One member however seemed to be in his element under these conditions, for he scored a record of 72/80 points in the D. H. Accuracy event. Some say he waited for the wind to drop every time it was his cast. In any case it was a fine performance. Incidently his name is Knight. Quite a few familiar faces were absent due to the long weekend, and I think they would have been far better off staying at home, considering the conditions.

In the Spinner L. L. Distance event some good casting was done. Longest distances recorded were by R. Tichbon with 354 feet. Noel Knight 346 feet and Doug Edward 339 feet.
Winners of this event were as follows.

Second was M. Doscas . 288 - I68 - 456 feet.

Bob Tucker, 33I - I2O - 45I filled third position.

I am personally responsible for the axe and bushmans saw which has been placed at our disposal and I request that members take care of same, and see that it is returned to the hut after x use.

Members who journey to the North end will be picked up at the guns at 8 a.m. for return to the jetty.
