DRY CASTING JUNE 13TH. 1965

Well the weather wasn't very kind to us - a fairly stiff West to Nor-west wind blowing over our right shoulders which tended to drift both the L.L. Distance casts and the accuracy casts to the left. However 23 seniors braved what had promised to be a bleak day to participate in the four events held. The Club tent, complete with badge on both sides was very much in evidence, but fortunately the rain held off.

The best casts of the day came from Ken Jones 394 ft. just pipping Bill Bridger 393 ft. and Norrie Cross just edging Allan Bunnett out of third with 376 ft. and 375 ft. respectively. Doug Clegg, returning to casting after a long absence took top honours in this event with 302 - 180 - 482. Norrie Cross with 350 - 116 - 466 was second and Ian McLennan with 297 - 163 - 460 was third. These three members, together with Noel Knight and Bill Utting also got the axe.

Doug Clegg was also in the limelight in the D.H. Accuracy event scoring 53/80 just in front of Noel Knight 52/80. Ken Jones with 47/80 was third, very good scoring by these members in these conditions. There were no bulls in this event, but six members scored with all four casts - they were D. Clegg, N. Knight, R. Kildahl, A. Bunnett, K. Jones and W. Bridger.

Jim Strong, Bob Tichbon and Robin Ellis each recorded a Bull in the S.H. Accuracy event while Don Bridger, R. Shirley, R. Tichbon and Norrie Cross scored with all four casts. This event was won by Bob Tichbon with 24/40 with Norrie Cross 23/40 second. J. Strong, R. Kildahl, and Bill Bridger all scored 21/40. No one scored with all 8 accuracy casts, but 9 members scored with 7 accuracy casts.

FIELD DAY HAMELIN BAY 5th 6th 7th JUNE 1965

Weather conditions: North-West winds which at times appeared as if they were going to take all before them, including the intrepid angler who ventured onto an exposed beach or headland, plus approximately 2 inches of rain which was enough to dampen the most avid angler - but not quite enough as was proved by those of us who ventured so far south at that time of the year. Our forty, which included Jack Harvey, Kevin Salt, Phil Neri and self arrived at Hamelin Bay around 3 a.m. and after no small effort we eventually got our camp set up and settled down for the rest of the night. When morning came it was decided to have a look around, so off we went and looked at most vantage places from Hamelin to the Leuwin. On our return we noticed that a few of the lads had turned up and "signed on", and it wasn't long before the main forty started rolling up in their caravanettes etc.

Horrie Muirson with Bill Utting and John Tobin made the trip down on Friday night, as also did Tom Vivian and his family. Tom was one of several who hired trams for the weekend as did Tom Smith and family and Dave Latto and family and also Bob Tucker. These trams were quite well appointed and reasonably priced at £1 a night.

But the decision to pay it a visit certainly proved worthwhile as Bob Lilly caught three nice Salmon which gave a total poundage of  $28\frac{1}{4}$  lbs, and this enabled him to take off the Heaviest Bag of Fish Award. Ted caught a 12 lb 9 oz Salmon, this fish until just a short while ago would have been a State record, but even so it was good enough to win the Heaviest Sale Fish Award. Hugh missed out on the Salmon, but caught a few nice skips.

Doug Savage, Ross Anderson and visitor Robin Anderson also made the trip into Branup where Doug caught a Salmon though not as big as Ted's. Ross and Robin caught herring though could not latch onto a Salmon.

Up until Ted arrived, it looked as if Don Beadon would win this section with his 9 lb. Salmon, Hew Hoy Yew also caught a Salmon which turned the scales at 8 lb, and a Tailor of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  lb., but young Don Bridger managed the best Tailor, a very nice capture of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lb. which puts him as the leader in this section.
