few words about our committee. George Holman , Michael Pisano, Terry Fuller and Gary Gildersleeves all served for several months before resigning at various stages during the year. I would like to thank them all on behalf of the membership for their contributions. I have already spoken about George but of course Terry Fuller is also a club stalwart and life member with decades of contributions to this club for which we are truly grateful. Gary Gildersleeves is an accomplished drycasting champion with a long history of club membership who has on several occasions stepped up to help with the running of drycasting, both formally and in an informal manner. Michael Pisano is a relatively new member who stepped up to help out when help was short at hand. Given this attitude I am sure we will see Michael continue to be involved in the club.

The current positive state of the club has much to do with the contributions of our Vice President and Treasurer Vic Schilo. I personally have on many occasions contacted Vic to discuss club matters and to seek his advice. I value his opinion and find his considerable experience gleaned from many years of involvement in other organisations to be particularly helpful. His presentation of the financial affairs of the club is detailed yet easy to interpret. From this, good financial decisions can be made and there have been several examples of this over the last 12 months. Vic has also been heavily involved in examining the legal aspects of the club and done much in his role as Australian Anglers Association (AAA) Delegate to improve the club's relationship with external agencies. I feel much progress has been made here for the benefit of everyone in this club.

Probably the most difficult job on a committee is that of secretary. The expectation of having to know everything, do everything yet be told almost nothing is unenviable. For the first time in several years we have had 1 person do all of the traditional roles of a secretary. George Belin is a relatively new member yet put his hand up for this position. He has performed these tasks efficiently, effectively and in good humour. I have also found his approach to problem solving to be invaluable to me as president. The fact I awarded club person of the year to George is evidence of the regard I have for his efforts over the last year.

Our magazine Reel Talk and the website are critical to the smooth running of the club. With the resignation of our editor early this year we were faced with the possibility of publication being interrupted. Fortunately, in stepped Mark Nurse to assume this role and as we know the fine tradition of

monthly Reel Talks continued. Mark has fully embraced this role and has managed to perfect that balance between tradition and innovation. Feedback from members has been very positive and supportive. Mark is continuing to develop the format and is always prepared to listen to members' suggestions. Who knows maybe one day I will catch a decent fish and manage to get on the cover!

The role of Social Organiser is another crucial role within the club. We struggled along without one for a few months and then Pat McKeown stepped in and we haven't looked back since. The Presentation Night was a great success with universal approval. In the past Pat has organised several social events only to receive modest support. Despite this he has continued to approach the role with enthusiasm. There is much we can do in the future to further enhance the social calendar of the club. I am sure Pat will provide advice and help but we need other members to step up and provide genuine support.

Perhaps the area of the club that has struggled the most over the last 12 months has been our drycasting. Despite this our Drycasting Officer Ron Thomas has hung in there. It is particularly pleasing to see that attendance over recent months has improved significantly and hopefully will continue to rise. Had Ron not persisted this would not have been the case. I would also like to acknowledge Ron's contribution to the fundraising sausage sizzle last year which raised about \$1500. Ron's efforts this year have been stellar and we are all very grateful.

Peter Osborne is another long term member and contributor to the club. The role of Field Day Officer is a crucial one which Peter has performed for the last few years. His limitless enthusiasm for fishing is an inspiration for all of us and his willingness to share his extensive knowledge is something we all benefit from. Peter has indicated that he is looking at stepping down from this position in the near future and has offered assistance to anyone who would consider taking on this role. This is an opportunity for a member to make a significant contribution to the club whilst learning from the master.

Ric Parker is a life member of the club who has indicated he won't be re-nominating for committee this year. During the years I have been a surfcaster Ric has been the guy who would take on whatever role needed filling. Most recently it was Property Officer but over the years he has filled almost every position there is. He has also been a generous donator of lures for competition prizes and maker of sinkers for members. I suspect there have also been many other contributions over the 40 or so years of membership. I am sure I speak for all surfcasters past and present when I extend my gratitude to Ric.

Justin Rose joined the committee this year as Recorder and has impressed all with his efficiency and enthusiasm. A very accomplished angler with a considerable depth of knowledge, personal commitments have limited Justin's attendances at meetings however on the occasions he has been able to attend his contributions have been invaluable and we are all hopeful that in future years we will see Justin become even more involved in the club.

Sri Srigandan, Peter Butland, Ken Howells and Bob Henderson have filled the assistant and committee person roles. Their breadth of skills, knowledge and experience have proved invaluable to the management committee over the year. I hope we can squeeze many more years service out of all of them.

Of course there are many functions and jobs within the club performed by members who are not members of the committee. Whilst it is not practical to thank everyone individually this communal contribution is an essential component of any successful organisation. On behalf of the management committee I would like to thank all members for their various contributions and trust this sharing of responsibilities and workload will continue in the future.

In planning for the future it is appropriate that we examine the successes of last year as well areas for improvement. Financially the club remains in good shape overall. As will be seen from the Annual Financial Report the bank balance has remained healthy. Whilst we are not in the business of making money we all appreciate the value of good and sound financial management.

Our membership numbers have remained steady, however over recent months it has been particularly

gratifying to see participation numbers increase significantly. The committee has spent some time looking at ways to accommodate and attract new members. Ultimately, prospective members will join and participate if they see some benefit in being a member. I feel the membership is generally welcoming of new members but all of us need to realise a room full of strangers can be daunting at times and make sure we do all we can to make new members feel welcome.

I touched on the problems with drycasting when discussing Ron Thomas's contributions. It is particularly pleasing to see numbers attending is now at a healthy level and interest is returning. I am optimistic that this will continue. We are currently working on a Drycasting Safety document and hopefully this will be finalised by the new committee early in their term.

Fishing Field Days were well supported throughout the season. There were many highlights with some wonderful fish caught. Many of these achievements were acknowledged on the Presentation Night. Participation in the open competition is high which shows members are using what they are learning at the club events. To me the 2 highlights both occurred at our Bluff Creek field day. Firstly, the initiative of Mark Nurse to arrange a pre competition breakfast at this event was very warmly received and did much to generate club spirit. Also the bag weighed in by Peet Wessels, consisting of 19kg plus with around 10 species was an outstanding angling performance. We all look forward to many great field days this season.

Surfcasters have a long history of outstanding performance in state drycasting championships. This season was especially successful with first place in mens, veterans and junior team competition. There were also several first place finishes in individual competition. Gary Gildersleeves, George Holman, Reece Jones, Morgan Keet, Rob and Peter Pekaar all recorded first place finishes. There were also many other surfcasters who finished very high in the placings. We did also have some success in the Rock and Beach competitions with Ron Thomas placing second in veterans and second finishes for mens and veterans teams.

Whilst the Kalbarri property made a small profit this year, the holiday rental market up there is pretty tough. Over recent years we have spent a considerable amount of club funds on capital improvements to the house. Despite this rental return has been modest. The move to involve a realtor as booking agent has met with some success but we need to be realistic about the future profitability of the property. Perhaps the club is at a stage where we need to examine the viability of the Kalbarri property and start to examine alternatives.

In conclusion I would again like to thank the membership for their support of myself and the committee. I am confident that the next committee will also receive such support and we can all look forward to next year with enthusiasm and optimism.





- **Late sign on** Phone the Field Day Organiser. The club will assume you will not be fishing if you haven't signed on at the sign on place or phoned.
- **Please SMS** the Field Day Organiser at 0401 054 110 as he will not answer the phone if he is driving or if earlier, he may be out on a reef fishing.
- **Club sign off** If you have signed on then you must sign off in person at the weigh-in place at the nominated time or by phone (or if not contactable by phone use SMS) no later than ½ hour before the weigh-in time if you have no fish, have an emergency outside of the Field Day, or have personal reasons and will not attend the weigh-in.
- **Club fees** \$10 per person, \$12 per family. If you sign on you must pay the Field day fees. Please bring the correct money because there may not be change. If you don't make payment at sign-on or at the preceding General Meeting or you have signed on by telephone, please make payment to the FDO or Assistant FDO at the weigh-in.
- **FDO** Local FDO to be advised at the General meeting.
- **Fish** Fish caught between the lines in and lines out times are eligible for the Club Field Day competition and weigh-in. Fish caught before or after those times are eligible for the Open fishing competition.

Local boundaries Normally Penguin Island sand spit to north wall of the Two Rocks Marina, including the Swan and Canning Rivers, the North and South Mole, unless different boundaries are listed for that month.

- Local weigh in Location to be set at General meeting, or the Local Field Day officer may set an alternative or additional location or time by arrangement with the members who have signed on. An adult member must witness weights. Field Day money to be left with the scales in an envelope with your name and details written in the carbon copy Field Day book. No money = no points. ## Field Day Officers Report

#### SCAC Field Day Report: Preston – 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016

#### Synopsis

The July 2016 field day was located at Preston. All away fisho's went north, with the main group only going up to 7km, while three went nearly up to the White Hill entrance. The forecasts were for strong NW winds, high swell (thus with dirty stirred water) and rain for the weekend. Given these extremes, the results for fish caught by individual anglers ranged from zero, to zero. Hence points scored were restricted to attendance points for those that signed on.

#### The Trip.

The sign on was at 11:00 at the Preston Beach Carpark on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> July with lines down at 1:00 pm with fishing through on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July with the usual lines up time of 10:00 am with the weigh-in to be conducted at 11:00 am at the sign-on location.

The Preston advocates headed to a beach area some 7 km north of the carpark, Lee Yongli, Scott Williamson, Gary Parkinson and Peter Osborne. On first look at this stretch of beach it looked fishable. At the 1:00 pm start sinkers and mulies went seaward but immediately got caught up on weed. We preserved for about an hour but this area just came up as unfishable – seaweed so thick and heavy within a minute terminal gear was imbedded with weed, some so large on trying to retrieve, even with 30 lb line, a break-off resulted. Hence gear was retrieved and cars packed up and we went south again looking for better water. A spot was picked a couple of km north of the carpark - it didn't look as bad, but on trying to fish the same problem occurred. Hence Preston considered a write-off and a conscious decision to open up boundaries and include the Dawesville cut south side was made.

When pumping up tyres at Preston both Gary and Peter tried to contact Mark to advise him of the boundary change as he was so far north he was out of range of mobile phones. Dawesville cut was tried for 3 hours (to early evening) but while fishable no fish bites at all. As fishing was so bad Gary and Scott, and Lee decided to drive home early that night Peter tried this area early Sunday for a couple of hours, again no bites so then drove back to the Preston Carpark for the weight-in and enjoyed reading the paper and a good cup of coffee while waiting

Mark Nurse, Martin Wearmouth, (in company of Peter Butland who had not signed on) made an early start and drove north. They checked conditions and found a less weedy area about 1km from the White Hills Road. This area was also plagued by weed as your rig hot the water but they fished hard Saturday afternoon and evening, with nil result. Martin left early evening due to obligations on the home front. Mark and Peter tried again on Sunday morning, again with zero result so they decided to leave mid-morning, via the White Hills road. On getting onto the main road, Marks mobile picked up the slew of SMS messages from Saturday afternoon/evening and some from Peter on Sunday morning about the boundary change. The advised Peter they would not go down to Preston but drive home as they had a nil result.

#### Local

Two Surfcasters signed on for the local venue for this field day.

George Holman went to his local beach at Floreat on Saturday where he had some problems with swell and some weed and did not find any quality fish - another zero result.

While he had signed on for the Field day, Mark Hansen had a busy weekend and with the weather forecast not being favourable, decided not to put a line in the water.

