A.A.A. OF W.A. DELEGATES! REPORT:

We have had a busy time during the last month with the usual monthly meeting and a special meeting arranged for interested bodies at the Mt. Hawthorn Civic Centre. This particular meeting was called to unite and help to solve any problems between the A.A.A. of W.A. (Anglers), interested bodies, dune biggy clubs, 4-wheel drive clubs and trial and enduro clubs. The issue is mainly on the pending ban of 4-wheel drive and beach buggies by Gingin Shire. The aim of the new body which was formed, The Recreational Vehicles Association, is to retain the use of the beach for transport from point A to point B for unglers and to obtain suitable land for the operation of the dune buggy and trial and enduro clubs. George Holman, from this club, was appointed Publicity Officer.

The committees have been formed for the Preston Beach Competition (to be held on 24th and 25th February, 1973) and the Boat Championships (tp be held on 18th March).

The Preston function will be basically the same as last year, but there area few alterations to the boat championships. The main one affects the teams event. The members of the various teams nominated will have to fish from boats supplied by the A.A.A. of W.A. and positions in the boats will be by ballot as in the Australian Championships. A fee of \$5 will be charged to each team member to pay for the charter of the boats. Individuals may use their own boats and fish where they wish depending on the section they enter.

All records passed by the W.A. Division which are Australian records will now be recognised, as Scuth Australia has taken over recording these records. Our Division has now only to forward these on to S.A. to be accepted.

There were numerous other points dealt with but these are the ones which affect us most.

LEGAL LENGTHS OF FISH:

Recently the A.A.A. of W.A. was asked for suggestions re amendments to the legal lengths of fish by the Fisheries Council. The two main species they recommended altering, and which the Fisheries Council accepted and passed, were Tailor from 9 inches to 10 inches and Mulloway from 13 inches to 15 inches. The cover on "Reel Talk" will not have these alterations on it for some months as we have quite a number printed which we have yet to use.

DECEMBER CAST:

Despite the Weather Bureau's threat of a "stinker", conditions were reasonably good for the 29 members and one visitor who arrived at Floreat Oval for the monthly cast. Prevailing northerly winds, while assisting to some extent the level line casters, played havoc with accuracy performances. In some cases, results were disastorous!

LES REID really excelled in the level-line section with three casts all in, and averaging 404. A truly commendable performance. E. PARKER could only manage 2 casts before he returned to form and broke off. However, both of Tiny's casts were 405ft. Poor old D.C.O. and JOHN DEVITT had costly B.O's (or C.U's or S.U's or something) also. We heard the whip-crack twice and Social Organiser, Tony Smith, was really in form. Must make mention of W. UTTING who had trouble early with 315ft but recovered to put 400ft away with his last cast. G. GILDERSLEEVE, chasing 20 cents that he had lost previously to the President, put down a very dainty 329ft - what some fellows will dor for money. The computed results show L. REID with 40pts, followed by G. HOLMAN 39, D. GREEN 37, T. O'HARA 37, B. LEICESTER 37, W. UTTING, R. TUCKER and the President managed creditable scores of 35.

Well, as mentioned before, the humid conditions and a cross wind played hell with most casters efforts in the double-handed accuracy section. It was a dismal performance in the light of previous months when our best was only a shade over 50%. However, enough reprimanding from your D.C.O. whose 21% result was grim to say the least. TINY PARKER and D. TAYLOR had no small amount of trouble in this event - they could only manage zerio! G. GILDESSLEEVE, sober for the first casting time, managed a creditable 43 and finished third to R. KILDAHL 56 and R. TUCKER who scored 44. Other scores only just worth a mention were E. SULLIVAN (only because he's my assistant) 42; D. GREEN 41 (only because its so rare) and D. LATTO 40 (who is really trying). L. REID was a little inconsistent in this event when after 3 misses he managed a lovely bull,

The sinlge-handed accuracy revealed scores more in line with what we expect. Even R. KILDAHL'S zero was more or less expected. Consistent B. LEICESTER took out this event with 25, followed by G. HOLMAN 21, R. TUCKER 20, E. SULLIVAN 19, T. O'HARA 19, R. LERCH 19 and following in his Dad's footsteps, M. TUCKER 19 - and with Mark's big feet, that's quite an achievement.

With no open event, the day concluded early and another chapter was written in the saga of the "Decline of a D.C.O.". My 67 followed last month's 67 to prove how consistently bloody awful one can become.

The final counting and distribution of preferences resulted in a tiethe first under our new system. Both a very consistent B. LEICESTER (average 108.5) and R.TUCKER finished the day with 109 points.

They were followed by E. SULLIVAN 103 (not trying on the contrary) very trying), out of the blue D. GREEN 102 and R. KILDAHL 98.
