



We ran the Mandurah 500 and in my book it went very well there was no problems. If the club take it on next year we will have a better insight.


Long weekend Field day is to be an open. Hope to see a few members at geraldton.

AAA MEETING 19th December, 1989.

- Preston Beach is still Crown Land. Fishermen can sleep in vehicles.
- AAA still looking for a club to run the State Drycasting championships in July 1990.
- Swanfish being conducted on 24th & 25th Feb/90 run by Melville Club.
- Offshore Boating Championship to be held 24th & 25th Peb/1990. out of Ocean Reef Marine - run by Whitfords Club.
- Solarlunar tables are to be published through the Recreation Fishing Council. It should appear in tackle shops at \$5.95
- 6. Swan River management can impose a \$2000 fine for digging in the river. Anglers will be allowed to dig worms (below high water mark) on mud flats, but not banks or signed areas. Hence anglers should be very careful, dispose of diggings below the high water mark.
