The weather was average, with a cloudy sky and a cold-night and the wind remained a Sou-Wester and strong until about 2 a.m. on Sunday morning, causing very heavy and weedy fishing conditions with things rather in favour of the fish than those optomists, the Anglers.

The dawn was calm but fruitless, as the heavy cloud did not give a definite light change and the fish apparently weren't on the bite. Total weight of fish $119\frac{1}{4}$ lbs included a 25 lb sh

As the Bi-Annual Fishing Competition now in progress ends on the 30th. November 1957, the Committee has submitted a new competition for your approval.

NEW

Section 1. Heaviest Shark or Ray.

Section 2. Heaviest Fish other than Shark or Ray.

Section 3. Best effort weight of fish over line ratio.

(Excludes Sharks and Rays).

Section 4. Heaviest Fish caught on a Spinner.

Section 5. Points per pound of fish entered.

(Excludes Sharks and Rays)

Section 6. Single Hander.

Points to be scored on a 3, 2, 1 basis for the first 3 places in each Section each month Greatest number of points at end of competition wins.

The Rules of the Competition:

- 1. All fish must be caught on Rod and Reel in accordance with Club Rules.
- 2. No fish will win more than one Section, excepting those caught in Section 6., but points for all fish, excepting Shark or Ray, will be counted for Section 5.
- 3. In all Sections, excepting 5 and 7, monthly awards will be made.
- 4. All entries must be witnessed and submitted on official Club Entry Forms, excepting fish caught on official Field Days. (See Rule 7).
- The competition will run from 1st December, 1957 until 31st May, 1958.
- 6. Monthly entries must be handed in by the following General Meeting night.
- 7. Fish caught on a Field Day which are entered in Sections 3, 4, and 6, must be entered on official Entry Form.
- 8. The Committee has the power of disqualifying any entry which, in their opinion, has not conformed to the Club Rules or there is doubt of its authenticity.
