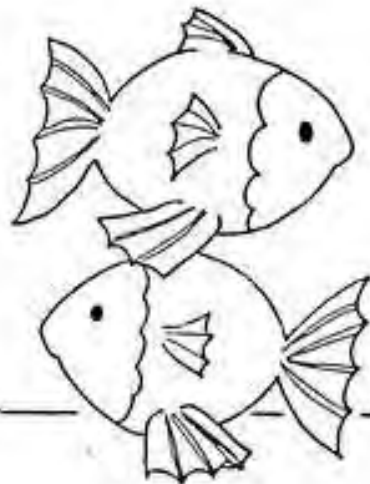

STATE ESTUARY CHAMPIONSHIP

The state estuary championships were held at Bunbury on Sunday, April 29th. Most anglers chose to travel down on the Saturday, and use the extra time to look around the estuary. While the Leschenault has a good expanse of water, most of it is on the shallow side, making small boats the way to go. Certainly shore anglers found fish, but finding fish that were of legal length was the problem.

Boat anglers had it somewhat better, again finding lots of fish, but having to work hard to pick up fish of any size. The weigh-in was dominated by herring, King George whiting and pilch, with some yellowfin whiting, a few silver bream, skippy, and only one flathead.

Attendance was small, but still pleasing, considering the distance boats had to be towed. The weather held reasonably well for the day, although a strong north-westerly came in about mid-day, making things a bit uncomfortable for the small boats.

Osbornes took their 18 ft down, and found it quite easy to launch from the Australind site. Retrieving in the blustery afternoon conditions wasn't as easy, but was still quite manageable.

We had a club first, as D'Alonzos decided to risk everything by fishing from a boat (Osbornes). While initially rather timid (frightened silly, actually), both Filomena and Tony soon got their sea legs. Tony liked it so much he took his sea legs home with him (it took him a while to figure out why he couldn't walk quite right that evening).

We had our boats scattered all over the Leschenault looking for fish. Most of the better bags came from just north of the cutting and close to the pipeline. The Collie River boys (Malcolm, Ian & Michael) worked hard with little real success. Ian Taggart was disappointed to find out that due to confusion over bridges he actually could have gone further upstream to try for bigger bream.

Fremantle Angling Club took off the mens, veterans, and juniors champion teams. SURCASTING & ANGLING CLUB TOOK THE LADIES (WELL DONE NELL, FILOMENA & SHARON). Bunbury Angling Club took the mini-juniors. Individual champions were John Slymers (mens), Helen Dyer (veterans), Lisa King (ladies), Jason Kelly (juniors), and Garry Dyer (mini-juniors).

The 90/91 estuary titles are likely to be held November 25th/26th of this year, possibly in the Swan River. Sure would be nice to put in a Surfcasters Estuary team again. The Swan has some really nice fishing- good variety, good size fish, and it's not very far to go. So, how about it everyone?

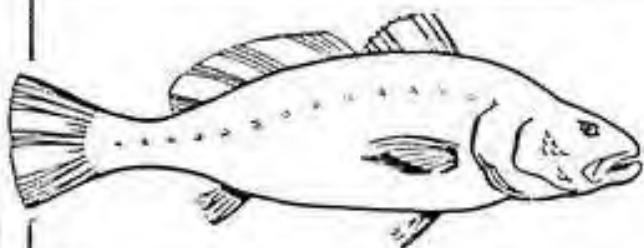

A.A.A. REPORT - MAY 1990

1. 90/91 AAA events: Bunbury propose the Jun'91 LWE be used for the state rock & beach at Denmark. Offshore would like 24/25 May'91 for the state rock & beach. Delegates to ask clubs for opinions on this.
2. Ministry of Fisheries announced that commercial prawn licences will be removed from Shark Bay & Exmouth Fisheries. The commercial fishermen actioned this in the interest of conservation of stocks and resource management.
3. Short term use of the Bayswater activity centre for delegates was not taken due to inadequate size. AAA looking at working in with Bayswater Shire on a Recreation Facility in the Norley/Bayswater area. ie- a room solely for AAA use. Clubs interested would be able to purchase time-share rights to this room, and would also be able to use the centres other facilities at particular times. Are Surfcasters interested?
4. Delegates to hold a special meeting on the "Recreation Fishing Proposal" at 7.30 pm, Monday, June 25th at Whitfords Sea Sports Club. SCAC sub-committee will be attending. Any interested club members welcome to attend.
5. AAA fees due on June 1st. (\$2.00 seniors, \$1.00 others).
