On our arrival we were greeted by the well known faces of our competitors and fellow club members. As George Holman was unable to attend the following members made up the team. Peter Osborne, Gary Gildersleeves, Syd Whiting, Eric Parker, Hew Hoy Yew and myself, our sole Junior entrant was Heather Osborne who cast extremely well against great odds. Heather is to be congratulated on breaking the 100m barrier in the 112 gram V/Court distant event. It was noted that her most ardent fan was walking amongst the opposition Junior Casters making statements like "You will kill them in the next event when you make casts of !!! " This "filthy", "wonderful" method was used to great effect to throw terror into the hearts of those who were within hearing range. Needless-to-say Heather on the day finished in fourth position in a field of eleven, congratulations Heather.