#### Recommendation

For future Field days with venues on open beaches such as Preston, the Field Day date to be delayed by one week, if by the preceding General Meeting weather forecast gives the following:

- NW winds in excess of 25 km
- Swell in excess of 2 meters (giving dirty water)
- Rain/storms

## **Recipes – Sweet 'N Sour Fish**

#### Thanks to John Curtis

Ingredients: 1 green capsicum cut in half, seeded, and thinly sliced. 2 stalks of celery cut into 25mm lengths. 1 cup of carrot straws. 3 shallots cut into 25mm lengths OR 1 medium white onion cut into eighths 1 piece of preserved ginger sliced very thinly 1 large tin pineapple pieces 3 cups large diced fish pieces 1 tablespoon cider vinegar 1 tablespoon raw sugar 1 dessertspoon soy sauce cornflour for thickening

#### Method:

Place the vegetables, ginger, juice from pineapple pieces, vinegar, raw sugar into a saucepan and simmer for about 15 minutes. Add the fish and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the pineapple pieces and soy sauce. When the mixture comes to the boil, thicken with a little cornflour blended in a cup of water.

Serve with rice or noodles.



## <u>Ray on Barra</u>

HOME VALLEY STATION - GIBB RIVER ROAD. Home Station is situated right on the Gibb River Road and has three rivers on the property. It is an up market Resort but the camping is cheap, \$15pp. There are a lot of attractions on the Station but unfortunately you have to go on paid tours to access them. I decided to go on the fishing tour for four hours (1.00pm to 5.00pm) and was not disappointed. There were just the guide (Callum) and myself as it is early in the season (just opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> May). We set up on the bank of a landlocked section of the Pentecost River, it is only connected occasionally at exceptionally high tides in the wet season and the fish are trapped in it for most of the year. After setting up on the bank of the 'Bait Hole' we spent some time net casting for live bait. It took a while but we ended up with some small mullet and a few prawns.

Baiting up we sat down and prepared to wait as the prime time is later in the day 3.30pm onwards (the water temperature was at its peak). Tides do not make any difference to this isolated section of the river. We experienced a thunderstorm while we were waiting and were drenched, it was so warm that the rain was refreshing and we soon dried out, cooled the temperature a bit and settled the dust but that was about it.

The Kimberly had its driest wet season in eleven years, last year was dry as well so the Kimberley is not as green and wet as is should be, hope the water falls do not dry out before I get to them. I was busy chatting when I missed the first bite and was very disappointed. Now knowing what a Barra bite felt like I paid full attention to the fishing.

I did not miss the second bite and was rewarded by a Barra launching itself into the air, very spectacular. I was very relieved to beach the fish and it measured 67cm, I was ecstatic after so many hours fishing over the last 12 months, finally a decent result. It went into the esky for dinner that night. The follow up was a little later. I was holding one rod and the second was set up resting on a branch of a small tree. Callum grabbed the rod and set the hooks then handed the rod to me. It was a good sized fish, 83cm but as Callum had grabbed the rod I did not class it as a catch for me, but it was a beautiful healthy and solid fish and it was returned to the water. Now the heart was really pumping! Not long after I had another strike and was again rewarded with another Barra the same size as the last. When it flew out of the water it looked like a meter long fish but measured only 84cm, still a big fish. This was also returned to the water and that was the final hook up of the day. A day I will remember with pleasure for a long time as I am sure the size of the fish will grow with every story!! Staying here for a few more days then heading for Drysdale Station and the Mitchel Plateau, then Kalumburu and hopefully some more fishing.







## President's Annual Report for 2015/16

The Surfcasting and Angling Club of W.A. is one of the original fishing clubs formed in W.A. having just completed its 64<sup>th</sup> year. Like all longstanding organisations it has experienced its share of ups and downs. Where we differ from many others that have folded is our ability to weather these storms and move on. It would be fair to say that the last couple of years have been difficult ones but I am pleased to say that presently there is much to be optimistic about. As I will detail later in this report many of the key indicators of membership contentment are showing considerable improvement and give us cause to look forward to continued success as a recreational club.

I would like to acknowledge in this report 2 significant events that occurred during the year just completed. Club stalwart and my predecessor as president, George Holman, completed 50 continuous years as a surfcaster. His contributions across many facets of the club were acknowledged many years ago with the award of life membership. George's contributions and achievements are too numerous to mention here however I know all surfcasters past, present and future have and will continue to benefit from all he has contributed. On a sadder note, this last year saw the passing of our longest serving member Jim Strong. Like George, Jim was awarded life membership many years ago and also has a list of contributions too long to list. I had the good fortune to sit at Jim's table at the first presentation night I attended and thoroughly enjoyed his stories about days gone by. I was also able to witness close hand his expression when he won most improved caster (after about 50 something years membership) for that season! The longevity and success of our club is in no small way due to the contributions of members like Jim and George.

As history will show I was elected as interim President in March 2016 following the resignation of George Holman. At the time I thanked the members for their support of my nomination and looked forward to their support. I am particularly pleased to report the membership have delivered here in spades and I am especially grateful for this. Whilst club success is owned by all the membership and the result of everyone's contributions it is fitting that I say a few words about our committee. George Holman , Michael Pisano, Terry Fuller and Gary Gildersleeves all served for several months before resigning at various stages during the year. I would like to thank them all on behalf of the membership for their contributions. I have already spoken about George but of course Terry Fuller is also a club stalwart and life member with decades of contributions to this club for which we are truly grateful. Gary Gildersleeves is an accomplished drycasting champion with a long history of club membership who has on several occasions stepped up to help with the running of drycasting, both formally and in an informal manner. Michael Pisano is a relatively new member who stepped up to help out when help was short at hand. Given this attitude I am sure we will see Michael continue to be involved in the club.

The current positive state of the club has much to do with the contributions of our Vice President and Treasurer Vic Schilo. I personally have on many occasions contacted Vic to discuss club matters and to seek his advice. I value his opinion and find his considerable experience gleaned from many years of involvement in other organisations to be particularly helpful. His presentation of the financial affairs of the club is detailed yet easy to interpret. From this, good financial decisions can be made and there have been several examples of this over the last 12 months. Vic has also been heavily involved in examining the legal aspects of the club and done much in his role as Australian Anglers Association (AAA) Delegate to improve the club's relationship with external agencies. I feel much progress has been made here for the benefit of everyone in this club.

Probably the most difficult job on a committee is that of secretary. The expectation of having to know everything, do everything yet be told almost nothing is unenviable. For the first time in several years we have had 1 person do all of the traditional roles of a secretary. George Belin is a relatively new member yet put his hand up for this position. He has performed these tasks efficiently, effectively and in good humour. I have also found his approach to problem solving to be invaluable to me as president. The fact I awarded club person of the year to George is evidence of the regard I have for his efforts over the last year.

Our magazine Reel Talk and the website are critical to the smooth running of the club. With the resignation of our editor early this year we were faced with the possibility of publication being interrupted. Fortunately, in stepped Mark Nurse to assume this role and as we know the fine tradition of

monthly Reel Talks continued. Mark has fully embraced this role and has managed to perfect that balance between tradition and innovation. Feedback from members has been very positive and supportive. Mark is continuing to develop the format and is always prepared to listen to members' suggestions. Who knows maybe one day I will catch a decent fish and manage to get on the cover!

The role of Social Organiser is another crucial role within the club. We struggled along without one for a few months and then Pat McKeown stepped in and we haven't looked back since. The Presentation Night was a great success with universal approval. In the past Pat has organised several social events only to receive modest support. Despite this he has continued to approach the role with enthusiasm. There is much we can do in the future to further enhance the social calendar of the club. I am sure Pat will provide advice and help but we need other members to step up and provide genuine support.

Perhaps the area of the club that has struggled the most over the last 12 months has been our drycasting. Despite this our Drycasting Officer Ron Thomas has hung in there. It is particularly pleasing to see that attendance over recent months has improved significantly and hopefully will continue to rise. Had Ron not persisted this would not have been the case. I would also like to acknowledge Ron's contribution to the fundraising sausage sizzle last year which raised about \$1500. Ron's efforts this year have been stellar and we are all very grateful.

Peter Osborne is another long term member and contributor to the club. The role of Field Day Officer is a crucial one which Peter has performed for the last few years. His limitless enthusiasm for fishing is an inspiration for all of us and his willingness to share his extensive knowledge is something we all benefit from. Peter has indicated that he is looking at stepping down from this position in the near future and has offered assistance to anyone who would consider taking on this role. This is an opportunity for a member to make a significant contribution to the club whilst learning from the master.

Ric Parker is a life member of the club who has indicated he won't be re-nominating for committee this year. During the years I have been a surfcaster Ric has been the guy who would take on whatever role needed filling. Most recently it was Property Officer but over the years he has filled almost every position there is. He has also been a generous donator of lures for competition prizes and maker of sinkers for members. I suspect there have also been many other contributions over the 40 or so years of membership. I am sure I speak for all surfcasters past and present when I extend my gratitude to Ric.

Justin Rose joined the committee this year as Recorder and has impressed all with his efficiency and enthusiasm. A very accomplished angler with a considerable depth of knowledge, personal commitments have limited Justin's attendances at meetings however on the occasions he has been able to attend his contributions have been invaluable and we are all hopeful that in future years we will see Justin become even more involved in the club.

Sri Srigandan, Peter Butland, Ken Howells and Bob Henderson have filled the assistant and committee person roles. Their breadth of skills, knowledge and experience have proved invaluable to the management committee over the year. I hope we can squeeze many more years service out of all of them.

Of course there are many functions and jobs within the club performed by members who are not members of the committee. Whilst it is not practical to thank everyone individually this communal contribution is an essential component of any successful organisation. On behalf of the management committee I would like to thank all members for their various contributions and trust this sharing of responsibilities and workload will continue in the future.

In planning for the future it is appropriate that we examine the successes of last year as well areas for improvement. Financially the club remains in good shape overall. As will be seen from the Annual Financial Report the bank balance has remained healthy. Whilst we are not in the business of making money we all appreciate the value of good and sound financial management.

Our membership numbers have remained steady, however over recent months it has been particularly

gratifying to see participation numbers increase significantly. The committee has spent some time looking at ways to accommodate and attract new members. Ultimately, prospective members will join and participate if they see some benefit in being a member. I feel the membership is generally welcoming of new members but all of us need to realise a room full of strangers can be daunting at times and make sure we do all we can to make new members feel welcome.

I touched on the problems with drycasting when discussing Ron Thomas's contributions. It is particularly pleasing to see numbers attending is now at a healthy level and interest is returning. I am optimistic that this will continue. We are currently working on a Drycasting Safety document and hopefully this will be finalised by the new committee early in their term.

Fishing Field Days were well supported throughout the season. There were many highlights with some wonderful fish caught. Many of these achievements were acknowledged on the Presentation Night. Participation in the open competition is high which shows members are using what they are learning at the club events. To me the 2 highlights both occurred at our Bluff Creek field day. Firstly, the initiative of Mark Nurse to arrange a pre competition breakfast at this event was very warmly received and did much to generate club spirit. Also the bag weighed in by Peet Wessels, consisting of 19kg plus with around 10 species was an outstanding angling performance. We all look forward to many great field days this season.

Surfcasters have a long history of outstanding performance in state drycasting championships. This season was especially successful with first place in mens, veterans and junior team competition. There were also several first place finishes in individual competition. Gary Gildersleeves, George Holman, Reece Jones, Morgan Keet, Rob and Peter Pekaar all recorded first place finishes. There were also many other surfcasters who finished very high in the placings. We did also have some success in the Rock and Beach competitions with Ron Thomas placing second in veterans and second finishes for mens and veterans teams.

Whilst the Kalbarri property made a small profit this year, the holiday rental market up there is pretty tough. Over recent years we have spent a considerable amount of club funds on capital improvements to the house. Despite this rental return has been modest. The move to involve a realtor as booking agent has met with some success but we need to be realistic about the future profitability of the property. Perhaps the club is at a stage where we need to examine the viability of the Kalbarri property and start to examine alternatives.

