DRY CASTING 5TH APRIL, 1964

This was the last day of our current competition and it was very pleasing to see a good roll up of members, 23 seniors and 3 juniors present. Allan Livesey was also on hand and helped out with the scoring; thanks Allan.

Bob Tucker, who started the day off 28 points in hand eventually had to lower the flag to Alan Bunnett, who, casting exceptionally well scored 119 points for the day while Bob had one of those days scored 75 points making the winning margin for Alan 16 points.

Bob Lilly remained in third position 22 points behind Bob Tucker. There were only 38 points separating these 3 members at the conclusion of the year.

The Open Distance event was again won by Bill Bridger but judging by the final scores there may be a reversal next year (watch it, Bill). Noel Knight was second only 38 points down and Alan Bunnett took third position 33 points behind Noel.

The Level Line Distance event was again won by Norm Clark for the third time out of the last four casting days - Norm also got the axe for the third time, 162 down to 159. Nice going Norm. I would like to see you cast without half the beach in your reel - your handicap would be really sick. Norm finished with 291 - 162 - 453. Jack Harvey with 264 - 175 - 439 was second and George Greenham was third 312 - 125 - 437. Jack also reduced his handicap by 3.

The D.H. Accuracy resulted in a win for Alan Bunnett 52/80 (including a near miss), Bob Tichbon 52/80 was second and Bob Lilly third 44/80. Ten members scored all four casts and Gill Clohessy scored the only bull.

Ian McLennan and Noel Knight each with 24/40 tied for first in the S.H. Accuracy and Alan Bunnett 23/40 was a close third. Bill Utting scored the only bull but seven members scored all four casts - Bob Tucker, Bill Bridger, Alan Bunnett, Bob Jensen, and Ian McLennan scored all eight accuracy casts.

JUNIOR COMPETITION 1963 - 64

Don Bridger scored top honours in all events except the Open Distance which was won on the day by Ken Hunt.

Don established a new record in the D.H. Accuracy with 59/80, a very creditable performance. Don and Ken scored all

FIELD LAY-GARDEN ISLAND - 18TH & 19TH APRIL, 1964

Weather conditions:- Gusty north easterly breeze with excellent conditions along the back beach, though I'm quite sure all members like myself, were hoping for a good sea breeze to liven up the Tailor. The Salmon however made a welcome appearance and many of the lads connected and had good sport playing them to the beach. 28 members, 5 juniors, 4 visitors and 1 junior visitor made up a total attendance of 38.

Don Beadon started the day off with a splash when he had the misfortune to overbalance whilst unloading the rods from the 2p. boat and plunged into the ocean, where he was helped out by Ron Kildahl. The gusty easterly was buffeting the boat considerably and made unloading quite a hazardous operation. However all was well and we made our way to the large hut and proceeded to settle in. A party of several members amongst them were Bob Tucker, Gerry Windus and Arthur Horton set off on the truck for the North area whilst Ken Jones and Alan Bunnett headed for the rifle range.

Together with quite a few other members I made for the back beach where we met Lennis Rogers and Eric Sullivan who reported catching several salmon early on which augured well for the evening. Bob Tichbon was the first into action with a salmon, followed soon after by Ken Hunt with another. Bob Jensen and myself tried a spinner and although Bob landed two herring, the salmon weren't interested, as Ron Kildahl and Ron Shirley were finding out further north. In the meantime Eric Sullivan landed a 9lb. salmon and Terry Fuller caught one, together with a $3\frac{3}{4}$ lb. tailor. Norm Clark, not to be outdone, landed a salmon so I switched back to bait, only to tangle with a ray. Bob Jensen did the honours with the gaff and then we released it after estimating the weight at around 20.

As the sea was flat calm most lads retired early and made a 4 a.m. start next morning. Norm Clark, Ron McQueen, Doug Talbot, Eric Sullivan, Bob Klein and visitor R. Scarf went over the back beach again while Phil Neri and I decided to try for herring at the plank. Phil's super burley left me for dead and he landed 21 even though the herring were very touchy.

Finally we decided to return to base to make ready for the weigh in. When the lads from the north arrived, everyone's eyes opened at the sight of Bob Tucker struggling in with 2 bags well stacked with fish of all kinds - skippy, salmon, tailor, whiting, herring, rockfish - you name it, he had it. Still, Bob fished non-stop through the night so he earned every one of them. Terry

de Jussing was all smiles with his 30lb. of fish as was Gerry Windus. Harrold Cunningham weighed in a salmon of 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. which just knocked off Eric Sullivan's fish for the heaviest scale fish award. Young Robert Hancock was again to the fore with two beaut salmon of 8 and 9lb. and this beats his previous capture in Section 2 of the Junior Competition. Arthur Backhouse weighed in a good bag of herring and at the same time did a very creditable job with the camera for the club album.

Several members were unfortunate in catching fish before or after the field day time - Dennis Rogers, Eric Sullivan and Norm Giles all landed good fish, in fact Dennis caught a tailor weighing 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb.

So closed the last Field Day for 1963 - 64 and the fact that we caught 1,070lb. of fish more than last year speaks for itself. 81 members attended at least one Field Day with an average attendance of 33. Congratulations to the award winners and winners of the Field Day trophies and many thanks to all who assisted Norm and me during the year.

As the first Field Day of the new competition is to Yallingup the season should be away to an excellent start if last years trip to this area was any indication. Try to arrange leave passes and transport early and roll along for an enjoyable outing.
