### FIELD DAY - LANCELIN - 16TH & 17TH DECEMBER, 1964.

Despite the fact that the locals had reported that fish were few and far between, 36 members, 1 junior and 2 visitors attended the venue and covered a large area searching for a suitable fishing spot. The resulting total capture of 2271b. including several sharks was an excellent effort. The weather conditions were not pleasant with gusty southerly winds and the south end heavily weeded although things were a little better to the north past the hotel, where many of the best catches were made.

The shark captures were the highlight of the venue. Gary Davidson started the ball rolling with a 141b, whaler shark. Don Webb came in later with a bronze whaler which tipped the scales at  $25\frac{3}{4}$ lb. and appeared certain to take out an award. However, about 11 p.m. Bob Klein, Ron Shirley and Ron Kildahl arrived back at camp with a  $30\frac{1}{2}$ lb. bronze whaler caught by Ron Kildahl. The whaler sharks give quite a good tussle on rod and line and altogether five were landed which was an excellent effort.

Bob Lilly continued his attack on the State records with Hammerhead shark weighing 131b. 10oz. This fish which does not often venture close inshore aroused considerable interest at the weigh in and kept several of our shutterbugs busy.

Turning to scale fish we saw Bob Jensen return to the fore with a good bag of tailor weighing  $16\frac{3}{4}$ lb. Gerry Windus was all smiles with his  $7\frac{1}{4}$ lb. Mulloway, while "Yew" with a bag of 141b. of tailor maintained his excellent field day record and kept his points total jumping ahead.

Bob Tichbon, Ian Edgar and Horrie Muirson tried an area called Sea Bird Bay but southerly winds coupled with weed and a lack of tailor defeated them and they were forced to give in. The parties south near the rubbish dump found the same problem and believe me, I've never worked so hard for so little. My nephew Peter McLure, a visitor to the venue, landed 7 tailor using a much smaller rig than anyone else (Two 2/0 Limericks) and small strips of mullet and this was apparently preferred by the tailor to the conventional **scalie**  Phil Neri and Jack Harvey managed half a dozen tailor between them while our good friends Arch Ticklie and Arthur Horton carried on with their usual dash to weigh in fair bags.

So ended another happy and busy Field Day with one section of the Field Day Competition being knocked off. Congratulations to the various award winners (who will be paid at our next Meeting) and don't forget that as we are having visitors from Collie and Busselton next month, a good roll up is essential.