In conclusion I would again like to thank the membership for their support of myself and the committee. I am confident that the next committee will also receive such support and we can all look forward to next year with enthusiasm and optimism.





## Field Day Officers Report

#### SCAC Field Day Report: Preston – 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016

#### Synopsis

The July 2016 field day was located at Preston. All away fisho's went north, with the main group only going up to 7km, while three went nearly up to the White Hill entrance. The forecasts were for strong NW winds, high swell (thus with dirty stirred water) and rain for the weekend. Given these extremes, the results for fish caught by individual anglers ranged from zero, to zero. Hence points scored were restricted to attendance points for those that signed on.

#### The Trip.

The sign on was at 11:00 at the Preston Beach Carpark on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> July with lines down at 1:00 pm with fishing through on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July with the usual lines up time of 10:00 am with the weigh-in to be conducted at 11:00 am at the sign-on location.

The Preston advocates headed to a beach area some 7 km north of the carpark, Lee Yongli, Scott Williamson, Gary Parkinson and Peter Osborne. On first look at this stretch of beach it looked fishable. At the 1:00 pm start sinkers and mulies went seaward but immediately got caught up on weed. We preserved for about an hour but this area just came up as unfishable – seaweed so thick and heavy within a minute terminal gear was imbedded with weed, some so large on trying to retrieve, even with 30 lb line, a break-off resulted. Hence gear was retrieved and cars packed up and we went south again looking for better water. A spot was picked a couple of km north of the carpark - it didn't look as bad, but on trying to fish the same problem occurred. Hence Preston considered a write-off and a conscious decision to open up boundaries and include the Dawesville cut south side was made.

When pumping up tyres at Preston both Gary and Peter tried to contact Mark to advise him of the boundary change as he was so far north he was out of range of mobile phones. Dawesville cut was tried for 3 hours (to early evening) but while fishable no fish bites at all. As fishing was so bad Gary and Scott, and Lee decided to drive home early that night Peter tried this area early Sunday for a couple of hours, again no bites so then drove back to the Preston Carpark for the weight-in and enjoyed reading the paper and a good cup of coffee while waiting

Mark Nurse, Martin Wearmouth, (in company of Peter Butland who had not signed on) made an early start and drove north. They checked conditions and found a less weedy area about 1km from the White Hills Road. This area was also plagued by weed as your rig hot the water but they fished hard Saturday afternoon and evening, with nil result. Martin left early evening due to obligations on the home front. Mark and Peter tried again on Sunday morning, again with zero result so they decided to leave mid-morning, via the White Hills road. On getting onto the main road, Marks mobile picked up the slew of SMS messages from Saturday afternoon/evening and some from Peter on Sunday morning about the boundary change. The advised Peter they would not go down to Preston but drive home as they had a nil result.

#### Local

Two Surfcasters signed on for the local venue for this field day.

George Holman went to his local beach at Floreat on Saturday where he had some problems with swell and some weed and did not find any quality fish - another zero result.

While he had signed on for the Field day, Mark Hansen had a busy weekend and with the weather forecast not being favourable, decided not to put a line in the water.

#### Recommendation

For future Field days with venues on open beaches such as Preston, the Field Day date to be delayed by one week, if by the preceding General Meeting weather forecast gives the following:

- NW winds in excess of 25 km
- Swell in excess of 2 meters (giving dirty water)
- Rain/storms

## **Recipes – Sweet 'N Sour Fish**

#### Thanks to John Curtis

Ingredients: 1 green capsicum cut in half, seeded, and thinly sliced. 2 stalks of celery cut into 25mm lengths. 1 cup of carrot straws. 3 shallots cut into 25mm lengths OR 1 medium white onion cut into eighths 1 piece of preserved ginger sliced very thinly 1 large tin pineapple pieces 3 cups large diced fish pieces 1 tablespoon cider vinegar 1 tablespoon raw sugar 1 dessertspoon soy sauce cornflour for thickening

#### Method:

Place the vegetables, ginger, juice from pineapple pieces, vinegar, raw sugar into a saucepan and simmer for about 15 minutes. Add the fish and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the pineapple pieces and soy sauce. When the mixture comes to the boil, thicken with a little cornflour blended in a cup of water.

Serve with rice or noodles.



## <u>Ray on Barra</u>

HOME VALLEY STATION - GIBB RIVER ROAD. Home Station is situated right on the Gibb River Road and has three rivers on the property. It is an up market Resort but the camping is cheap, \$15pp. There are a lot of attractions on the Station but unfortunately you have to go on paid tours to access them. I decided to go on the fishing tour for four hours (1.00pm to 5.00pm) and was not disappointed. There were just the guide (Callum) and myself as it is early in the season (just opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> May). We set up on the bank of a landlocked section of the Pentecost River, it is only connected occasionally at exceptionally high tides in the wet season and the fish are trapped in it for most of the year. After setting up on the bank of the 'Bait Hole' we spent some time net casting for live bait. It took a while but we ended up with some small mullet and a few prawns.

Baiting up we sat down and prepared to wait as the prime time is later in the day 3.30pm onwards (the water temperature was at its peak). Tides do not make any difference to this isolated section of the river. We experienced a thunderstorm while we were waiting and were drenched, it was so warm that the rain was refreshing and we soon dried out, cooled the temperature a bit and settled the dust but that was about it.

The Kimberly had its driest wet season in eleven years, last year was dry as well so the Kimberley is not as green and wet as is should be, hope the water falls do not dry out before I get to them. I was busy chatting when I missed the first bite and was very disappointed. Now knowing what a Barra bite felt like I paid full attention to the fishing.

I did not miss the second bite and was rewarded by a Barra launching itself into the air, very spectacular. I was very relieved to beach the fish and it measured 67cm, I was ecstatic after so many hours fishing over the last 12 months, finally a decent result. It went into the esky for dinner that night. The follow up was a little later. I was holding one rod and the second was set up resting on a branch of a small tree. Callum grabbed the rod and set the hooks then handed the rod to me. It was a good sized fish, 83cm but as Callum had grabbed the rod I did not class it as a catch for me, but it was a beautiful healthy and solid fish and it was returned to the water. Now the heart was really pumping! Not long after I had another strike and was again rewarded with another Barra the same size as the last. When it flew out of the water it looked like a meter long fish but measured only 84cm, still a big fish. This was also returned to the water and that was the final hook up of the day. A day I will remember with pleasure for a long time as I am sure the size of the fish will grow with every story!! Staying here for a few more days then heading for Drysdale Station and the Mitchel Plateau, then Kalumburu and hopefully some more fishing.







## President's Annual Report for 2015/16

The Surfcasting and Angling Club of W.A. is one of the original fishing clubs formed in W.A. having just completed its 64<sup>th</sup> year. Like all longstanding organisations it has experienced its share of ups and downs. Where we differ from many others that have folded is our ability to weather these storms and move on. It would be fair to say that the last couple of years have been difficult ones but I am pleased to say that presently there is much to be optimistic about. As I will detail later in this report many of the key indicators of membership contentment are showing considerable improvement and give us cause to look forward to continued success as a recreational club.

I would like to acknowledge in this report 2 significant events that occurred during the year just completed. Club stalwart and my predecessor as president, George Holman, completed 50 continuous years as a surfcaster. His contributions across many facets of the club were acknowledged many years ago with the award of life membership. George's contributions and achievements are too numerous to mention here however I know all surfcasters past, present and future have and will continue to benefit from all he has contributed. On a sadder note, this last year saw the passing of our longest serving member Jim Strong. Like George, Jim was awarded life membership many years ago and also has a list of contributions too long to list. I had the good fortune to sit at Jim's table at the first presentation night I attended and thoroughly enjoyed his stories about days gone by. I was also able to witness close hand his expression when he won most improved caster (after about 50 something years membership) for that season! The longevity and success of our club is in no small way due to the contributions of members like Jim and George.

As history will show I was elected as interim President in March 2016 following the resignation of George Holman. At the time I thanked the members for their support of my nomination and looked forward to their support. I am particularly pleased to report the membership have delivered here in spades and I am especially grateful for this. Whilst club success is owned by all the membership and the result of everyone's contributions it is fitting that I say a few words about our committee. George Holman , Michael Pisano, Terry Fuller and Gary Gildersleeves all served for several months before resigning at various stages during the year. I would like to thank them all on behalf of the membership for their contributions. I have already spoken about George but of course Terry Fuller is also a club stalwart and life member with decades of contributions to this club for which we are truly grateful. Gary Gildersleeves is an accomplished drycasting champion with a long history of club membership who has on several occasions stepped up to help with the running of drycasting, both formally and in an informal manner. Michael Pisano is a relatively new member who stepped up to help out when help was short at hand. Given this attitude I am sure we will see Michael continue to be involved in the club.

The current positive state of the club has much to do with the contributions of our Vice President and Treasurer Vic Schilo. I personally have on many occasions contacted Vic to discuss club matters and to seek his advice. I value his opinion and find his considerable experience gleaned from many years of involvement in other organisations to be particularly helpful. His presentation of the financial affairs of the club is detailed yet easy to interpret. From this, good financial decisions can be made and there have been several examples of this over the last 12 months. Vic has also been heavily involved in examining the legal aspects of the club and done much in his role as Australian Anglers Association (AAA) Delegate to improve the club's relationship with external agencies. Probably the most difficult job on a committee is that of secretary. The expectation of having to know everything, do everything yet be told almost nothing is unenviable. The role of Social Organiser is another crucial role within the club. We struggled along without one for a few months and then Pat McKeown stepped in and we haven't looked back since. The Presentation Night was a great success with universal approval. In the past Pat has organised several social events only to receive modest support. Despite this he has continued to approach the role with enthusiasm. There is much we can do in the future to further enhance the social calendar of the club. I am sure Pat will provide advice and help but we need other members to step up and provide genuine support.

Perhaps the area of the club that has struggled the most over the last 12 months has been our drycasting. Despite this our Drycasting Officer Ron Thomas has hung in there. It is particularly pleasing to see that attendance over recent months has improved significantly and hopefully will continue to rise. Had Ron not persisted this would not have been the case. I would also like to acknowledge Ron's contribution to the fundraising sausage sizzle last year which raised about \$1500. Ron's efforts this year have been stellar and we are all very grateful.

Peter Osborne is another long term member and contributor to the club. The role of Field Day Officer is a crucial one which Peter has performed for the last few years. His limitless enthusiasm for fishing is an inspiration for all of us and his willingness to share his extensive knowledge is something we all benefit from. Peter has indicated that he is looking at stepping down from this position in the near future and has offered assistance to anyone who would consider taking on this role. This is an opportunity for a member to make a significant contribution to the club whilst learning from the master.

Ric Parker is a life member of the club who has indicated he won't be re-nominating for committee this year. During the years I have been a surfcaster Ric has been the guy who would take on whatever role needed filling. Most recently it was Property Officer but over the years he has filled almost every position there is. He has also been a generous donator of lures for competition prizes and maker of sinkers for members. I suspect there have also been many other contributions over the 40 or so years of membership. I am sure I speak for all surfcasters past and present when I extend my gratitude to Ric.

Justin Rose joined the committee this year as Recorder and has impressed all with his efficiency and enthusiasm. Also the bag weighed in by Peet Wessels, consisting of 19kg plus with around 10 species was an outstanding angling performance. We all look forward to many great field days this season.

Surfcasters have a long history of outstanding performance in state drycasting championships. This season was especially successful with first place in mens, veterans and junior team competition. There were also several first place finishes in individual competition. Gary Gildersleeves, George Holman, Reece Jones, Morgan Keet, Rob and Peter Pekaar all recorded first place finishes. There were also many other surfcasters who finished very high in the placings. We did also have some success in the Rock and Beach competitions with Ron Thomas placing second in veterans and second finishes for mens and veterans teams.

