However, the oval has been booked from 12.00 noon nwards, so this means we will have to vacate the area by 11.30 a.m. Therefore casting will commence at 9.00 AM SHARP and latecomers will have to miss out.

# DRY CASTING - 2ND FEBRUARY, 1964

On a fairly warm day with a heavy atmosphere and a moderate breeze swinging from North East to an early sea breeze 22 seniors. 3 juniors, about 20 interested spectators and one cameraman turned up at Floreat Park Oval for the days casting. The cameraman from A.B.W. 2 televised some of our boys in action, which was seen on Channel 2 on the sports news on Monday, 3rd. February at 7.15 p.m. and was very interesting even though I didn't get my mug on file. The filming didn't seem to upset the boys too much judging by the high scores recorded, six members scoring over one hundred points for the day and two records were exceeded. Alan Bunnett broke Bob Lilly's S. Hand record by one to score 31/40 and I broke Keith Mulvays record by one to score 65/80 in the D.H. Accuracy.

Don Beadon took top honours in the L.L. Distance event with 297 - 173 - 470 with Jack Harvey second 261 - 180 - 441 and Eric Sullivan third 278 - 145 - 423.

The D.H. Accuracy showed that the lads were on the target, 13 members scoring all four casts and Noel Knight scoring the only bull. Second in this event was Noel Knight 62/80 and equal third were Alan Bunnett and Bob Tucker 56/80.
