Tony Richardson gave details and results of A.A.A. Estuary Fishing Championships in which our Club came 4th. Graham Reeley scored 59 points out of our Team's total of 64 as he was the only one fortunate enough in our Team weighed in for the Competition.

Our Drycasting Team for the South West Championships finished in 3rd position behind Northern Districts (1) and Bunbury (2). Our Ladies' Team also finished in 3rd position. Congratulations to all who participated, especially to the old maestro George Holman who won the Individual event on the day.

Our Recorder, Erish Cusack presented a 2 to 1 plus Game Fish Badge to Alan Carr for his magnificent Cobia caught at Steep Point. Graham and Clayton Freind also received Game Fish Badges for fish caught at Steep Point. Our congratulations to you all.

Basil Marsh made us a little envious with a report of his son Paul fishing for mackeral at Port Hedland. They caught so many that they were sick of catching them - all species of course. Paul reckons he has stumbled across the best invention since the stubby holder, namely, the flying gaff, which he uses for landing fish on the Port Hedland Jetty. This was the credit side of Paul's letter, the debit side was having to sit out the cyclones which, in his words, were "pretty scarey".

A motion was put forward by Ron Flynn, seconded by Alby Norman, that our April (Rotto) Field day be split. This motion was carried and will now be Rottnest - Palm Beach Jetty to Two Rocks Marina - The sign-on and weigh-in for the mainland section will be at Ron Flynn's house. Sign on 12 noon Saturday, Weigh in Sunday 2 p.m.

JANUARY 1980 FIELD DAY REPORT: Greenough River:

Andy and Graham continued to get a few but that fish had put the evil eye on its captor. The tide began to fall and everything was quiet again. Back to S-Bend.

Reports were that fish had been caught all along the coast. George and Peter had bags of tailor and the Freinds, especially their visitor, N. Bramwell, had fish to weigh.

The Monday weigh in was probably the most successful for a couple of years for average catch per member. So much so that if anyone went home fishless they had only themselves to blame as George couldn't even give his fish away.

We had only 23 seniors, ladies, juniors and visitor in attendance and a total catch of 118.2kg which speaks for itself. Pity more members didn't turn up.

I would like to thank the S-Bend proprietors, Robbie & Sandra for their hospitality, once more. These people really put some time into providing for our members on these field days, entertaining the kids, BBQ's, and even ferrying our members to the fishing spots.
