CASTING DAY - FLOREAT PARK OVAL 8TH MARCH, 1964.

Because of the March Casting Day falling on the long week-end it has been decided to hold this month's event a week later on the 8th March. However, the oval has been booked from 12.00 noon onwards, so this means we will have to vacate the area by 11.30 a.m. Therefore casting will commence at 9.00 AM SHARP and latecomers will have to miss out.

DRY CASTING - 2ND FEBRUARY, 1964

On a fairly warm day with a heavy atmosphere and a moderate breeze swinging from North East to an early sea breeze 22 seniors, 3 juniors, about 20 interested spectators and one cameraman turned up at Floreat Park Oval for the days casting. The cameraman from A.B.W. 2 televised some of our boys in action, which was seen on Channel 2 on the sports news on Monday, 3rd. February at 7.15 p.m. and was very interesting even though I didn't get my mug on file. The filming didn't seem to upset the boys too much judging by the high scores recorded, six members scoring over one hundred points for the day and two records were exceeded. Alan Bunnett broke Bob Lilly's S. Hand record by one to score 31/40 and I broke Keith Mulvays record by one to score 65/80 in the D.H. Accuracy.

Don Beadon took top honours in the L.L. Distance event with 297 - 173 - 470 with Jack Harvey second 261 - 180 - 441 and Eric Sullivan third 278 - 145 - 423.

The D.H. Accuracy showed that the lads were on the target, 13 members scoring all four casts and Noel Knight scoring the only bull. Second in this event was Noel Knight 62/80 and equal third were Alan Bunnett and Bob Tucker 56/80.

Second place in the S.H. Accuracy was shared by Bob Jensen and Keith Mulvay with 28/40 and Bob Lilly was third with 25/40. Alan Bunnett, Bob Tucker and Jack Harvey each scored a bull in this event and five members scored all four casts. Alan Bunnett, Bob Jensen, Bill Utting, Keith Mulvay and Bob Tichbon scored with all eight accuracy casts.

JUNIOR SECTION

The three juniors were fairly equal on the day only five points seperating them. Ken Hunt top scored in the L.L. Distance with 224 - 174 - 398 and also the S.H. Accuracy with 28/40 while Don Bridger topped the D.H. Accuracy with 52/80. Ken also cast the longest distance, 247ft. in the distance event. Don had his revenge in the Open when he cast 257ft.

Terry Fuller weighed in a Mulloway of 5³/₄lb. - apparently the Mulloway were making brief calls all along the southern beaches.

The litter carried by Tom Smith and Bob Tucker caused a roar when they proceeded to the south end. Though, as Tom Smith said "The so-and-so is good on the flat, but going uphill it is almost impossible". There were photoes taken of this outfit and it will be interesting for members to observe these and other snaps which should be available at our next General Meeting.

DRYCASTING COMPETITION 1964 - 65

There are no changes in this competition which has provided an excellent fight for top honours over the 1963 - 64 events.
