Well, we had everything in our favour for November cast. Beautiful weather and a good casting area. Only thing that was missing was you - the members. We managed a total attendance of 28 - Not good when you consider we had 21 last cast in very wet conditions. Nevertheless, Yokine Reserve produced some very good casting, with two Club Records being broken. The first to go was a long standing record in the L.L. Distance set by John Devitt on 6/7/1970 with a cast of 156.06m. Hew Hoy Yew, affectionately known as Hewie, was in fine casting form and sent down a sizzler to record 157.88m. Scored a total of 69 in D.H. accuracy, 18 in the S.H. and ran out winner for the day with a total of 127 points. Good casting Dave, keep it up. Jim Strong was casting like a champion, especially in the S.H. accuracy. Unfortunately, after scoring 8-8-9 with his first three casts, he bombed out with his last cast. Nevertheless, Jim finished the day with a good total of 108 points.

Looks like our casting lane will have to be extended. All we need is more attendance to make the competition keener, and I'm sure we will see more records broken this year.

The Casting Clinic was held at the Yokine Reserve on November 19th. It was very good, although the attendance of interested people could have been better, almost 90 people came, talked to us about casting, had a go at casting and learned something. But we, the members present learned a few things too. We got an insight into the art of fly fishing, casting a fly and what sort of flies there are and are used to catch trouts and salt water fish too. The fly tying is quite an art. We saw a rod, a graphit fibre rod, no thicker than about 3/8 of an inch and about \$270 worth.

And the reels for this sort of fishing. If you want to be a real enthusiast start this type of fishing. No bait is needed either.
