PUBLIC CASTING CLINIC REPORT:

With everything in readiness by the advertised starting time, several members of the public were found awaiting their professional tutors. These people were keen to learn about all types of gear and their casting methods. With all this new information under their belts they all tried them out in the practical section. One man on his first distance cast could only manage 40 metres, after three hours casting he went home highly elated with the knowledge he was able to cast to great distance of 120 metres and with quite a deal of accuracy.

As there were several fishing tackle business houses represented, the instructors were able to send their pupils over to make arrangements for new and better gear.

It was unfortunate that the clinic day had to fall on the same, as that of the big Christmas Pageant, through Perth, as I feel we would have had a much bigger turn up of those Mums and Dad's who were obligated to take their children along. However, 50-60 people attended and received good tuition from those members who gave their time and effort. As the afternoon became quite quiet, our members decided to give a demonstration of both distance and accuracy for those present and 'boy' what a demonstration, in the distance 150+ metre casts were the order of the day. One of the members casting in the 150+ metre range was Stan Renshaw. So watch out you so called "big gun casters", there's some one knocking on the door. "By the way Stan, my gear is still for sale at the price discussed".

In the accuracy, "Bulls" were the order of the day, especially in the single hander.

I feel this type of Casting Clinic, for the general public, is a must and can only become greater. Thanks must go to all those who assisted in its organization and I would like to see another clinic next year, but with a stronger backing from all club members.
