The Annual Dinner Dance and Presentation of Trophies is on Saturday 28th June '86. Please arrange a party group and book in at the next General Meeting on June 11th 1986.

The Competition is a normal part of the club activity, held to help members improve casting techniques, in distance casting and accuracy with double handed and single handed rods. It also affords an opportunity to socialise with fellow members.

Distance Casting: with double handed rods is carried out with normal fishing gear. All line used must be the same gauge throughout. A heavy leader is permitted, providing it is not more than 380mm (15") in length and is attached to weight being cast. This is known as Level Line Distance Casting. Each member taking part is allowed three (3) casts. He attempts to cast a weight of his choice, with regulation marker 230mm (9") long attached, the greatest distance possible. The cast weight to score full points, must fall in the lane of marked flags. Any cast outside the flags, incurs a penalty loss of ten (10) points. Scores are marked in metres after each cast on the scoreboard provided. A penalty is signified by the letter "P". A cast to score, must have the weight attached to the line. Miscasts, due to back lash, breakoff or failure to put ball arm to correct position or reel into free spool, are counted as a cast turn.

Double handed Accuracy is carried out with the same type of standard fishing gear as that used for distance casting. Two (2) alternate casts are made at two discs set in the ground at varying distances from a start line. This distance is determined by the Casting Organisers and alters each casting day. To score, the casting weight is aimed at the disc or "Bull". The object being to hit the Bull for the highest score. Scores decrease by 300mm increments from the disc to the end of measuring tape.

Single handed Accuracy is the same as Double Handed except, as the name implies, casting is carried out with Single Hand rods, the gear is lighter and the distance shorter. At no time may two hands be used.

In addition, four Double Handed distance, four Single Handed distance and two 56 gram distance competitions are carried out during the year. Members have two casts in each event and the greater distance is recorded. No accuracy is required in any of these events and no penalties can be incurred, except those relating to miscasts.