Whilst the Kalbarri property made a small profit this year, the holiday rental market up there is pretty tough. Over recent years we have spent a considerable amount of club funds on capital improvements to the house. Despite this rental return has been modest. The move to involve a realtor as booking agent has met with some success but we need to be realistic about the future profitability of the property. In conclusion I would again like to thank the membership for their support of myself and the committee. I am confident that the next committee will also receive such support and we can all look forward to next year with enthusiasm and optimism.





## Field Day Officers Report

#### SCAC Field Day Report: Preston – 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016

#### Synopsis

The July 2016 field day was located at Preston. All away fisho's went north, with the main group only going up to 7km, while three went nearly up to the White Hill entrance. The forecasts were for strong NW winds, high swell (thus with dirty stirred water) and rain for the weekend. Given these extremes, the results for fish caught by individual anglers ranged from zero, to zero. Hence points scored were restricted to attendance points for those that signed on.

#### The Trip.

The sign on was at 11:00 at the Preston Beach Carpark on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> July with lines down at 1:00 pm with fishing through on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July with the usual lines up time of 10:00 am with the weigh-in to be conducted at 11:00 am at the sign-on location.

The Preston advocates headed to a beach area some 7 km north of the carpark, Lee Yongli, Scott Williamson, Gary Parkinson and Peter Osborne. On first look at this stretch of beach it looked fishable. At the 1:00 pm start sinkers and mulies went seaward but immediately got caught up on weed. We preserved for about an hour but this area just came up as unfishable – seaweed so thick and heavy within a minute terminal gear was imbedded with weed, some so large on trying to retrieve, even with 30 lb line, a break-off resulted. Hence gear was retrieved and cars packed up and we went south again looking for better water. A spot was picked a couple of km north of the carpark - it didn't look as bad, but on trying to fish the same problem occurred. Hence Preston considered a write-off and a conscious decision to open up boundaries and include the Dawesville cut south side was made.

When pumping up tyres at Preston both Gary and Peter tried to contact Mark to advise him of the boundary change as he was so far north he was out of range of mobile phones. Dawesville cut was tried for 3 hours (to early evening) but while fishable no fish bites at all. As fishing was so bad Gary and Scott, and Lee decided to drive home early that night Peter tried this area early Sunday for a couple of hours, again no bites so then drove back to the Preston Carpark for the weight-in and enjoyed reading the paper and a good cup of coffee while waiting

Mark Nurse, Martin Wearmouth, (in company of Peter Butland who had not signed on) made an early start and drove north. They checked conditions and found a less weedy area about 1km from the White Hills Road. This area was also plagued by weed as your rig hot the water but they fished hard Saturday afternoon and evening, with nil result. Martin left early evening due to obligations on the home front. Mark and Peter tried again on Sunday morning, again with zero result so they decided to leave mid-morning, via the White Hills road. On getting onto the main road, Marks mobile picked up the slew of SMS messages from Saturday afternoon/evening and some from Peter on Sunday morning about the boundary change. The advised Peter they would not go down to Preston but drive home as they had a nil result.

#### Local

Two Surfcasters signed on for the local venue for this field day.

George Holman went to his local beach at Floreat on Saturday where he had some problems with swell and some weed and did not find any quality fish - another zero result.

While he had signed on for the Field day, Mark Hansen had a busy weekend and with the weather forecast not being favourable, decided not to put a line in the water.

#### Recommendation

For future Field days with venues on open beaches such as Preston, the Field Day date to be delayed by one week, if by the preceding General Meeting weather forecast gives the following:

- NW winds in excess of 25 km
- Swell in excess of 2 meters (giving dirty water)
- Rain/storms

## **Recipes – Sweet 'N Sour Fish**

#### Thanks to John Curtis

Ingredients: 1 green capsicum cut in half, seeded, and thinly sliced. 2 stalks of celery cut into 25mm lengths. 1 cup of carrot straws. 3 shallots cut into 25mm lengths OR 1 medium white onion cut into eighths 1 piece of preserved ginger sliced very thinly 1 large tin pineapple pieces 3 cups large diced fish pieces 1 tablespoon cider vinegar 1 tablespoon raw sugar 1 dessertspoon soy sauce cornflour for thickening

#### Method:

Place the vegetables, ginger, juice from pineapple pieces, vinegar, raw sugar into a saucepan and simmer for about 15 minutes. Add the fish and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the pineapple pieces and soy sauce. When the mixture comes to the boil, thicken with a little cornflour blended in a cup of water.

Serve with rice or noodles.



## <u>Ray on Barra</u>

HOME VALLEY STATION - GIBB RIVER ROAD. Home Station is situated right on the Gibb River Road and has three rivers on the property. It is an up market Resort but the camping is cheap, \$15pp. There are a lot of attractions on the Station but unfortunately you have to go on paid tours to access them. I decided to go on the fishing tour for four hours (1.00pm to 5.00pm) and was not disappointed. There were just the guide (Callum) and myself as it is early in the season (just opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> May). We set up on the bank of a landlocked section of the Pentecost River, it is only connected occasionally at exceptionally high tides in the wet season and the fish are trapped in it for most of the year. After setting up on the bank of the 'Bait Hole' we spent some time net casting for live bait. It took a while but we ended up with some small mullet and a few prawns.

Baiting up we sat down and prepared to wait as the prime time is later in the day 3.30pm onwards (the water temperature was at its peak). Tides do not make any difference to this isolated section of the river. We experienced a thunderstorm while we were waiting and were drenched, it was so warm that the rain was refreshing and we soon dried out, cooled the temperature a bit and settled the dust but that was about it.

The Kimberly had its driest wet season in eleven years, last year was dry as well so the Kimberley is not as green and wet as is should be, hope the water falls do not dry out before I get to them. I was busy chatting when I missed the first bite and was very disappointed. Now knowing what a Barra bite felt like I paid full attention to the fishing.

I did not miss the second bite and was rewarded by a Barra launching itself into the air, very spectacular. I was very relieved to beach the fish and it measured 67cm, I was ecstatic after so many hours fishing over the last 12 months, finally a decent result. It went into the esky for dinner that night. The follow up was a little later. I was holding one rod and the second was set up resting on a branch of a small tree. Callum grabbed the rod and set the hooks then handed the rod to me. It was a good sized fish, 83cm but as Callum had grabbed the rod I did not class it as a catch for me, but it was a beautiful healthy and solid fish and it was returned to the water. Now the heart was really pumping! Not long after I had another strike and was again rewarded with another Barra the same size as the last. When it flew out of the water it looked like a meter long fish but measured only 84cm, still a big fish. This was also returned to the water and that was the final hook up of the day. A day I will remember with pleasure for a long time as I am sure the size of the fish will grow with every story!! Staying here for a few more days then heading for Drysdale Station and the Mitchel Plateau, then Kalumburu and hopefully some more fishing.







## President's Annual Report for 2015/16

The Surfcasting and Angling Club of W.A. is one of the original fishing clubs formed in W.A. having just completed its 64<sup>th</sup> year. Like all longstanding organisations it has experienced its share of ups and downs. Where we differ from many others that have folded is our ability to weather these storms and move on. It would be fair to say that the last couple of years have been difficult ones but I am pleased to say that presently there is much to be optimistic about. As I will detail later in this report many of the key indicators of membership contentment are showing considerable improvement and give us cause to look forward to continued success as a recreational club.

I would like to acknowledge in this report 2 significant events that occurred during the year just completed. Club stalwart and my predecessor as president, George Holman, completed 50 continuous years as a surfcaster. His contributions across many facets of the club were acknowledged many years ago with the award of life membership. George's contributions and achievements are too numerous to mention here however I know all surfcasters past, present and future have and will continue to benefit from all he has contributed. On a sadder note, this last year saw the passing of our longest serving member Jim Strong. Like George, Jim was awarded life membership many years ago and also has a list of contributions too long to list. I had the good fortune to sit at Jim's table at the first presentation night I attended and thoroughly enjoyed his stories about days gone by. I was also able to witness close hand his expression when he won most improved caster (after about 50 something years membership) for that season! The longevity and success of our club is in no small way due to the contributions of members like Jim and George.

As history will show I was elected as interim President in March 2016 following the resignation of George Holman. At the time I thanked the members for their support of my nomination and looked forward to their support. I am particularly pleased to report the membership have delivered here in spades and I am especially grateful for this. Whilst club success is owned by all the membership and the result of everyone's contributions it is fitting that I say a few words about our committee. George Holman , Michael Pisano, Terry Fuller and Gary Gildersleeves all served for several months before resigning at various stages during the year. I would like to thank them all on behalf of the membership for their contributions. I have already spoken about George but of course Terry Fuller is also a club stalwart and life member with decades of contributions to this club for which we are truly grateful. Gary Gildersleeves is an accomplished drycasting champion with a long history of club membership who has on several occasions stepped up to help with the running of drycasting, both formally and in an informal manner. Michael Pisano is a relatively new member who stepped up to help out when help was short at hand. Given this attitude I am sure we will see Michael continue to be involved in the club.

The current positive state of the club has much to do with the contributions of our Vice President and Treasurer Vic Schilo. I personally have on many occasions contacted Vic to discuss club matters and to seek his advice. I value his opinion and find his considerable experience gleaned from many years of involvement in other organisations to be particularly helpful. His presentation of the financial affairs of the club is detailed yet easy to interpret. From this, good financial decisions can be made and there have been several examples of this over the last 12 months. Vic has also been heavily involved in examining the legal aspects of the club and done much in his role as Australian Anglers Association (AAA) Delegate to improve the club's relationship with external agencies. I feel much progress has been made here for the benefit of everyone in this club.

Probably the most difficult job on a committee is that of secretary. The expectation of having to know everything, do everything yet be told almost nothing is unenviable. For the first time in several years we have had 1 person do all of the traditional roles of a secretary. George Belin is a relatively new member yet put his hand up for this position. He has performed these tasks efficiently, effectively and in good humour. I have also found his approach to problem solving to be invaluable to me as president. The fact I awarded club person of the year to George is evidence of the regard I have for his efforts over the last year.

Our magazine Reel Talk and the website are critical to the smooth running of the club. With the resignation of our editor early this year we were faced with the possibility of publication being interrupted. Fortunately, in stepped Mark Nurse to assume this role and as we know the fine tradition of

monthly Reel Talks continued. Mark has fully embraced this role and has managed to perfect that balance between tradition and innovation. Feedback from members has been very positive and supportive. Mark is continuing to develop the format and is always prepared to listen to members' suggestions. Who knows maybe one day I will catch a decent fish and manage to get on the cover!

The role of Social Organiser is another crucial role within the club. We struggled along without one for a few months and then Pat McKeown stepped in and we haven't looked back since. The Presentation Night was a great success with universal approval. In the past Pat has organised several social events only to receive modest support. Despite this he has continued to approach the role with enthusiasm. There is much we can do in the future to further enhance the social calendar of the club. I am sure Pat will provide advice and help but we need other members to step up and provide genuine support.

Perhaps the area of the club that has struggled the most over the last 12 months has been our drycasting. Despite this our Drycasting Officer Ron Thomas has hung in there. It is particularly pleasing to see that attendance over recent months has improved significantly and hopefully will continue to rise. Had Ron not persisted this would not have been the case. I would also like to acknowledge Ron's contribution to the fundraising sausage sizzle last year which raised about \$1500. Ron's efforts this year have been stellar and we are all very grateful.

Peter Osborne is another long term member and contributor to the club. The role of Field Day Officer is a crucial one which Peter has performed for the last few years. His limitless enthusiasm for fishing is an inspiration for all of us and his willingness to share his extensive knowledge is something we all benefit from. Peter has indicated that he is looking at stepping down from this position in the near future and has offered assistance to anyone who would consider taking on this role. This is an opportunity for a member to make a significant contribution to the club whilst learning from the master.

