It was good to see a few club members, apart from the regulars, attend this venue. Glad to see you along Ted Horsley you were casting well. Also pleased to see Ron McQueen, would like you to cast with us next time.

With a sou-wester blowing down the field, the course was set out accordingly. In the level line distance, the longest cast was made by W. Bridger with 453 ft. Bill also scored the same distance in the open event. Second place went to Ken Jones with 429 ft., and Allan Bunnett was third with 420 ft. The winner of this event was Eric Sullivan - congratulations Eric. Two members tied for second place, Ken Jones and A. Bunnett, and third was K. Hunt and H. Barrot. Congrats to Ken Hunt on reaching 300 ft. Keep it up.

Double handed accuracy was set at 86 yards for the first cast and quite a few members fell short, but J. Strong was on his toes and won this event with 52/80, followed by R. Kildahl 43/80, and R. Jensen third with 39/80, only six members scored with all four casts.

Single handed accuracy - these were set at 116 ft. and 86 ft. and these also proved fairly hard targets, but B. Hanks did well with 25/40 and K. Jones 24/40, and T. Smith 20/40. A. Bunnett was the only member who scored with all four casts.

FIELD DAY MOORE RIVER 11/12TH DECEMBER 1965.

Hot easterly winds with a slight sea breeze. Moderate swell in the evening. Beach heavily weeded in evening making for difficult angling with small Tailor being taken along beach. Many of the anglers had their lines snapped off with the heavy loads of weed.

Earlier in the day conditions appeared ideal, and it was only after 5 p.m. that the weed moved in closer to the shore line.

Excellent attendance again this month on the venue, 46 members 4 visitors, 4 juniors and 1 junior visitor making a grand total of 55. Noticed Henry Bester, Frank Van Zalen, Bertie Payne, Mrs. Payne who had arrived after 5 o'clock having difficulty finding a spot on the beach, for with the roll up the rods appeared to stretch in almost an unbroken line along the shore. Ron Shirley, Ron Kildahl and Alf Rutland were soon on the job landing several tailor. The seaweed did not seem to worry Alf and he carried on regardless. Bill Bridger, Allan Bunnett, Ken Jones, Bob Klein were also struggling with their lines. Their lines appeared like clothes lines on many occasions and many rigs were lost this way much to the Anglers' disgust. Bob Tucker, Bob Tichbon arrived and Bob Tucker landed a Mulloway and several Tailor.

Most of the lads retired early as it was a losing battle. The lack of fish and weed were proving too much. There was a mass exodus to tents and camps and we all hoped for an improvement in the conditions in the morning, however our party, Kevin and Doug Salt, Bob Tucker, Bob Tichbon, Doug Talbot chatted on till almost 1 a.m. in the morning. Togetherness is a wonderful idea indicates good club spirit.

Small rigs were a must with the Tailor preferring Mullet strips. Berty Payne, Stephen Knezy were on the job and landed many Tailor. Bill Bridger was busy and landed 15 tailor plus a Whaler Shark. Allan Bunnett gamely battled on handicapped with a lacerated foot he knocked on the rock early in the day, and the first-aid kit came in useful. The Mulloway generally were on the small side, many 2 and 3 lb. fish being weighed in. The Tailor kept biting until 7 o'clock and then I retired in readiness for the weigh-in.
