## DRY CASTING MAY 1961:

A nice roll up of 27 members enjoyed very pleasant conditions on the May casting day at Floreat Park.

Nothing very spectacular happened but casting on the whole was up to our usual high standard.

We had a visitor from South Australia who demonstrated their way of casting with some very scientific gear. His maximum cast is approximately 700 feet, thats really something to boast about. This of course is done with a reel that looks something like the inside of a clock with a few hundred yards of cobweb wrapped around the works.

However, getting back to earth the results of our casting day were as follows. In the weight level line distance event the first three place getters were W. Bridger first.(93 - 70 - 163) J. Strong second (9I - 68 - I59) and third Eric Sullivan (83 - 75 - I58): These three chaps will find things a little different at the next casting day.

In the double handed level line accuracy event the honours were taken by R. Lilly with 54 points, closely followed by Alan Livesey 53 points, and L Tate with 46 points.

In the single handed accuracy event Doug Savage scored 28 points from B. Tucker with 22 points and W. Bridger with 19 points. The three best scorers of the day were R. Lilly with 80 points. Alan Livesey with 79 and Jim Strong 74. Quite good scoring was done by nearly all the members which proves that the new competition should give all the members new and old alike a chance to be in the running. Even Jim Strong could make a name for himself.

Bob Lilly casts exceptionally well in the double handeed L.L. accuracy event scoring with all four casts. He also scored with all four casts in the single handed accuracy event. Others to score with all four casts in the D. H. accuracy event were Alan Livesey, Doug Savage, L Tate, J. Bellman, Noel Knight and even Alan Bunnett.

Doug Savage scored two bulls in the S. H. accuracy event, and W. Bridger got one.