Ric Parker is a life member of the club who has indicated he won't be re-nominating for committee this year. During the years I have been a surfcaster Ric has been the guy who would take on whatever role needed filling. Most recently it was Property Officer but over the years he has filled almost every position there is. He has also been a generous donator of lures for competition prizes and maker of sinkers for members. I suspect there have also been many other contributions over the 40 or so years of membership. I am sure I speak for all surfcasters past and present when I extend my gratitude to Ric.

Justin Rose joined the committee this year as Recorder and has impressed all with his efficiency and enthusiasm. A very accomplished angler with a considerable depth of knowledge, personal commitments have limited Justin's attendances at meetings however on the occasions he has been able to attend his contributions have been invaluable and we are all hopeful that in future years we will see Justin become even more involved in the club.

Sri Srigandan, Peter Butland, Ken Howells and Bob Henderson have filled the assistant and committee person roles. Their breadth of skills, knowledge and experience have proved invaluable to the management committee over the year. I hope we can squeeze many more years service out of all of them.

Of course there are many functions and jobs within the club performed by members who are not members of the committee. Whilst it is not practical to thank everyone individually this communal contribution is an essential component of any successful organisation. On behalf of the management committee I would like to thank all members for their various contributions and trust this sharing of responsibilities and workload will continue in the future.

In planning for the future it is appropriate that we examine the successes of last year as well areas for improvement. Financially the club remains in good shape overall. As will be seen from the Annual Financial Report the bank balance has remained healthy. Whilst we are not in the business of making money we all appreciate the value of good and sound financial management.

Our membership numbers have remained steady, however over recent months it has been particularly

gratifying to see participation numbers increase significantly. The committee has spent some time looking at ways to accommodate and attract new members. Ultimately, prospective members will join and participate if they see some benefit in being a member. I feel the membership is generally welcoming of new members but all of us need to realise a room full of strangers can be daunting at times and make sure we do all we can to make new members feel welcome.

I touched on the problems with drycasting when discussing Ron Thomas's contributions. It is particularly pleasing to see numbers attending is now at a healthy level and interest is returning. I am optimistic that this will continue. We are currently working on a Drycasting Safety document and hopefully this will be finalised by the new committee early in their term.

Fishing Field Days were well supported throughout the season. There were many highlights with some wonderful fish caught. Many of these achievements were acknowledged on the Presentation Night. Participation in the open competition is high which shows members are using what they are learning at the club events. To me the 2 highlights both occurred at our Bluff Creek field day. Firstly, the initiative of Mark Nurse to arrange a pre competition breakfast at this event was very warmly received and did much to generate club spirit. Also the bag weighed in by Peet Wessels, consisting of 19kg plus with around 10 species was an outstanding angling performance. We all look forward to many great field days this season.

Surfcasters have a long history of outstanding performance in state drycasting championships. This season was especially successful with first place in mens, veterans and junior team competition. There were also several first place finishes in individual competition. Gary Gildersleeves, George Holman, Reece Jones, Morgan Keet, Rob and Peter Pekaar all recorded first place finishes. There were also many other surfcasters who finished very high in the placings. We did also have some success in the Rock and Beach competitions with Ron Thomas placing second in veterans and second finishes for mens and veterans teams.

Whilst the Kalbarri property made a small profit this year, the holiday rental market up there is pretty tough. Over recent years we have spent a considerable amount of club funds on capital improvements to the house. Despite this rental return has been modest. The move to involve a realtor as booking agent has met with some success but we need to be realistic about the future profitability of the property. Perhaps the club is at a stage where we need to examine the viability of the Kalbarri property and start to examine alternatives.

In conclusion I would again like to thank the membership for their support of myself and the committee. I am confident that the next committee will also receive such support and we can all look forward to next year with enthusiasm and optimism.





## Field Day Officers Report

#### SCAC Field Day Report: Preston – 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016

#### Synopsis

The July 2016 field day was located at Preston. All away fisho's went north, with the main group only going up to 7km, while three went nearly up to the White Hill entrance. The forecasts were for strong NW winds, high swell (thus with dirty stirred water) and rain for the weekend. Given these extremes, the results for fish caught by individual anglers ranged from zero, to zero. Hence points scored were restricted to attendance points for those that signed on.

#### The Trip.

The sign on was at 11:00 at the Preston Beach Carpark on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> July with lines down at 1:00 pm with fishing through on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July with the usual lines up time of 10:00 am with the weigh-in to be conducted at 11:00 am at the sign-on location.

The Preston advocates headed to a beach area some 7 km north of the carpark, Lee Yongli, Scott Williamson, Gary Parkinson and Peter Osborne. On first look at this stretch of beach it looked fishable. At the 1:00 pm start sinkers and mulies went seaward but immediately got caught up on weed. We preserved for about an hour but this area just came up as unfishable – seaweed so thick and heavy within a minute terminal gear was imbedded with weed, some so large on trying to retrieve, even with 30 lb line, a break-off resulted. Hence gear was retrieved and cars packed up and we went south again looking for better water. A spot was picked a couple of km north of the carpark - it didn't look as bad, but on trying to fish the same problem occurred. Hence Preston considered a write-off and a conscious decision to open up boundaries and include the Dawesville cut south side was made.

When pumping up tyres at Preston both Gary and Peter tried to contact Mark to advise him of the boundary change as he was so far north he was out of range of mobile phones. Dawesville cut was tried for 3 hours (to early evening) but while fishable no fish bites at all. As fishing was so bad Gary and Scott, and Lee decided to drive home early that night Peter tried this area early Sunday for a couple of hours, again no bites so then drove back to the Preston Carpark for the weight-in and enjoyed reading the paper and a good cup of coffee while waiting

Mark Nurse, Martin Wearmouth, (in company of Peter Butland who had not signed on) made an early start and drove north. They checked conditions and found a less weedy area about 1km from the White Hills Road. This area was also plagued by weed as your rig hot the water but they fished hard Saturday afternoon and evening, with nil result. Martin left early evening due to obligations on the home front. Mark and Peter tried again on Sunday morning, again with zero result so they decided to leave mid-morning, via the White Hills road. On getting onto the main road, Marks mobile picked up the slew of SMS messages from Saturday afternoon/evening and some from Peter on Sunday morning about the boundary change. The advised Peter they would not go down to Preston but drive home as they had a nil result.

#### Local

Two Surfcasters signed on for the local venue for this field day.

George Holman went to his local beach at Floreat on Saturday where he had some problems with swell and some weed and did not find any quality fish - another zero result.

While he had signed on for the Field day, Mark Hansen had a busy weekend and with the weather forecast not being favourable, decided not to put a line in the water.

#### Recommendation

For future Field days with venues on open beaches such as Preston, the Field Day date to be delayed by one week, if by the preceding General Meeting weather forecast gives the following:

- NW winds in excess of 25 km
- Swell in excess of 2 meters (giving dirty water)
- Rain/storms

## **Recipes – Sweet 'N Sour Fish**

#### Thanks to John Curtis

Ingredients: 1 green capsicum cut in half, seeded, and thinly sliced. 2 stalks of celery cut into 25mm lengths. 1 cup of carrot straws. 3 shallots cut into 25mm lengths OR 1 medium white onion cut into eighths 1 piece of preserved ginger sliced very thinly 1 large tin pineapple pieces 3 cups large diced fish pieces 1 tablespoon cider vinegar 1 tablespoon raw sugar 1 dessertspoon soy sauce cornflour for thickening

#### Method:

Place the vegetables, ginger, juice from pineapple pieces, vinegar, raw sugar into a saucepan and simmer for about 15 minutes. Add the fish and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the pineapple pieces and soy sauce. When the mixture comes to the boil, thicken with a little cornflour blended in a cup of water.

Serve with rice or noodles.



## <u>Ray on Barra</u>

HOME VALLEY STATION - GIBB RIVER ROAD. Home Station is situated right on the Gibb River Road and has three rivers on the property. It is an up market Resort but the camping is cheap, \$15pp. There are a lot of attractions on the Station but unfortunately you have to go on paid tours to access them. I decided to go on the fishing tour for four hours (1.00pm to 5.00pm) and was not disappointed. There were just the guide (Callum) and myself as it is early in the season (just opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> May). We set up on the bank of a landlocked section of the Pentecost River, it is only connected occasionally at exceptionally high tides in the wet season and the fish are trapped in it for most of the year. After setting up on the bank of the 'Bait Hole' we spent some time net casting for live bait. It took a while but we ended up with some small mullet and a few prawns.

Baiting up we sat down and prepared to wait as the prime time is later in the day 3.30pm onwards (the water temperature was at its peak). Tides do not make any difference to this isolated section of the river. We experienced a thunderstorm while we were waiting and were drenched, it was so warm that the rain was refreshing and we soon dried out, cooled the temperature a bit and settled the dust but that was about it.

The Kimberly had its driest wet season in eleven years, last year was dry as well so the Kimberley is not as green and wet as is should be, hope the water falls do not dry out before I get to them. I was busy chatting when I missed the first bite and was very disappointed. Now knowing what a Barra bite felt like I paid full attention to the fishing.

I did not miss the second bite and was rewarded by a Barra launching itself into the air, very spectacular. I was very relieved to beach the fish and it measured 67cm, I was ecstatic after so many hours fishing over the last 12 months, finally a decent result. It went into the esky for dinner that night. The follow up was a little later. I was holding one rod and the second was set up resting on a branch of a small tree. Callum grabbed the rod and set the hooks then handed the rod to me. It was a good sized fish, 83cm but as Callum had grabbed the rod I did not class it as a catch for me, but it was a beautiful healthy and solid fish and it was returned to the water. Now the heart was really pumping! Not long after I had another strike and was again rewarded with another Barra the same size as the last. When it flew out of the water it looked like a meter long fish but measured only 84cm, still a big fish. This was also returned to the water and that was the final hook up of the day. A day I will remember with pleasure for a long time as I am sure the size of the fish will grow with every story!! Staying here for a few more days then heading for Drysdale Station and the Mitchel Plateau, then Kalumburu and hopefully some more fishing.







## President's Annual Report for 2015/16

The Surfcasting and Angling Club of W.A. is one of the original fishing clubs formed in W.A. having just completed its 64<sup>th</sup> year. Like all longstanding organisations it has experienced its share of ups and downs. Where we differ from many others that have folded is our ability to weather these storms and move on. It would be fair to say that the last couple of years have been difficult ones but I am pleased to say that presently there is much to be optimistic about. As I will detail later in this report many of the key indicators of membership contentment are showing considerable improvement and give us cause to look forward to continued success as a recreational club.

I would like to acknowledge in this report 2 significant events that occurred during the year just completed. Club stalwart and my predecessor as president, George Holman, completed 50 continuous years as a surfcaster. His contributions across many facets of the club were acknowledged many years ago with the award of life membership. George's contributions and achievements are too numerous to mention here however I know all surfcasters past, present and future have and will continue to benefit from all he has contributed. On a sadder note, this last year saw the passing of our longest serving member Jim Strong. Like George, Jim was awarded life membership many years ago and also has a list of contributions too long to list. I had the good fortune to sit at Jim's table at the first presentation night I attended and thoroughly enjoyed his stories about days gone by. I was also able to witness close hand his expression when he won most improved caster (after about 50 something years membership) for that season! The longevity and success of our club is in no small way due to the contributions of members like Jim and George.

As history will show I was elected as interim President in March 2016 following the resignation of George Holman. At the time I thanked the members for their support of my nomination and looked forward to their support. I am particularly pleased to report the membership have delivered here in spades and I am especially grateful for this. Whilst club success is owned by all the membership and the result of everyone's contributions it is fitting that I say a few words about our committee. George Holman , Michael Pisano, Terry Fuller and Gary Gildersleeves all served for several months before resigning at various stages during the year. I would like to thank them all on behalf of the membership for their contributions. I have already spoken about George but of course Terry Fuller is also a club stalwart and life member with decades of contributions to this club for which we are truly grateful. Gary Gildersleeves is an accomplished drycasting champion with a long history of club membership who has on several occasions stepped up to help with the running of drycasting, both formally and in an informal manner. Michael Pisano is a relatively new member who stepped up to help out when help was short at hand. Given this attitude I am sure we will see Michael continue to be involved in the club.

