
BADGES

DUTCH OVEN

SOUSED HERRINGS

6-8 herrings
45ml (3tbs) Dijon Mustard
25g (1oz) capers
8 gherkins
45øml (3/4pint) wine vinegar
4 bay leaves
Carrots- sliced thin into


julienne strips

SHARON OSBORNE

2 cloves
25g (loz) sugar
12 allspice berries
5ml (1tbs) salt
2 onions, sliced into
rings

- Set the oven at 150degrees C, 350 degrees F. Discard the heads and tails from the herrings and clean the fish thoroughly. Remove the bones and press the fish open, skin side down. Spread with mustard. Place a few capers and a gherkin at the head end and roll the fish up. Secure with cocktail sticks.
- Place the onion rings and the carrot strips at the bottom of an oven proof dish, pu the fish on top and add the vinegar and the water. Add the remaining ingedients and cover with a lid or foil.
- Bake for 1 and half hours. Transfer the fish to a serving dish, strain over the cooking liquid and chill well.
- 4. Serve cold with bread and salad.
