Jim Strong and myself, along with Roy Lundy (as a visitor), represented the Surfcasters at the last meeting of the W.A. Division of the Australian Anglers' Association.

Possibly the most important announcement was that W.A. has been allocated the 1975 Australian Championships. this will mean a lot of work and it will be necessary for all the clubs to "chip in" and lend a hand so that all anglers can enjoy this event. It it the first time this championship will be held in W.A.

Three records were passed: 161b Bludger - Albert Norman; 91b Mangrove Jack - Ron Thomas; 651b Samson Fish - Keven John Murphy. All were shore records.

The motion moved by the Offshore Club to the effect that only 2 delegates from any one club can hold office at the one time, was carried.

The motion regarding a suitable point scoring system for the boat champion-ships was deferred until after a special meeting of the boat clubs is held.

A convention for any member of clubs affiliated with the A.A.A. of W.A. is to be held at Mandurah on Saturday, 4th August at the Brighton Hotel. Will give more details next month.

The election of officers has been held over until the August meeting to give the new delegates nominated by the clubs, time to have a lock at the Divisions operations.

The North Shore Cruising and Fishing Club has just paid \$180 solicitors fees towards its part of the new groyne and boat ramp at Whitfords. General Agency is sponsoring the project. Approximately 250ft of ramp will be installed.

An application has been lodged with the A.S.C. for the yearly grants to sporting bodies. It is hoped the W.A. Div sion will get around \$400.

Letters to the Fremantle Port Authority, Mr. Bickerton the Minister for Works, and the Fisheries and Fauna, regarding the retention of Robbs Jetty as a fishing platform were answered. The cost of repairs is \$15,000 and the yearly maintenance is \$10,000 and as there is nobody prepared to, or able to, bear the costs involved, down she comes.

Letters querying fishing for redfin perch and trout in inland waters were sent to Wanneroo and Mundaring Shires.

Dear Sir,

I would like to add a few further thoughts to those of Ken Jones on the question of Juniors fishing from rocks.

Statistically the risk of injury while driving to a venue is due in part to the carefree, and often careless driving of young drivers who do not appreciate the risks they are taking.

Does the lad's experience as a fisherman have a bearing on a members right to vote on a motion to protect the lad from possible injury or death caused by his youthful impetuosity? An ability to swim strongly may be of little use if washed in from rocks. Many bodies recovered are not drowned, but dead from cerebal injuries; they never had a chance to swim.

Ken's words "he leaves me for dead in the water", I hope never come true!

I remember well the words of an eye witness to the Kalbarri tragedy when 3 sisters were widowed in seconds. They were, "there was a shout of warning, a crash as a wave broke over the rocks, a silence, and we called to our mates just around the corner and received no reply. Then we saw 3 motionless bodies drifting out to sea, there was nothing we cold do for them as they sank from sight".

I agree with Ken, only the boy's father should make the decision, but surely he should be there to assess the conditions and not leave the responsibility to some club member.

Possibly the club has no legal responsibility in this matter, but surely we have a moral one to help our members, young and old, and not shrug the matter away if an accident should docur and salve our conscience with those heart breaking words, "there was nothing we could do for him".