The current positive state of the club has much to do with the contributions of our Vice President and Treasurer Vic Schilo. I personally have on many occasions contacted Vic to discuss club matters and to seek his advice. I value his opinion and find his considerable experience gleaned from many years of involvement in other organisations to be particularly helpful. His presentation of the financial affairs of the club is detailed yet easy to interpret. From this, good financial decisions can be made and there have been several examples of this over the last 12 months. Vic has also been heavily involved in examining the legal aspects of the club and done much in his role as Australian Anglers Association (AAA) Delegate to improve the club's relationship with external agencies. I feel much progress has been made here for the benefit of everyone in this club.

Probably the most difficult job on a committee is that of secretary. The expectation of having to know everything, do everything yet be told almost nothing is unenviable. For the first time in several years we have had 1 person do all of the traditional roles of a secretary. George Belin is a relatively new member yet put his hand up for this position. He has performed these tasks efficiently, effectively and in good humour. I have also found his approach to problem solving to be invaluable to me as president. The fact I awarded club person of the year to George is evidence of the regard I have for his efforts over the last year.

Our magazine Reel Talk and the website are critical to the smooth running of the club. With the resignation of our editor early this year we were faced with the possibility of publication being interrupted. Fortunately, in stepped Mark Nurse to assume this role and as we know the fine tradition of

monthly Reel Talks continued. Mark has fully embraced this role and has managed to perfect that balance between tradition and innovation. Feedback from members has been very positive and supportive. Mark is continuing to develop the format and is always prepared to listen to members' suggestions. Who knows maybe one day I will catch a decent fish and manage to get on the cover!

The role of Social Organiser is another crucial role within the club. We struggled along without one for a few months and then Pat McKeown stepped in and we haven't looked back since. The Presentation Night was a great success with universal approval. In the past Pat has organised several social events only to receive modest support. Despite this he has continued to approach the role with enthusiasm. There is much we can do in the future to further enhance the social calendar of the club. I am sure Pat will provide advice and help but we need other members to step up and provide genuine support.

Perhaps the area of the club that has struggled the most over the last 12 months has been our drycasting. Despite this our Drycasting Officer Ron Thomas has hung in there. It is particularly pleasing to see that attendance over recent months has improved significantly and hopefully will continue to rise. Had Ron not persisted this would not have been the case. I would also like to acknowledge Ron's contribution to the fundraising sausage sizzle last year which raised about \$1500. Ron's efforts this year have been stellar and we are all very grateful.

Peter Osborne is another long term member and contributor to the club. The role of Field Day Officer is a crucial one which Peter has performed for the last few years. His limitless enthusiasm for fishing is an inspiration for all of us and his willingness to share his extensive knowledge is something we all benefit from. Peter has indicated that he is looking at stepping down from this position in the near future and has offered assistance to anyone who would consider taking on this role. This is an opportunity for a member to make a significant contribution to the club whilst learning from the master.

Ric Parker is a life member of the club who has indicated he won't be re-nominating for committee this year. During the years I have been a surfcaster Ric has been the guy who would take on whatever role needed filling. Most recently it was Property Officer but over the years he has filled almost every position there is. He has also been a generous donator of lures for competition prizes and maker of sinkers for members. I suspect there have also been many other contributions over the 40 or so years of membership. I am sure I speak for all surfcasters past and present when I extend my gratitude to Ric.

Justin Rose joined the committee this year as Recorder and has impressed all with his efficiency and enthusiasm. A very accomplished angler with a considerable depth of knowledge, personal commitments have limited Justin's attendances at meetings however on the occasions he has been able to attend his contributions have been invaluable and we are all hopeful that in future years we will see Justin become even more involved in the club.

Sri Srigandan, Peter Butland, Ken Howells and Bob Henderson have filled the assistant and committee person roles. Their breadth of skills, knowledge and experience have proved invaluable to the management committee over the year. I hope we can squeeze many more years service out of all of them.

Of course there are many functions and jobs within the club performed by members who are not members of the committee. Whilst it is not practical to thank everyone individually this communal contribution is an essential component of any successful organisation. On behalf of the management committee I would like to thank all members for their various contributions and trust this sharing of responsibilities and workload will continue in the future.

In planning for the future it is appropriate that we examine the successes of last year as well areas for improvement. Financially the club remains in good shape overall. As will be seen from the Annual Financial Report the bank balance has remained healthy. Whilst we are not in the business of making money we all appreciate the value of good and sound financial management.

Our membership numbers have remained steady, however over recent months it has been particularly

gratifying to see participation numbers increase significantly. The committee has spent some time looking at ways to accommodate and attract new members. Ultimately, prospective members will join and participate if they see some benefit in being a member. I feel the membership is generally welcoming of new members but all of us need to realise a room full of strangers can be daunting at times and make sure we do all we can to make new members feel welcome.

I touched on the problems with drycasting when discussing Ron Thomas's contributions. It is particularly pleasing to see numbers attending is now at a healthy level and interest is returning. I am optimistic that this will continue. We are currently working on a Drycasting Safety document and hopefully this will be finalised by the new committee early in their term.

Fishing Field Days were well supported throughout the season. There were many highlights with some wonderful fish caught. Many of these achievements were acknowledged on the Presentation Night. Participation in the open competition is high which shows members are using what they are learning at the club events. To me the 2 highlights both occurred at our Bluff Creek field day. Firstly, the initiative of Mark Nurse to arrange a pre competition breakfast at this event was very warmly received and did much to generate club spirit. Also the bag weighed in by Peet Wessels, consisting of 19kg plus with around 10 species was an outstanding angling performance. We all look forward to many great field days this season.

Surfcasters have a long history of outstanding performance in state drycasting championships. This season was especially successful with first place in mens, veterans and junior team competition. There were also several first place finishes in individual competition. Gary Gildersleeves, George Holman, Reece Jones, Morgan Keet, Rob and Peter Pekaar all recorded first place finishes. There were also many other surfcasters who finished very high in the placings. We did also have some success in the Rock and Beach competitions with Ron Thomas placing second in veterans and second finishes for mens and veterans teams.

Whilst the Kalbarri property made a small profit this year, the holiday rental market up there is pretty tough. Over recent years we have spent a considerable amount of club funds on capital improvements to the house. Despite this rental return has been modest. The move to involve a realtor as booking agent has met with some success but we need to be realistic about the future profitability of the property. Perhaps the club is at a stage where we need to examine the viability of the Kalbarri property and start to examine alternatives.

In conclusion I would again like to thank the membership for their support of myself and the committee. I am confident that the next committee will also receive such support and we can all look forward to next year with enthusiasm and optimism.





## Field Day Officers Report

#### SCAC Field Day Report: Preston – 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016

#### Synopsis

The July 2016 field day was located at Preston. All away fisho's went north, with the main group only going up to 7km, while three went nearly up to the White Hill entrance. The forecasts were for strong NW winds, high swell (thus with dirty stirred water) and rain for the weekend. Given these extremes, the results for fish caught by individual anglers ranged from zero, to zero. Hence points scored were restricted to attendance points for those that signed on.

#### The Trip.

The sign on was at 11:00 at the Preston Beach Carpark on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> July with lines down at 1:00 pm with fishing through on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July with the usual lines up time of 10:00 am with the weigh-in to be conducted at 11:00 am at the sign-on location.

The Preston advocates headed to a beach area some 7 km north of the carpark, Lee Yongli, Scott Williamson, Gary Parkinson and Peter Osborne. On first look at this stretch of beach it looked fishable. At the 1:00 pm start sinkers and mulies went seaward but immediately got caught up on weed. We preserved for about an hour but this area just came up as unfishable – seaweed so thick and heavy within a minute terminal gear was imbedded with weed, some so large on trying to retrieve, even with 30 lb line, a break-off resulted. Hence gear was retrieved and cars packed up and we went south again looking for better water. A spot was picked a couple of km north of the carpark - it didn't look as bad, but on trying to fish the same problem occurred. Hence Preston considered a write-off and a conscious decision to open up boundaries and include the Dawesville cut south side was made.

When pumping up tyres at Preston both Gary and Peter tried to contact Mark to advise him of the boundary change as he was so far north he was out of range of mobile phones. Dawesville cut was tried for 3 hours (to early evening) but while fishable no fish bites at all. As fishing was so bad Gary and Scott, and Lee decided to drive home early that night Peter tried this area early Sunday for a couple of hours, again no bites so then drove back to the Preston Carpark for the weight-in and enjoyed reading the paper and a good cup of coffee while waiting

Mark Nurse, Martin Wearmouth, (in company of Peter Butland who had not signed on) made an early start and drove north. They checked conditions and found a less weedy area about 1km from the White Hills Road. This area was also plagued by weed as your rig hot the water but they fished hard Saturday afternoon and evening, with nil result. Martin left early evening due to obligations on the home front. Mark and Peter tried again on Sunday morning, again with zero result so they decided to leave mid-morning, via the White Hills road. On getting onto the main road, Marks mobile picked up the slew of SMS messages from Saturday afternoon/evening and some from Peter on Sunday morning about the boundary change. The advised Peter they would not go down to Preston but drive home as they had a nil result.

#### Local

Two Surfcasters signed on for the local venue for this field day.

George Holman went to his local beach at Floreat on Saturday where he had some problems with swell and some weed and did not find any quality fish - another zero result.

While he had signed on for the Field day, Mark Hansen had a busy weekend and with the weather forecast not being favourable, decided not to put a line in the water.

#### Recommendation

For future Field days with venues on open beaches such as Preston, the Field Day date to be delayed by one week, if by the preceding General Meeting weather forecast gives the following:

- NW winds in excess of 25 km
- Swell in excess of 2 meters (giving dirty water)
- Rain/storms

## **Recipes – Sweet 'N Sour Fish**

#### Thanks to John Curtis

Ingredients: 1 green capsicum cut in half, seeded, and thinly sliced. 2 stalks of celery cut into 25mm lengths. 1 cup of carrot straws. 3 shallots cut into 25mm lengths OR 1 medium white onion cut into eighths 1 piece of preserved ginger sliced very thinly 1 large tin pineapple pieces 3 cups large diced fish pieces 1 tablespoon cider vinegar 1 tablespoon raw sugar 1 dessertspoon soy sauce cornflour for thickening

#### Method:

Place the vegetables, ginger, juice from pineapple pieces, vinegar, raw sugar into a saucepan and simmer for about 15 minutes. Add the fish and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the pineapple pieces and soy sauce. When the mixture comes to the boil, thicken with a little cornflour blended in a cup of water.

Serve with rice or noodles.



## <u>Ray on Barra</u>

HOME VALLEY STATION - GIBB RIVER ROAD. Home Station is situated right on the Gibb River Road and has three rivers on the property. It is an up market Resort but the camping is cheap, \$15pp. There are a lot of attractions on the Station but unfortunately you have to go on paid tours to access them. I decided to go on the fishing tour for four hours (1.00pm to 5.00pm) and was not disappointed. There were just the guide (Callum) and myself as it is early in the season (just opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> May). We set up on the bank of a landlocked section of the Pentecost River, it is only connected occasionally at exceptionally high tides in the wet season and the fish are trapped in it for most of the year. After setting up on the bank of the 'Bait Hole' we spent some time net casting for live bait. It took a while but we ended up with some small mullet and a few prawns.

