The Angling will be held on the 27th and 28th September.



SALMON are being tagged to study -Growth Rate Population Density Exploitation Level Migration Feeding Habits Spawning Habits

TAGS consist of a white plastic tag (5 cm x $2\frac{1}{2}$ cm) inserted in the fish near the belly. A yellow or brown streamer will indicate its presence and position. The tag will be inscribed "C.S.I.R.O., Box 21, CRONULLA, N.S.W. Please measure" and a sorial number.



FINDERS and act to rreeze the specimen, contact Mike Walker at Western Australian Marine Research Laboratories (Tel. 471366) or the nearest Fisheries Inspector.

If they are unable to do this, they should record

- Exact place and date of cature Ъ.
- Exact length of fish from snout to centre of tail c.
- A dozen or more scales from the area indicated in the diagram Return tag to Cronulla.
