- 7. Personobtaining key is responsible for collecting and paying in fees to key custodian.
- 8. Huts to be left clean after use.
- 9. No empty milk bottles, tins, etc., to be left in hut on departure.
- 10. All crockery etc., to be washed and stacked away.
- 11. Kero stoves (2) and lamps are provided. Fuel for same to be replaced by users.
- 12. Rubbish to be burried well clear of huts, as digging can cause erosion.
- No fish or bait to be bought into huts except in ice boxes.
- 14. Any damage to huts or equipment to be repaired or replaced by person responsible.
- 15. Toilets a bore pan and pedestal is provided and must be used at all times. Hessian and piping is also provided.
- 16. Huts to be securely locked when leaving.
- 17. Infringements of these rules could lead to a refusal of future hire. Your Committee would like to see these huts used frequently as this is our best protection against vandalism.