Baiting up we sat down and prepared to wait as the prime time is later in the day 3.30pm onwards (the water temperature was at its peak). Tides do not make any difference to this isolated section of the river. We experienced a thunderstorm while we were waiting and were drenched, it was so warm that the rain was refreshing and we soon dried out, cooled the temperature a bit and settled the dust but that was about it.

The Kimberly had its driest wet season in eleven years, last year was dry as well so the Kimberley is not as green and wet as is should be, hope the water falls do not dry out before I get to them. I was busy chatting when I missed the first bite and was very disappointed. Now knowing what a Barra bite felt like I paid full attention to the fishing.

I did not miss the second bite and was rewarded by a Barra launching itself into the air, very spectacular. I was very relieved to beach the fish and it measured 67cm, I was ecstatic after so many hours fishing over the last 12 months, finally a decent result. It went into the esky for dinner that night. The follow up was a little later. I was holding one rod and the second was set up resting on a branch of a small tree. Callum grabbed the rod and set the hooks then handed the rod to me. It was a good sized fish, 83cm but as Callum had grabbed the rod I did not class it as a catch for me, but it was a beautiful healthy and solid fish and it was returned to the water. Now the heart was really pumping! Not long after I had another strike and was again rewarded with another Barra the same size as the last. When it flew out of the water it looked like a meter long fish but measured only 84cm, still a big fish. This was also returned to the water and that was the final hook up of the day. A day I will remember with pleasure for a long time as I am sure the size of the fish will grow with every story!! Staying here for a few more days then heading for Drysdale Station and the Mitchel Plateau, then Kalumburu and hopefully some more fishing.







Like all longstanding organisations it has experienced its share of ups and downs. Where we differ from many others that have folded is our ability to weather these storms and move on. It would be fair to say that the last couple of years have been difficult ones but I am pleased to say that presently there is much to be optimistic about. As I will detail later in this report many of the key indicators of membership contentment are showing considerable improvement and give us cause to look forward to continued success as a recreational club.

I would like to acknowledge in this report 2 significant events that occurred during the year just completed. Club stalwart and my predecessor as president, George Holman, completed 50 continuous years as a surfcaster. His contributions across many facets of the club were acknowledged many years ago with the award of life membership. George's contributions and achievements are too numerous to mention here however I know all surfcasters past, present and future have and will continue to benefit from all he has contributed. On a sadder note, this last year saw the passing of our longest serving member Jim Strong. Like George, Jim was awarded life membership many years ago and also has a list of contributions too long to list. I had the good fortune to sit at Jim's table at the first presentation night I attended and thoroughly enjoyed his stories about days gone by. I was also able to witness close hand his expression when he won most improved caster (after about 50 something years membership) for that season! The longevity and success of our club is in no small way due to the contributions of members like Jim and George.

As history will show I was elected as interim President in March 2016 following the resignation of George Holman. At the time I thanked the members for their support of my nomination and looked forward to their support. I am particularly pleased to report the membership have delivered here in spades and I am especially grateful for this. Whilst club success is owned by all the membership and the result of everyone's contributions it is fitting that I say a few words about our committee. George Holman , Michael Pisano, Terry Fuller and Gary Gildersleeves all served for several months before resigning at various stages during the year. I would like to thank them all on behalf of the membership for their contributions. I have already spoken about George but of course Terry Fuller is also a club stalwart and life member with decades of contributions to this club for which we are truly grateful. Gary Gildersleeves is an accomplished drycasting champion with a long history of club membership who has on several occasions stepped up to help with the running of drycasting, both formally and in an informal manner. Michael Pisano is a relatively new member who stepped up to help out when help was short at hand. Given this attitude I am sure we will see Michael continue to be involved in the club.

The current positive state of the club has much to do with the contributions of our Vice President and Treasurer Vic Schilo. I personally have on many occasions contacted Vic to discuss club matters and to seek his advice. I value his opinion and find his considerable experience gleaned from many years of involvement in other organisations to be particularly helpful. His presentation of the financial affairs of the club is detailed yet easy to interpret. From this, good financial decisions can be made and there have been several examples of this over the last 12 months. Vic has also been heavily involved in examining the legal aspects of the club and done much in his role as Australian Anglers Association (AAA) Delegate to improve the club's relationship with external agencies. I feel much progress has been made here for the benefit of everyone in this club.

Probably the most difficult job on a committee is that of secretary. The expectation of having to know everything, do everything yet be told almost nothing is unenviable. For the first time in several years we have had 1 person do all of the traditional roles of a secretary. George Belin is a relatively new member yet put his hand up for this position. He has performed these tasks efficiently, effectively and in good humour. I have also found his approach to problem solving to be invaluable to me as president. The fact I awarded club person of the year to George is evidence of the regard I have for his efforts over the last year.

Our magazine Reel Talk and the website are critical to the smooth running of the club. With the resignation of our editor early this year we were faced with the possibility of publication being interrupted. Fortunately, in stepped Mark Nurse to assume this role and as we know the fine tradition of

monthly Reel Talks continued. Mark has fully embraced this role and has managed to perfect that balance between tradition and innovation. Feedback from members has been very positive and supportive. Mark is continuing to develop the format and is always prepared to listen to members' suggestions. Who knows maybe one day I will catch a decent fish and manage to get on the cover!

The role of Social Organiser is another crucial role within the club. We struggled along without one for a few months and then Pat McKeown stepped in and we haven't looked back since. The Presentation Night was a great success with universal approval. In the past Pat has organised several social events only to receive modest support. Despite this he has continued to approach the role with enthusiasm. There is much we can do in the future to further enhance the social calendar of the club. I am sure Pat will provide advice and help but we need other members to step up and provide genuine support.

Perhaps the area of the club that has struggled the most over the last 12 months has been our drycasting. Despite this our Drycasting Officer Ron Thomas has hung in there. It is particularly pleasing to see that attendance over recent months has improved significantly and hopefully will continue to rise. Had Ron not persisted this would not have been the case. I would also like to acknowledge Ron's contribution to the fundraising sausage sizzle last year which raised about \$1500. Ron's efforts this year have been stellar and we are all very grateful.

Peter Osborne is another long term member and contributor to the club. The role of Field Day Officer is a crucial one which Peter has performed for the last few years. His limitless enthusiasm for fishing is an inspiration for all of us and his willingness to share his extensive knowledge is something we all benefit from. Peter has indicated that he is looking at stepping down from this position in the near future and has offered assistance to anyone who would consider taking on this role. This is an opportunity for a member to make a significant contribution to the club whilst learning from the master.

Ric Parker is a life member of the club who has indicated he won't be re-nominating for committee this year. During the years I have been a surfcaster Ric has been the guy who would take on whatever role needed filling. Most recently it was Property Officer but over the years he has filled almost every position there is. He has also been a generous donator of lures for competition prizes and maker of sinkers for members. I suspect there have also been many other contributions over the 40 or so years of membership. I am sure I speak for all surfcasters past and present when I extend my gratitude to Ric.

Justin Rose joined the committee this year as Recorder and has impressed all with his efficiency and enthusiasm. A very accomplished angler with a considerable depth of knowledge, personal commitments have limited Justin's attendances at meetings however on the occasions he has been able to attend his contributions have been invaluable and we are all hopeful that in future years we will see Justin become even more involved in the club.

Sri Srigandan, Peter Butland, Ken Howells and Bob Henderson have filled the assistant and committee person roles. Their breadth of skills, knowledge and experience have proved invaluable to the management committee over the year. I hope we can squeeze many more years service out of all of them.

Of course there are many functions and jobs within the club performed by members who are not members of the committee. Whilst it is not practical to thank everyone individually this communal contribution is an essential component of any successful organisation. On behalf of the management committee I would like to thank all members for their various contributions and trust this sharing of responsibilities and workload will continue in the future.

In planning for the future it is appropriate that we examine the successes of last year as well areas for improvement. Financially the club remains in good shape overall. As will be seen from the Annual Financial Report the bank balance has remained healthy. Whilst we are not in the business of making money we all appreciate the value of good and sound financial management.

Our membership numbers have remained steady, however over recent months it has been particularly

gratifying to see participation numbers increase significantly. The committee has spent some time looking at ways to accommodate and attract new members. Ultimately, prospective members will join and participate if they see some benefit in being a member. I feel the membership is generally welcoming of new members but all of us need to realise a room full of strangers can be daunting at times and make sure we do all we can to make new members feel welcome.

I touched on the problems with drycasting when discussing Ron Thomas's contributions. It is particularly pleasing to see numbers attending is now at a healthy level and interest is returning. I am optimistic that this will continue. We are currently working on a Drycasting Safety document and hopefully this will be finalised by the new committee early in their term.

Fishing Field Days were well supported throughout the season. There were many highlights with some wonderful fish caught. Many of these achievements were acknowledged on the Presentation Night. Participation in the open competition is high which shows members are using what they are learning at the club events. To me the 2 highlights both occurred at our Bluff Creek field day. Firstly, the initiative of Mark Nurse to arrange a pre competition breakfast at this event was very warmly received and did much to generate club spirit. Also the bag weighed in by Peet Wessels, consisting of 19kg plus with around 10 species was an outstanding angling performance. We all look forward to many great field days this season.

Surfcasters have a long history of outstanding performance in state drycasting championships. This season was especially successful with first place in mens, veterans and junior team competition. There were also several first place finishes in individual competition. Gary Gildersleeves, George Holman, Reece Jones, Morgan Keet, Rob and Peter Pekaar all recorded first place finishes. There were also many other surfcasters who finished very high in the placings. We did also have some success in the Rock and Beach competitions with Ron Thomas placing second in veterans and second finishes for mens and veterans teams.

Whilst the Kalbarri property made a small profit this year, the holiday rental market up there is pretty tough. Over recent years we have spent a considerable amount of club funds on capital improvements to the house. Despite this rental return has been modest. The move to involve a realtor as booking agent has met with some success but we need to be realistic about the future profitability of the property. Perhaps the club is at a stage where we need to examine the viability of the Kalbarri property and start to examine alternatives.

In conclusion I would again like to thank the membership for their support of myself and the committee. I am confident that the next committee will also receive such support and we can all look forward to next year with enthusiasm and optimism.





## Field Day Officers Report

#### SCAC Field Day Report: Preston – 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016

#### Synopsis

The July 2016 field day was located at Preston. All away fisho's went north, with the main group only going up to 7km, while three went nearly up to the White Hill entrance. The forecasts were for strong NW winds, high swell (thus with dirty stirred water) and rain for the weekend. Given these extremes, the results for fish caught by individual anglers ranged from zero, to zero. Hence points scored were restricted to attendance points for those that signed on.

#### The Trip.

The sign on was at 11:00 at the Preston Beach Carpark on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> July with lines down at 1:00 pm with fishing through on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July with the usual lines up time of 10:00 am with the weigh-in to be conducted at 11:00 am at the sign-on location.

The Preston advocates headed to a beach area some 7 km north of the carpark, Lee Yongli, Scott Williamson, Gary Parkinson and Peter Osborne. On first look at this stretch of beach it looked fishable. At the 1:00 pm start sinkers and mulies went seaward but immediately got caught up on weed. We preserved for about an hour but this area just came up as unfishable – seaweed so thick and heavy within a minute terminal gear was imbedded with weed, some so large on trying to retrieve, even with 30 lb line, a break-off resulted. Hence gear was retrieved and cars packed up and we went south again looking for better water. A spot was picked a couple of km north of the carpark - it didn't look as bad, but on trying to fish the same problem occurred. Hence Preston considered a write-off and a conscious decision to open up boundaries and include the Dawesville cut south side was made.

