DRY CASTING - 5TH JANUARY, 1964

Twenty three seniors, three juniors and one visitor attended the January Casting Day at Floreat Park Oval. The conditions were anything but perfect as we were casting into a strong Westerly wind on our right front and as a result scoring was far below our usual high standard.

Bob Jensen and Eric Sullivan were really in trouble in the distance event - Bob's 3 or 4 practice casts were all "break of " and Eric was lucky to get one in in the competition. Bob had one of those days! The score sheets have more P's than ever before due to the cross wind - only 9 members cast all casts in the lane.

The winner of the Level Line Distance event was Norm Clark with 283 - 171 - 454 (Norm said I could prune him, so I did!) followed by Ernie White with 269 - 180 - 449. Norm and Ernie were the only two members to exceed their handicaps, Norm by 4 and Ernie by 6. The longest cast of the day was made by Alan Bunnett 358ft. followed by Bob Tucker 355ft. and Noel Knight 344ft.

The D.H. Accuracy scores apart from Bob Tucker 64/80 and Bob Tichbon 49/80 were well below standard although the distances were only 86yds. and 56yds. The wind played havoc with this event, most members found the head wind too strong. How Bob Tucker got a bull in this event I'll never know but I'm led to believe that it came in from behind the target from about 200ft. up. Bob and Keith Mulvay were the only two members to score bulls in this event and only six members scored with all four casts. They were W. Bridger, R. Kildahl, N. Knight, B. Payne, R. Tichbon and R. Tucker.

The S.H. event was laid with the wind and this was the only event where scoring on the whole was up to scratch. The winner on the day was Ian McLennan with 27/40, Alan Bunnett second with 26/40 and Bob Tichbon 25/40. Only one bull was scored - by Tom Smith - in this event and five members scored with all four casts and they were W. Bridger, A. Bunnett, N. Clark, I McLennan and B. Payne.

Only Bill Bridger and Bert Payne scored all eight casts in the Accuracy events.

There has been a slight re-shuffle in the positions - Alan Bunnett had a bad day on the D.H. Accuracy and let Bob Tucker take the lead by 6 points, however according to Alan this is only temporary. There are three days to go in the competition and anything could happen at this stage.

FIELD DAY - GOLDEN BAY - 11TH & 12TH JANUARY, 1964.

Weather conditions:- A strong southerly blowing clouds of sand along the beach made fishing very uncomfortable during the afternoon and early evening until just after 9 p.m. when the wind eased off and an easterly tried to come in. A strong drift from south to north in the small channel made it difficult to keep a bait out for any length of time although Ian McLennan and Terry Fuller, with their waders on, were walking well out and casting for deeper water, an example I tried to follow until a larger than usual wave dampened my enthusiasm somewhat!

The attendance of 42 members, 7 juniors, 4 senior visitors and 5 junior visitors for a total of 58 was an excellent start in 1964 and I was pleased to see some of the older members such as Frank Van Zalen, Henry Bester, Arch Tickle and Ron McQueen together with newer members such as Ian Edgar and Ken Jones to name just a few joining in the fun of a Field Day.

With such a large attendance it is difficult to report on every members' activity but among the notables to the north were Charlie and Nick Crouch busy casting in all directions - Nick with two rods - but with little success. Cec. Houghton and Steve O'Mara were two more to wade well out when casting and their efforts were rewarded with several Tailor. The two Norms - Giles and Clark - were also attempting to break the sound barrier with their casting, they were determined the southerly was not going to stop them trying. A Smith and Bob Tucker decided to conserve their energy for the mornings onslaught, although Bob was on the sick list and his attendance at the venue showed his excellent club spirit.

George Hampton was another who was observed enjoying himself as he played several Tailor through the surf right under the master's nose - namely Bertie Payne who as usual made the outing so much brighter with his good humour and sportsmanship. Hugh Gregory and "Snow" Tate were noticed discussing the prospects of wetting a line while further north again Bob Klein, Ron Shirley, Ron Kildahl and Robert Hancock all weighed in the best bags of Tailor, except for Andy Mulgrave who came to the fore with the heaviest scale fish.

By 10 p.m. many members had retired in anticipation of better things in the morning and at 4 a.m. most of the lads were back on the beach again. Although the Tailor were slow and small, conditions were pleasant and eventually the two deep sea anglers Terry Fuller and Ian McLennan had several Tailor on the beach. Looking along the beach an occasional Tailor could be seen being played in through the surf but apparently the bigger schools of fish were out beyond the sand bank where flocks of gulls were observed diving into the water. It is probable that the Tailor will enter the channel very soon and when they do this spot would be well worth keeping in mind.

When the weigh in commenced at 7 o'clock Norm and I found the job very much easier and more accurate using the new scales. In fact some members complained we were even taking in to account the grains of sand, the more unscrupulous types roll their fish in! While the weigh in was taking place Horrie Muirson was providing his very acceptable brew and judging from the roars of laughter coming from that direction I would say the usual fish tales were being retold.

Unfortunately there is no windmill at our next base camp area at Quinn's, but as this is apparently what helps Ken Jones find his way back to base we will have to see what can be done about erecting one where ever we decide to hold our future Field Days.

So closed another busy Field Day and although the hauls were low, the usual club spirit was to the fore and I am sure every member had an enjoyable outing. Congratulations to the award winners, especially young Robert Hancock in the Junior section who appears to be benefiting from Ron Shirley's coaching. Another pleasing feature was that many members were wearing their club badges. So here's hoping for a good roll up in February - tight lines!
