We hope all members are satisfied with the way we have worked out the new competition and hope to see a big roll up for the May casting day.

One of the rules of Dry Casting was broken by several members on the April casting day. That was rule 3. Practice ceases at 9.55 am so as to enable members to be ready to commence casting at IO a.m. sharp.

Indiscriminate casting must be stopped before an accident occurs, so members are requested to brush up on their dry casting rules and try to be on time so that we can get the events away in an orderly manner at IO a.m.

Members are also requested to supervise their children and keep them off the oval, away from the casters till they are called on to have the childrens casting event. When the kids are called upon for their casting members are requested to have the kids rods rigged and ready for casting.

In closing may I point out that there is a suitable recepticle provided with seperate compartments for each item required for casting stop. Please try and make your C. D. O's job a little easier by being tidy and returning your weights etc to their respective compartments.

I would like to extend my congratulations to the winners of the last casting competition and hope to see good roll ups at the nex# casting day.

Dont forget chaps that all members who have a break off are responsible for retrieving the sinker, spinner or whatever they may be using at the time of the break off.

Also, members who stay on to practice after the cessation of the days casting are requested to use at least one foot of tape on their sinkers, as is done in normal casting. (Editor).

In last months Reel Talk it was stated that the lane for dry casting would be 45 ft in width. This is erroneous, as the correct width for the lane should be 30 ft. D. C. O.

The following paragraphs are extracted from a letter dated April 12th. from "Hec" Mainwaring, proprietor of Mainwarings Cottages at the mouth of the Murchison.

"One of my regulars in John Mann, fishing at the Blue Hole, got never less than three dozen tailer at a visit. He was here for a few days at Easter. The first day three dozen tailer out of four dozen "scalies" for bait. The second day he brought back seventeen, but threw back two dozen as he caught them, to save carrying them back. Next day four dozen and so on.

None went over five pounds. Winter tailer are due to move in now and they are much bigger fish. Off the shore near the Bluff last week, three nice kingfish thirty five to fourty pounds were caught and some lost. I could only hook on to sharks."

The Road Board Secretary and Chairmab have assured me that work on roads here would commence this Monday coming and that the work would take five weeks. A special grant for work on the road to the Bluff is from the Government, as an aid to tourism. Another grant is for roads in the township. Except for patching and grading their way out along our access road, no further work will be done until later on in the year, when it will be known what the new grant is, and for what sections".

Any members who are expecting leave and are undecided what to do with it, the above information may prove benificial to you. (Several of our members are at present at the Murchison so we should here further reports from them at the next meeting. (Ed).