When pumping up tyres at Preston both Gary and Peter tried to contact Mark to advise him of the boundary change as he was so far north he was out of range of mobile phones. Dawesville cut was tried for 3 hours (to early evening) but while fishable no fish bites at all. As fishing was so bad Gary and Scott, and Lee decided to drive home early that night Peter tried this area early Sunday for a couple of hours, again no bites so then drove back to the Preston Carpark for the weight-in and enjoyed reading the paper and a good cup of coffee while waiting

Mark Nurse, Martin Wearmouth, (in company of Peter Butland who had not signed on) made an early start and drove north. They checked conditions and found a less weedy area about 1km from the White Hills Road. This area was also plagued by weed as your rig hot the water but they fished hard Saturday afternoon and evening, with nil result. Martin left early evening due to obligations on the home front. Mark and Peter tried again on Sunday morning, again with zero result so they decided to leave mid-morning, via the White Hills road. On getting onto the main road, Marks mobile picked up the slew of SMS messages from Saturday afternoon/evening and some from Peter on Sunday morning about the boundary change. The advised Peter they would not go down to Preston but drive home as they had a nil result.

#### Local

Two Surfcasters signed on for the local venue for this field day.

George Holman went to his local beach at Floreat on Saturday where he had some problems with swell and some weed and did not find any quality fish - another zero result.

While he had signed on for the Field day, Mark Hansen had a busy weekend and with the weather forecast not being favourable, decided not to put a line in the water.

#### Recommendation

For future Field days with venues on open beaches such as Preston, the Field Day date to be delayed by one week, if by the preceding General Meeting weather forecast gives the following:

## **Recipes – Sweet 'N Sour Fish**

#### Thanks to John Curtis

Ingredients: 1 green capsicum cut in half, seeded, and thinly sliced. 2 stalks of celery cut into 25mm lengths. 1 cup of carrot straws. 3 shallots cut into 25mm lengths OR 1 medium white onion cut into eighths 1 piece of preserved ginger sliced very thinly 1 large tin pineapple pieces 3 cups large diced fish pieces 1 tablespoon cider vinegar 1 tablespoon raw sugar 1 dessertspoon soy sauce cornflour for thickening

#### Method:

Place the vegetables, ginger, juice from pineapple pieces, vinegar, raw sugar into a saucepan and simmer for about 15 minutes. Add the fish and cook for a further 5 minutes. Add the pineapple pieces and soy sauce. When the mixture comes to the boil, thicken with a little cornflour blended in a cup of water.

Serve with rice or noodles.



## <u>Ray on Barra</u>

HOME VALLEY STATION - GIBB RIVER ROAD. Home Station is situated right on the Gibb River Road and has three rivers on the property. It is an up market Resort but the camping is cheap, \$15pp. There are a lot of attractions on the Station but unfortunately you have to go on paid tours to access them. I decided to go on the fishing tour for four hours (1.00pm to 5.00pm) and was not disappointed. There were just the guide (Callum) and myself as it is early in the season (just opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> May). We set up on the bank of a landlocked section of the Pentecost River, it is only connected occasionally at exceptionally high tides in the wet season and the fish are trapped in it for most of the year. After setting up on the bank of the 'Bait Hole' we spent some time net casting for live bait. It took a while but we ended up with some small mullet and a few prawns.

Baiting up we sat down and prepared to wait as the prime time is later in the day 3.30pm onwards (the water temperature was at its peak). Tides do not make any difference to this isolated section of the river. We experienced a thunderstorm while we were waiting and were drenched, it was so warm that the rain was refreshing and we soon dried out, cooled the temperature a bit and settled the dust but that was about it.

The Kimberly had its driest wet season in eleven years, last year was dry as well so the Kimberley is not as green and wet as is should be, hope the water falls do not dry out before I get to them. I was busy chatting when I missed the first bite and was very disappointed. Now knowing what a Barra bite felt like I paid full attention to the fishing.

I did not miss the second bite and was rewarded by a Barra launching itself into the air, very spectacular. I was very relieved to beach the fish and it measured 67cm, I was ecstatic after so many hours fishing over the last 12 months, finally a decent result. It went into the esky for dinner that night. The follow up was a little later. I was holding one rod and the second was set up resting on a branch of a small tree. Callum grabbed the rod and set the hooks then handed the rod to me. It was a good sized fish, 83cm but as Callum had grabbed the rod I did not class it as a catch for me, but it was a beautiful healthy and solid fish and it was returned to the water. Now the heart was really pumping! Not long after I had another strike and was again rewarded with another Barra the same size as the last. When it flew out of the water it looked like a meter long fish but measured only 84cm, still a big fish. This was also returned to the water and that was the final hook up of the day. A day I will remember with pleasure for a long time as I am sure the size of the fish will grow with every story!! Staying here for a few more days then heading for Drysdale Station and the Mitchel Plateau, then Kalumburu and hopefully some more fishing.







## President's Annual Report for 2015/16

The Surfcasting and Angling Club of W.A. is one of the original fishing clubs formed in W.A. having just completed its 64<sup>th</sup> year. Like all longstanding organisations it has experienced its share of ups and downs. Where we differ from many others that have folded is our ability to weather these storms and move on. It would be fair to say that the last couple of years have been difficult ones but I am pleased to say that presently there is much to be optimistic about. As I will detail later in this report many of the key indicators of membership contentment are showing considerable improvement and give us cause to look forward to continued success as a recreational club.

I would like to acknowledge in this report 2 significant events that occurred during the year just completed. Club stalwart and my predecessor as president, George Holman, completed 50 continuous years as a surfcaster. His contributions across many facets of the club were acknowledged many years ago with the award of life membership. George's contributions and achievements are too numerous to mention here however I know all surfcasters past, present and future have and will continue to benefit from all he has contributed. On a sadder note, this last year saw the passing of our longest serving member Jim Strong. Like George, Jim was awarded life membership many years ago and also has a list of contributions too long to list. I had the good fortune to sit at Jim's table at the first presentation night I attended and thoroughly enjoyed his stories about days gone by. I was also able to witness close hand his expression when he won most improved caster (after about 50 something years membership) for that season! The longevity and success of our club is in no small way due to the contributions of members like Jim and George.

As history will show I was elected as interim President in March 2016 following the resignation of George Holman. At the time I thanked the members for their support of my nomination and looked forward to their support. I am particularly pleased to report the membership have delivered here in spades and I am especially grateful for this. Whilst club success is owned by all the membership and the result of everyone's contributions it is fitting that I say a few words about our committee. George Holman , Michael Pisano, Terry Fuller and Gary Gildersleeves all served for several months before resigning at various stages during the year. I would like to thank them all on behalf of the membership for their contributions. I have already spoken about George but of course Terry Fuller is also a club stalwart and life member with decades of contributions to this club for which we are truly grateful. Gary Gildersleeves is an accomplished drycasting champion with a long history of club membership who has on several occasions stepped up to help with the running of drycasting, both formally and in an informal manner. Michael Pisano is a relatively new member who stepped up to help out when help was short at hand. Given this attitude I am sure we will see Michael continue to be involved in the club.

The current positive state of the club has much to do with the contributions of our Vice President and Treasurer Vic Schilo. I personally have on many occasions contacted Vic to discuss club matters and to seek his advice. I value his opinion and find his considerable experience gleaned from many years of involvement in other organisations to be particularly helpful. His presentation of the financial affairs of the club is detailed yet easy to interpret. From this, good financial decisions can be made and there have been several examples of this over the last 12 months. Vic has also been heavily involved in examining the legal aspects of the club and done much in his role as Australian Anglers Association (AAA) Delegate to improve the club's relationship with external agencies. Probably the most difficult job on a committee is that of secretary. The expectation of having to know everything, do everything yet be told almost nothing is unenviable. The fact I awarded club person of the year to George is evidence of the regard I have for his efforts over the last year.

It is particularly pleasing to see that attendance over recent months has improved significantly and hopefully will continue to rise. Had Ron not persisted this would not have been the case. I would also like to acknowledge Ron's contribution to the fundraising sausage sizzle last year which raised about \$1500. Ron's efforts this year have been stellar and we are all very grateful.

Peter Osborne is another long term member and contributor to the club. The role of Field Day Officer is a crucial one which Peter has performed for the last few years. His limitless enthusiasm for fishing is an inspiration for all of us and his willingness to share his extensive knowledge is something we all benefit from. Peter has indicated that he is looking at stepping down from this position in the near future and has offered assistance to anyone who would consider taking on this role. This is an opportunity for a member to make a significant contribution to the club whilst learning from the master.

Ric Parker is a life member of the club who has indicated he won't be re-nominating for committee this year. During the years I have been a surfcaster Ric has been the guy who would take on whatever role needed filling. Most recently it was Property Officer but over the years he has filled almost every position there is. He has also been a generous donator of lures for competition prizes and maker of sinkers for members. I suspect there have also been many other contributions over the 40 or so years of membership. I am sure I speak for all surfcasters past and present when I extend my gratitude to Ric.

Justin Rose joined the committee this year as Recorder and has impressed all with his efficiency and enthusiasm. A very accomplished angler with a considerable depth of knowledge, personal commitments have limited Justin's attendances at meetings however on the occasions he has been able to attend his contributions have been invaluable and we are all hopeful that in future years we will see Justin become even more involved in the club.

Sri Srigandan, Peter Butland, Ken Howells and Bob Henderson have filled the assistant and committee person roles. Their breadth of skills, knowledge and experience have proved invaluable to the management committee over the year. I hope we can squeeze many more years service out of all of them.

Of course there are many functions and jobs within the club performed by members who are not members of the committee. Whilst it is not practical to thank everyone individually this communal contribution is an essential component of any successful organisation. On behalf of the management committee I would like to thank all members for their various contributions and trust this sharing of responsibilities and workload will continue in the future.

In planning for the future it is appropriate that we examine the successes of last year as well areas for improvement. Financially the club remains in good shape overall. As will be seen from the Annual Financial Report the bank balance has remained healthy. gratifying to see participation numbers increase significantly. The committee has spent some time looking at ways to accommodate and attract new members. Ultimately, prospective members will join and participate if they see some benefit in being a member. I feel the membership is generally welcoming of new members but all of us need to realise a room full of strangers can be daunting at times and make sure we do all we can to make new members feel welcome.

I touched on the problems with drycasting when discussing Ron Thomas's contributions. It is particularly pleasing to see numbers attending is now at a healthy level and interest is returning. I am optimistic that this will continue. We are currently working on a Drycasting Safety document and hopefully this will be finalised by the new committee early in their term.

Fishing Field Days were well supported throughout the season. There were many highlights with some wonderful fish caught. Many of these achievements were acknowledged on the Presentation Night. Participation in the open competition is high which shows members are using what they are learning at the club events. To me the 2 highlights both occurred at our Bluff Creek field day. Firstly, the initiative of Mark Nurse to arrange a pre competition breakfast at this event was very warmly received and did much to generate club spirit. Also the bag weighed in by Peet Wessels, consisting of 19kg plus with around 10 species was an outstanding angling performance. We all look forward to many great field days this season.

Surfcasters have a long history of outstanding performance in state drycasting championships. This season was especially successful with first place in mens, veterans and junior team competition. There were also several first place finishes in individual competition. Gary Gildersleeves, George Holman, Reece Jones, Morgan Keet, Rob and Peter Pekaar all recorded first place finishes. There were also many other surfcasters who finished very high in the placings. We did also have some success in the Rock and Beach competitions with Ron Thomas placing second in veterans and second finishes for mens and veterans teams.

Whilst the Kalbarri property made a small profit this year, the holiday rental market up there is pretty tough. Over recent years we have spent a considerable amount of club funds on capital improvements to the house. Despite this rental return has been modest. The move to involve a realtor as booking agent has met with some success but we need to be realistic about the future profitability of the property. Perhaps the club is at a stage where we need to examine the viability of the Kalbarri property and start to examine alternatives.

In conclusion I would again like to thank the membership for their support of myself and the committee. I am confident that the next committee will also receive such support and we can all look forward to next year with enthusiasm and optimism.


